Financial Report Year ended 31 December 2008 – FR2008/612

I acknowledge receipt of further documents of the Independent Education Union of Australia lodged in the Registry on 23 June 2009. These were the amended Designated Officer's Certificate with a copy of the full report and a statement of loans, grants and donations.

The documents have been filed. There are some minor comments I would like to make to assist you in the preparation of future financial reports. You are not required to take any further action in relation to the report lodged.

1. Auditor's Qualifications

Regulation 4 of the Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003 (RAO Regulations) defines an approved auditor as a person who is a member of CPA Australia, The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia or the National Institute of Accounts **and** holds a current Public Practice Certificate. The Auditor's Report should provide details of the individual auditor's qualifications to confirm he is an approved auditor.

While it is more than likely that your auditor is an approved auditor as defined by the RAO Regulations, the preferred practice is that the qualifications of the auditor and the fact that he holds a current Practice Certificate be made explicit in the signature block.

Please forward a copy of this letter to your auditor.

2. Operating Report

I note the operating report was not dated. It would be helpful for the Registry in future assessments of timelines if operating reports lodged are dated.

3. Operating Report – Significant Changes in Financial Affairs

Subsection 254(2)(b) of the RAO schedule requires an operating report to give details of any significant changes in the financial affairs during the year. In future years, the operating report needs to give details of any significant changes in the organisation's financial affairs during the year. If there are no significant changes in the financial affairs of the organisation, this should be stated. If there were any significant changes, these should be detailed.

4. Wage Recovery Activities

I note that the accounts do not provide any information in relation to any information in relation to any recovery of wages activity. Items 16-23, 25(f) and 27(b) of the Reporting Guidelines govern the financial reporting of recovery of wages activity. In circumstances where the reporting unit has not undertaken any recovery of wages activity for the financial year, a statement by the auditor or a declaration in the Committee of Management Statement which states that there was no recovery of wages activity for the financial year will suffice.

5. Office Holders and Other Employees

The Reporting Guidelines (point 14) require that either the balance sheet or the notes to the financial statements identify liabilities for employee benefits for holders of office (guideline 14 (c)) and for other employees (guideline 14 (d)). Thus the Reporting Guidelines require that liabilities for elected office-holders who are also employed be distinguished from other employees.

In future financial reports lodged, please state the amount of liabilities for employed holders of office and the amount of liabilities for other employees, even if it is zero.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR

- (1) Support and advice to branches regarding political, industrial, legal and professional agendas. Ensuring ongoing advice to them on the Federal Government's industrial legislation including development of the Fair Work Bill.
- Representation of the industrial and professional interests of the members in a broad range of federal spheres. This includes the ACTU and its committees; participation in forums on educational and professional issues of relevance to IEU members; representation to Government Ministers and Shadow Ministers on government policies relevant to the professional and industrial interests of our members; representation of the Union's interests in the Australian Industrial Relations Commission in relation to rules matters and the defence of members' industrial rights in industrial disputes.
- (3) Submissions to national inquiries on school funding, educational, industrial and human rights issues relevant to the membership and the broader community. Appearance before such Inquiries on behalf of the union and its membership and participation in the public debate on these matters.
- (4) Research in relevant areas of public policy such as the funding of schooling, industrial, legal and constitutional matters, educational issues, and human rights concerns to inform our own policy development. Cversight of the comparative salaries and conditions of various categories of staff in non government schools across the jurisdictions. Monitoring of Commission decisions and decisions from other jurisdictions.
- (5) Protection and carriage of the Union's Rules.
- (6) Negotiation and prosecution of claims for improved salaries and conditions for workers in the ELICOS and Maintenance of Federal Awards through Fair Pay Commission processes.

RESULT OF THOSE ACTIVITIES

- (1) Sustained membership in the Union's branches.
- (2) A proactive membership industrially and professionally
- (3) Continued public profile of the Union on behalf of teachers and support staff in non government education
- (4) Improvements in the industrial and professional conditions of the membership

DETAILS OF THE RIGHT OF MEMBERS TO RESIGN

A member may resign from the Union in accord with Rule 21 which states:

21 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (a) A member of the Union may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary.
- (b) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:
 - (i) Where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union.
 - (A) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; whichever is later; or
 - (ii) in any other case:
 - (A) at the end of two weeks after the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is the later.

- (c) Any dues payable and not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the organisation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (d) A notice delivered to the person mentioned in subclause (a) shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (e) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with Subclause (a).
- (f) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

INDEPENDENT EDUCATION UNION OF AUSTRALIA NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

NOTE 1

The General Purpose Financial Report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and The Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

(a) Income Tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the full net cost of each fixed asset during its effective working life.

The principal annual rates are:-

Leasehold Improvements 4%
Office Furniture & Fittings 10%
Computer & Office Equipment 27%

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provisions for employee long service leave and annual leave have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

(d) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

Business expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except where the amount of GST accrued is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office.

2. Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follow:

- (1) A member of an reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which and the manner in which the information is to be made available. The period must be not less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under sub-section (1).

AUDITORS REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

INDEPENDENT EDUCATION UNION OF AUSTRALIA

The Financial Report and Directors' Responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flow, the federal executive statement and notes to the financial report for Independent Education Union of Australia for the year ended 31st December, 2008.

The committee is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the Union. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal controls, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We perform procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Union's financial position, and of their performances as represented by the results of their operations and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examine on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the directors.

While we considered the effectiveness of the Union's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance of internal controls.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.



- (4) Research in relevant areas of public policy such as the funding of schooling, industrial, legal and constitutional matters, educational issues, and human rights concerns to inform our own policy development. Oversight of the comparative salaries and conditions of various categories of staff in non government schools across the jurisdictions. Monitoring of Commission decisions and decisions from other jurisdictions.
- (5) Protection and carriage of the Union's Rules.
- (6) **Negotiation and prosecution** of claims for improved salaries and conditions for workers in the ELICOS and Maintenance of Federal Awards through Fair Pay Commission processes.

RESULT OF THOSE ACTIVITIES

- (1) Sustained membership in the Union's branches.

A member may resign from the Union in accord with Rule 21 which states:

21 - RESIGNATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

- (a) A member of the Union may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the relevant Branch Secretary.
- (b) A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:
 - (i) Where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union.
 - (A) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member; whichever is later; or
 - (ii) in any other case:
 - (A) at the end of two weeks after the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (B) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is the later.

- (c) Any dues payable and not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the organisation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- (d) A notice delivered to the person mentioned in subclause (a) shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- (e) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with Subclause (a).
- (f) A resignation from membership of the Union is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this section if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

NOTE 1

The General Purpose Financial Report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and The Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

(a) Income Tax

The Union is exempt from income tax under section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the full net cost of each fixed asset during its effective working life.

The principal annual rates are:-

Leasehold Improvements 4%
Office Furniture & Fittings 10%
Computer & Office Equipment 27%

(c) Employee Entitlements

Provisions for employee long service leave and annual leave have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

(d) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

Business expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except where the amount of GST accrued is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office.

2. Information to be provided to Members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 which reads as follow:

- (1) A member of an reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which and the manner in which the information is to be made available. The period must be not less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under sub-section (1).

AUDITORS REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

INDEPENDENT EDUCATION UNION OF AUSTRALIA

The Financial Report and Directors' Responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flow, the federal executive statement and notes to the financial report for Independent Education Union of Australia for the year ended 31st December, 2008.

The committee is responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Audit Approach

We conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the Union. Our audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal controls, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We perform procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Union's financial position, and of their performances as represented by the results of their operations and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- examine on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the directors.

While we considered the effectiveness of the Union's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance of internal controls.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.
