Re: Post Election Report for CPSU, SPSF Group WA Branch [E2016/70]

Thank you for the post-election report pursuant to s 197(1) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* "the Act", received on 7th June 2017. The Branch acknowledges the commentary, recommendations and statements in relation to rules of the Organisation and / or Branch that were difficult to interpret or apply during the election and acknowledges you raised these issues in your report during the Branch elections held in 2016. In accordance with s198(2) of the Act, the Branch advises of the actions it intends to take regarding the relevant rules:

Roll of voters

AEC recommendation

"It is recommended that CPSU- SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 17.2 (e) be amended to comply with s143 (3) of the Act"

WA Branch proposed action

This matter was raised last year in a number of the post-election reports from the various returning officers in different states following the conduct of CPSU-SPSF Branch elections. I understand this matter will be incorporated in a review of the CPSU SPSF Chapter C Group rules being prepared for submission to the CPSU SPSF Group Federal Executive Committee for consideration shortly.

Candidate statements

AEC statement

WA Branch Rule 33.2 becomes redundant due to the application of WA Branch Rules 1 and 33.1 and CPSU- SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 28.

WA Branch proposed action

The WA Branch accepted the advice received in the Post Election report last year and the WA Branch and is currently in the process of amended the branch rules to delete WA Branch Rule 33.2.

Multiple Nominations

AEC recommendation

"It is recommended that CPSU- SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 28 be amended to include Proxy Councillors"

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WA Branch proposed action

The WA Branch acknowledges this issue was raised in last year's report. WA Branch Rule 9.3 confirms a person cannot hold both offices. The WA Branch has referred the matter to CPSU-SPSF Group Federal Council and Executive for consideration. The authorization of the CPSU SPSF Group is required to progress amendments to the CPSU SPSF Chapter C Group rules.

Organisation must respond to the post-election report of the Australian Electoral Commission: E2017/57

On 7/06/2017 the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) received a post election report from the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) for election E2017/57 dated 7/06/2017. The AEC will have also provided the report to the organisation under section 197 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act).

The report identifies rules that were difficult to interpret or apply, in particular rules 17.2 (e) and 28. This letter serves as a reminder of the obligations imposed on the organisation or branch as a consequence of the AEC's report. If a response has already been sent to the AEC and made available to all members please disregard this letter.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regs 141(4) and (5)).

A written response must be provided to the AEC

A written response must be provided to the AEC within 30 days of receipt of the report. The organisation's response must include whether the organisation or branch intends to take action and if so what action the organisation or branch intends to take (s198(2)).

Extract of report must be made available to members

The organisation or branch must make the section of the report relating to the difficult rules available to its members (s198(3)). This extract from the report must be made available to the members before or at the same time as the organisation's response is made available to members.

Written response must be made available to members

A copy of the organisation's response to the AEC must be made available to members either:

- within 30 days after the response is given to the AEC, or
- published in the next edition of the organisation or branch journal (s198(5))

Subsection 198(6) and regulation 142 prescribe ways in which the relevant extract and the copy of the response can be made available to members. These do not limit the ways in which they can be made available to members. The organisation will comply if it does all of the following:-

- publish the report extract and the copy of the response in the next edition of the organisation or branch's journal; and
- •
- within 30 days of giving the response to the AEC:
 - lodges with the ROC a copy of the relevant extract and response, together with a declaration that a copy will be provided to any member who so requests; and
 - give notice in the next edition of the organisation or branch's journal, or an appropriate newspaper, that a copy of the relevant extract and response are available on request to each member free of charge; and
- publish the relevant extract on the website within 14 days after receiving the report, and publish the response on the website within 14 days of giving the response to the AEC (reg 142(2)).

Penalties may apply

If the organisation or branch does not:

- respond to the AEC within 30 days,
- make the extract of the report relating to the rules available to members no later than the organisation's response is made available to members, or
- make the organisation's response available to members within 30 days or in the next edition of the journal,

the organisation may face penalties under the RO Act. Each requirement listed above is a civil penalty provision that may result in fines for the organisation

As noted above, if the response and report have already been made available to members and the AEC, please disregard this letter. If you have any questions in relation to these obligations please contact the ROC for assistance by email to regorgs@roc.gov.au.

If the organisation or branch decides to alter its rules in response to the AEC's report

If the organisation or branch decides to alter its rules in response to the AEC's report, the ROC is NOT able to provide advice and assistance regarding draft alterations or the processes required to make the alterations. Rule alterations remain a function of the Fair Work Commission.

Candidate Statements

• WA Branch Rule 1 states:

These rules are in addition to the federal rules of CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union and shall apply to the Western Australian Branch so far as they are not in conflict with the federal rules.

• WA Branch Rule 33.1 states in part:

Every election required by these rules shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter C the Federal Rules.

- WA Branch Rule 33.2 states: Branch policy may provide for candidates' information of a prescribed form to accompany ballot papers issued in the conduct of a Branch election.
- CPSU-SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 28 Provides for Candidate States.

WA Branch Rule 33.2 becomes redundant due to the application of WA Branch Rules 1 and 33.1 and CPSU-SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 28.

Multiple Nominations

WA Branch Rule 9.3 states:

Proxy Branch Councillors shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of Councillors during the Councillors' absence, unavailability or when a position of Councillor is vacant. Should there be more than one position of Proxy Branch Councillor within an Electorate, the allocation of proxies shall be by rotation.

CPSU-SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 28 covers Multiple Nomination but make no provision regarding nominations received simultaneously for Proxy Branch Councillor and Branch Councillor.

WA Branch Rule 9.3 makes it clear that a person cannot hold both the office of Branch Councillor and Proxy Branch Councillor. It is recommended that CPSU-SPSF Chapter C Group Rule 28 be amended to include Proxy Branch Councillor.

Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) a declaration of results for the election of uncontested offices for Western Australia Branch [E2017/57]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 154D(1) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires the rules of organisations (and branches of organisations) to require each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. A list of approved training providers is attached.

Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which should be provided for in your organisation's rules.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union-SPSF Group, Western Australian Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:

- the name of the office vacated;
- the date of the change of office holder; and
- the name of the person vacating the office.

- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and
 - the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.
