### REQUEST PURSUANT TO SECTION 189 TO ARRANGE FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS BY THE AUSTRALIAN ELECTORAL COMMISSION

#### **PRESCRIBED INFORMATION**

The following information is lodged in accordance with section 189 of the Act.

#### **1. OFFICES**

An election is required for the following offices of the Community and Public Sector Union, SPSF Group, WA Branch:

##### **(a) Part 1 – Branch Officers**

- (i) One (1) Branch President
- (ii) Two (2) Branch Vice Presidents
- (iii) One (1) Branch Treasurer
- (iv) One (1) Branch Secretary
- (v) One (1) Branch Assistant Secretary

##### **(b) Part 2 – Offices of Councillor and Proxy Councillor**

- (i) Forty- Three (43) Branch Councillor offices; and
- (ii) Forty- Three (43) Proxy Branch Councillor offices

Attachment A specifies the electorates for each of the Forty - three (43) Offices of Councillor and Proxy Councillor.

Rule 10 subrule 10.1 of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C - SPSF Group Western Australian Branch rules provides for the membership of the Branch to be divided in Electorates consisting of such members as is determined by the Branch Council from time to time.

Sub rule 10.2 provides that an Electorate may consist of all or some members employed by an employer or a number of employers and the minimum number of members who may constitute an Electorate shall be 250 financial members.

Rule 9 sub-rule 9.1 of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C - SPSF Group Western Australian Branch rules provides that each Electorate will be represented on Branch Council by one Branch Councillor and one Proxy Branch Councillor for each 500 financial members or part thereof allocated to the Electorate as at 31<sup>st</sup> December in the year preceding an election.

The Electorates and entitlements for number of offices of Branch Councillor and Proxy Branch Councillor are attached at Attachment A .



Rule 10.3 provides that there shall be one or more Electorate(s) consisting of members employed in or by a public hospital, private hospital, nursing home, public dental clinic, area health service, community health service or psychiatric service; or employed in or by any department, or part of a department. Council Electorate "Dental Health & Health Services" consists of members employed in the Department of Health, public dental clinics, school dental centres, psychiatric services and a number of allied health services.

Rule 10.4 provides that there shall be one or more Higher Education Electorate(s) consisting of all of members employed in or by a University, College of Advanced Education, a Department of Technical and Further Education, a College or Institute of Technical and Further Education. Council Electorates "Murdoch & Curtin University, "Universities: ECU, UWA & Notre Dame", and "TAFE College" consist of members employed in or by a University, College of Advanced Education, a Department of Technical and Further Education, a College or Institute of Technical and Further Education.

**(b) Part 3 – Executive Councillors**

- (i) Six (6) Executive Council offices.

**(c) Part 4 – Branch Delegates to Federal Council**

- (i) Five (5) Branch Delegates to CPSU SPSF Group Federal Council

**(d) Part 5 – Branch Representatives to Federal Executive**

- (i) One (1) Branch Representative to CPSU SPSF Group Federal Executive;  
and
- (ii) One (1) Branch Vice President

**2. REASONS FOR ELECTIONS**

The reason for these elections is that as follows:

**(a) Part 1 – Branch Officers**

Rule 33.5 of the CPSU SPSF Group Rules Chapter C provides that the offices of Branch Secretary, Branch Assistant Secretary, Branch President, Branch Vice Presidents and Branch Treasurer shall be elected by secret postal ballot of the whole of the membership for a term of four years.

The current term of office expires in 2012.

**(b) Part 2 – Offices of Councillor and Proxy Councillor**

Rule 9 of the CPSU SPSF Group Rules Chapter C provided that each Branch Councillor and Proxy Branch Councillor shall be elected for a term of four years.

The current term of office expires in 2012.

**(c) Part 3 – Six (6) Executive Councillors**

Rule 33 sub rule 33.7 of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C - SPSF Group Western Australian Branch rules provided that the six Executive Councillors shall be elected by secret ballot by the members of Branch Council for a term of four years. The persons eligible to accept nomination shall be members of the Branch Council.

The current term of the offices expires in 2012.

**(d) Part 4 – Branch Delegates to Federal Council**

Rule 54B of the CPSU SPSF Group Rules Chapter C provides that each Branch shall elect delegates to Federal Council two-yearly by secret ballot of the members of Branch Council. The persons eligible to accept nomination shall be members of Branch Council.

