



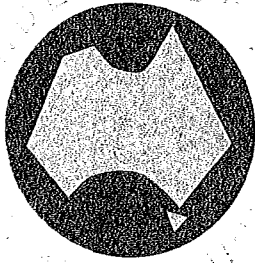
DECISION

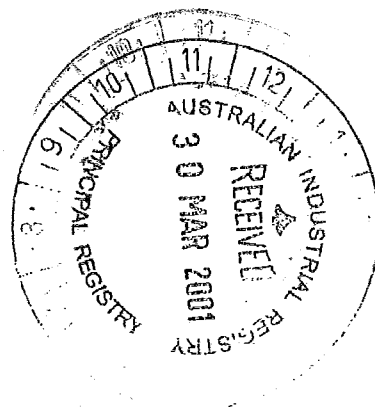
Under our rules we are required to hold the election this year and we attach relevant information required under section 214 and Regulation 61 of the Industrial Relations Act (Federal).

REGULATION 61 PRESCRIBED INFORMATION IN RESPECT OF ELECTION - SUBSECTION 214 (1) OF THE ACT.

61(1) For the purposes of subsection 214(1) of the Act, the following information is provided:

(a) the name of each office in respect of which the election is required is:

Branch Executive

(Rule 6.3 NSW/ACT Branch Rules of IEUA Rules, page 38)

President (1)
Vice-Presidents (4)*
Financial Officers (2)
Branch Secretary (1)
Branch Deputy Secretary (1)
Branch Assistant Secretary (1)
General Executive Members (10)

NSW/ACT Branch Delegates to Federal Council

(Rule 8, IEUA Rules)

11 delegates - Membership - 20,990 as at 31 December 2000.

(b) the reason for the election is that the term of office has expired.

(c) As listed in (a) above

(d) Four Vice-Presidents* - one each elected respectively by and from:

- (i) Members employed in early childhood services;
- (ii) Members employed in schools or as an adviser, supervisor or education officer by or under the supervision of a Catholic diocese but excluding members included in paragraph (iv).
- (ii) Members employed in a school or educational institution other than an early childhood service or a school or educational institution under the supervision of a Catholic Diocese but excluding members included in sub-paragraph (iv) of this paragraph;
- (iv) Members employed as school support staff, (including school secretaries, clerical assistants or school assistants); boarding house staff (other than teachers); grounds or maintenance staff; canteen staff and members in other related classifications.

(e) The preferred time frame is as follows:

- (i) Nominations to be called Monday 16 July 2001.
- (ii) Nominations to close Monday 13 August 2001.
- (iii) Ballot to commence Thursday 13 September and close Friday 5 October 2001.

NB: Rule 9.8 of the Branch Rules (page 41) require the ballot to be completed not later than 17 October and Rule 9.3 (page 40) provides that current term of office concludes at 12 noon on 31 October, and the next term of offices commences then.

(f) the voting system to be employed in the conduct of the election is a direct voting system.

*NB: the IEUA Rules currently provide for three Vice-Presidents only; the union has altered its rule to provide for four Vice-Presidents and is currently seeking the approval of the Registrar for this alteration.
