

Rule/s re eligibility to vote Rule 33

Rules difficult to apply/interpret

Rule 37 could be interpreted to mean weighted voting in "any ballot or vote of the national conference" including election ballots, however, Rule 33 is headed, "Elections for Offices of the Union and National Executive Delegates (Women)."

This is the rule, which applies to the elections in hand.

Rule 37 is separated from Rule 33 and is almost certainly intended to apply to national voting at meetings and national conference ballots and votes on matters other than elections.

Rule 33 is comprehensive regarding the election and it does not mention weighted voting.

I used a one vote per voter system.

I recommend that the Union amend the rule to remove any doubt.