The current term of the offices expires in 2012.

**(e) Part 5 – Branch Representatives to Federal Executive**

Rule 55B of the CPSU SPSF Group Rules Chapter C provides that each Branch shall elect a Federal Vice President and Branch Representative on the Federal Executive for a term of two years from that Branch. The persons eligible to accept nomination shall be the Delegates to Federal Council from the Branch concerned.

The current term of these offices expires in 2012.

**3. CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS**

The CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C - SPSF Group Western Australian Branch rules provide that every election shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter C the Federal Rules.

**(a) Part 1 – Branch Officers**

Rule 9 sub rule 9.4 provides that the election for each office shall be conducted so that the result is declared not earlier than 1<sup>st</sup> May and not later than 30<sup>th</sup> June in an even numbered year. Rule 33 sub-rule 33.1 provides that every election required by the Branch rules shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter C of the Federal Rules. Federal Rule 54A Election of Branch Officers and Delegates to Branch Council sub rule F provides that the nominations for elections shall be called by such means as will give reasonable notice to those persons eligible to accept nomination at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date on which nomination close.

**(b) Part 2 – Offices of Councillor and Proxy Councillor**

Rule 9 sub rule 9.4 provides that the election for each office shall be conducted so that the result is declared not earlier than 1<sup>st</sup> May and not later than 30<sup>th</sup> June in an even numbered year. Rule 55B of the CPSU SPSF Group Rules Chapter C provides that the election of the office of Federal Vice President and Branch Representative on the Federal Executive for a term of two years from that Branch.

**4. ROLL**

Rule 57F(i) of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C – SPSF Group Rules provides that those persons who are financial members of the group and holders of the relevant office at the time at which nominations close for the office or offices the subject of the election or elections shall be eligible to vote in such elections.

**5. VOTING SYSTEM**

The system for voting for each of the offices is as follows:

The voting system to be employed is a direct voting system, and CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 57C provides that the election shall be by secret ballot and shall be conducted by the proportional preferential voting system as set out in Schedule A to the Group Rules.

The voting system to be employed is a direct voting system, and CPSU, SPSF Group Rule 57C provides that the election shall be by secret ballot and shall be conducted by the proportional preferential voting system as set out in the Schedule to the Group Rules.

**(c) Part 3 – Six (6) Executive Councillors**

Rule 33 sub-rule 33.7 of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C – SPSF Group Western Australian Branch rules provides that election for each office shall be conducted in accordance with Rule 54B of Chapter C of the Federal Rules, with the necessary changes being made. The system for voting is a collegiate election by and from the Branch Council.

**(d) Part 4 – Branch Delegates to Federal Council**

Collegiate electoral system by and from the Branch Council.

**(e) Part 5 – Branch Representatives to Federal Executive**

Collegiate electoral system by and from the Branch Delegates to Federal Council.

**6. NOMINATIONS OPEN**

Federal Rule 54A Election of Branch Delegates to Branch Council sub rule F provides that nominations for elections shall be called by such means as will give reasonable notice to those persons eligible to accept nomination at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date on which nominations close

**(c) Part 3 – Six (6) Executive Councillors**

The opening of nominations is dependent on the declaration of the election for Branch Councillors (Part 1). The rules provide that these elections to be conducted so that the results are declared not earlier than 1<sup>st</sup> of June and not later than 25<sup>th</sup> August in each even numbered year.

**(d) Part 4 – Branch Delegates to Federal Council**

The opening of nominations is dependent on the declaration of the election for Branch Councillors (Part 1). Rule 54B of the CPSU, the Community and Public Sector Union; Chapter C – SPSF Group Rules nominations for elections shall be called by notification of all members of Branch Council at least 14 days prior to the first meeting of Branch Council. The rules provide that these elections to be conducted so that the results are declared not earlier than 1<sup>st</sup> of June and not later than 25<sup>th</sup> August in each even numbered year.

**(e) Part 5 – Branch Representatives to Federal Executive**

The opening of nominations is dependent on the declaration of the election for Branch Delegates to Federal Council (Part 3). The rules provide that the Returning Officer shall fix the date on which nominations shall close provided nominations shall close on a date at least 14 days but no more than 28 days after the notification.
