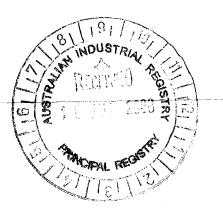

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FEDERAL EXECUTIVE'S STATEMENT

On the 28th February, 2008 the Federal Executive of Independent Education Union of Australia passed the following resolution in relation to the General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR) of the reporting unit for the financial year ended 31st December, 2007.

The Federal Executive declares in relation to the GPFR that in its opinion:

- (a) the financial statements and notes comply with the Australian Accounting Standards;
- (b) the financial statements and notes comply with the reporting guidelines of the Industrial Registrar;
- (c) the financial statements and notes give a true and fair view of the financial performance, financial position and cash flows of the reporting unit for the financial year to which they relate;
- (d) there are reasonable grounds to believe that the reporting unit will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable;
- (e) during the financial year to which the GPFR relates and since the end of that year:
 - (i) meetings of the federal executive were held in accordance with the rules of the organisation; and
 - (ii) the financial affairs of the reporting unit have been managed in accordance with the rules of the organisation; and
 - (iii) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept and maintained in accordance with the RAO Schedule and the RAO Regulations; and
 - (iv) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept as far as practicable, in a consistent manner to each of the other reporting units of the organisation; and
 - (v) the information sought in any request of a member of the reporting unit or a Registrar duly made under section 272 of the RAO Schedule has been furnished to the member or Registrar; and
 - (vi) No orders have been made by the Commission under section 273 of the RAO Schedule during the period.

OPERATING REPORT

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR

- (1) **Support** and advice to branches regarding political, industrial, legal and professional agendas. Ensuring ongoing advice to them on the Federal Government's WorkChoices legislation.
- (2) Representation of the industrial and professional interests of the members in a broad range of federal spheres. This includes the ACTU and its committees; participation in forums on educational and professional issues of relevance to IEU members; representation to Government Ministers and Shadow Ministers on government policies relevant to the professional and industrial interests of our members; representation of the Union's interests in the Australian Industrial Relations Commission in relation to rules matters and the defence of members' industrial rights in industrial disputes.
- (3) Submissions to national inquiries on school funding, educational, industrial and human rights issues relevant to the membership and the broader community. Appearance before such Inquiries on behalf of the union and its membership and participation in the public debate on these matters.
- (4) Research in relevant areas of public policy such as the funding of schooling, industrial, legal and constitutional matters, educational issues, and human rights concerns to inform our own policy development. Oversight of the comparative salaries and conditions of various categories of staff in non government schools across the jurisdictions. Monitoring of Commission decisions and decisions from other jurisdictions.
- (5) **Protection and carriage** of the Union's Rules.
- (6) Negotiation and prosecution of claims for improved salaries and conditions for workers in the ELICOS sector and for staff in a number of workplaces in the NT. Maintenance of Federal Awards through Fair Pay Commission processes.
- (7) Participation in the national campaign against the WorkChoices legislation which came into effect in March 2006

RESULT OF THOSE ACTIVITIES

- (1) Sustained membership in the Union's branches.
- (2) A proactive membership industrially and professionally
- (3) Continued public profile of the Union on behalf of teachers and support staff in non government education
- (4) Improvements in the industrial and professional conditions of the membership

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE NATURE OF THESE ACTIVITIES There have been no significant changes in the nature of these activities over the past year.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE UNION'S FINANCIAL AFFAIRS DURING THE YEAR

Due to payments to staff arising from resignations and redundancy, the union's reserves were expended and a budget deficit was incurred.

OPERATING REPORT (Cont'd)

DETAILS OF THE RIGHT OF MEMBERS TO RESIGN

A member may resign from the Union in accord with Rule 21 which states:

21 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (a) A member of the Union may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary.
- (b) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:(i) Where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union.
 - (A) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; whichever is later; or
 - (ii) in any other case:
 - (A) at the end of two weeks after the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is the later.

- (c) Any dues payable and not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the organisation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (d) A notice delivered to the person mentioned in subclause (a) shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (e) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with Subclause (a).
- (f) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

NOTE 1

The General Purpose Financial Report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and The Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

(a) Income Tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the full net cost of each fixed asset during its effective working life.

The principal annual rates are:-	
Leasehold Improvements	48
Office Furniture & Fittings	10%
Computer & Office Equipment	27%

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provisions for employee long service leave and annual leave have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

(d) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

Business expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except where the amount of GST accrued is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office.

2. Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follow:

- (1) A member of an reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which and the manner in which the information is to be made available. The period must be not less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under sub-section (1).

The Financial Report and Directors' Responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flow, the federal executive statement and notes to the financial report for Independent Education Union of Australia for the year ended 31st December, 2007.

The committee is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the Union. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal controls, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We perform procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Union's financial position, and of their performances as represented by the results of their operations and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examine on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and - assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the directors.

While we considered the effectiveness of the Union's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance of internal controls.

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Thank you for the financial reports of the Independent Education Union of Australia for the year ended 31 December 2007. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 23 April 2007.

The financial report has not yet been filed due to the issues raised in the following paragraphs.

General Purpose Financial Reports

Donations, Grants or Loans

I note that contributions to ACTU campaigns totalling \$73,813 were made in the year ending 31 December 2007 in Note 5 of your 'Notes To and Forming Part of Accounts'. Please advise the Registry if these contributions were donations that should be disclosed in a subsection 237(1) statement or compulsory contributions.

Auditor's Report

In order to secure compliance with the organisation's obligations under the RAO Schedule, I require you to amend the Auditor's Report as follows:

Composition of Auditor's Report

I note that paragraph 1 of the Auditor's Report states that "The financial report comprises the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position and statement of cash flow...".

Please note that under section 257(1), the Auditor must audit the financial report of the organisation. Under section 253 of the RAO Schedule and in the Reporting Guidelines for section 253, the Committee of Management statement (in your report called Federal Executive's Statement) and Notes to the Financial Statements are included in the financial report and must be listed with the other documents.

Auditor's Opinion

The term "true and fair view" was used in the superseded legislation. Subsection 257(5) of the RAO Schedule sets out the matters upon which an auditor is required to make an opinion on whether the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and other requirements of the RAO Schedule. The following wording in the auditor's opinion would satisfy the requirements:

"In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996".

Auditor's Qualifications

The Auditor's Report should be amended so that it provides details of the Auditor's qualifications to confirm he or she is an 'approved auditor' under s256 of the RAO Schedule and Regulation 4 of the RAO Regulations.

Regulation 4 defines an approved auditor as a person who is a member of CPA Australia, The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia or the National Institute of Accountants and holds a current Public Practice Certificate.

Operating Report

Signing of documents

It is noted that the Operating Report was not signed or dated. The Operating Report must be prepared, signed and dated by a member of the Committee of Management or a designated officer – see s254 of the RAO Schedule.

Please provide a signed and dated Operating Report in the full report which is to be distributed to members.

Incorrect Chronology of Events

Schedule 1 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 sets out a particular chronological order in which the financial documents must be prepared, provided to members and presented to a meeting. On the basis of the dates on the documents lodged it is apparent the Branch could not have complied with those requirements. For example, the Auditor's report is dated 12 March 2008, which clearly post-dates the date the documents were provided to members.

Accordingly, in order to secure compliance with the organisation's obligations under the RAO Schedule, I require you to:

- Provide all members with the full report, including the amended, signed and dated Auditor's report and amended Operating Report, prior to the Committee of Management meeting
- Present the full report to the Committee of Management meeting
- Re-file the documents in the Registry within 14 days of the Committee of Management meeting accompanied by the appropriate Designated Officer's Certificate.

- (1) **Support** and advice to branches regarding political, industrial, legal and professional agendas. Ensuring ongoing advice to them on the Federal Government's WorkChoices legislation.
- (2) Representation of the industrial and professional interests of the members in a broad range of federal spheres. This includes the ACTU and its committees; participation in forums on educational and professional issues of relevance to IEU members; representation to Government Ministers and Shadow Ministers on government policies relevant to the professional and industrial interests of our members; representation of the Union's interests in the Australian Industrial Relations Commission in relation to rules matters and the defence of members' industrial rights in industrial disputes.
- (3) Submissions to national inquiries on school funding, educational, industrial and human rights issues relevant to the membership and the broader community. Appearance before such Inquiries on behalf of the union and its membership and participation in the public debate on these matters.
- (4) Research in relevant areas of public policy such as the funding of schooling, industrial, legal and constitutional matters, educational issues, and human rights concerns to inform our own policy development. Oversight of the comparative salaries and conditions of various categories of staff in non government schools across the jurisdictions. Monitoring of Commission decisions and decisions from other jurisdictions.
- (5) **Protection and carriage** of the Union's Rules.
- (6) Negotiation and prosecution of claims for improved salaries and conditions for workers in the ELICOS sector and for staff in a number of workplaces in the NT. Maintenance of Federal Awards through Fair Pay Commission processes.
- (7) Participation in the national campaign against the WorkChoices legislation which came into effect in March 2006

RESULT OF THOSE ACTIVITIES

- (1) Sustained membership in the Union's branches.
- (2) A proactive membership industrially and professionally
- (3) Continued public profile of the Union on behalf of teachers and support staff in non government education
- (4) Improvements in the industrial and professional conditions of the membership

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE NATURE OF THESE ACTIVITIES

There have been no significant changes in the nature of these activities over the past year.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE UNION'S FINANCIAL AFFAIRS DURING THE YEAR

Due to payments to staff arising from resignations and redundancy, the union's reserves were expended and a budget deficit was incurred.

OPERATING REPORT (Cont'd)

DETAILS OF THE RIGHT OF MEMBERS TO RESIGN

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A member may resign from the Union in accord with Rule 21 which states:

21 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (a) A member of the Union may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary.
- (b) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:(i) Where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union.
 - (A) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; whichever is later; or
 - (ii) in any other case:
 - (A) at the end of two weeks after the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is the later.

- (c) Any dues payable and not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the organisation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (d) A notice delivered to the person mentioned in subclause (a) shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (e) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with Subclause (a).
- (f) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

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The General Purpose Financial Report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and The Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

(a) Income Tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the full net cost of each fixed asset during its effective working life.

The principal annual rates are:-	
Leasehold Improvements	48
Office Furniture & Fittings	10%
Computer & Office Equipment	27%

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provisions for employee long service leave and annual leave have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

(d) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

Business expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except where the amount of GST accrued is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office.

2. Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follow:

- (1) A member of an reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which and the manner in which the information is to be made available. The period must be not less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under sub-section (1).
