Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Independent Education Union of Australia (E2017/178)

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 5 and 26 July 2017 the Queensland and Northern Territory Branch (the Branch) of the Independent Education Union of Australia (the organisation) lodged with the Registered Organisations Commission (the Commission) prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices, due to insufficient nominations received in previous elections (E2016/143 and E2016/144):

Delegate to Federal Council from the Queensland Division	(1)
Branch Executive Member (Northern Territory Division)	(2)
Branch Executive Member (Queensland Division)	(2)

Northern Territory Division Advisory Committee Member from the following Sub-
divisions:
Darwin Urban(2)Top End Rural(1)Southern Region - Alice Springs(1)

[2] On 26 July 2017, the Commission contacted the Branch and enquired as to the reasons for the delay in lodging the prescribed information for these offices when the declaration of results in the previous elections were made in August 2016, and which stated that no nominations for the above offices were received.

[3] On 26 July 2017, Mr Terence Patrick Burke, the Branch Secretary of the organisation, wrote to the Commission stating that the reason for the delay in lodging the prescribed information was due largely to the Branch being "occupied with significant industrial campaigns which have been a distraction and the sequence of Branch Executive meetings to provide authorisation to make the requests has been widely spaced".

[4] Whilst I note the reason provided by Mr Burke for the delay in lodging prescribed information, I do not accept that as a satisfactory reason for not lodging prescribed information for more than ten months after the declaration of results were released by the

Australian Electoral Commission. The consequence of that is, in my view, a situation that does not encourage the democratic functioning and control of an organisation. A key component of democratic functioning includes the conduct of regular elections to ensure that the number of office holders elected by members of an organisation corresponds with the number provided in its rules.

[5] I do not however propose to frustrate the democratic function of the above organisation to conduct an election to fill the unfilled office. However, future prescribed information in relation to elections arising as a result of insufficient nominations must be lodged with the Commission in a more timely manner.

[6] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.

In accordance with Chapter 7 Part 2 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, I provide the following prescribed information in accordance with the requirements of subsection 189(1).

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 - subsection 138(1)(a) and (c)

That in accordance with Rule 8 of the Federal Rules of the IEUA and Rule 13 of the Rules of the Independent Education Union of Australia Queensland and Northern Territory Branch (IEUA-QNT) an election is required for:

Queensland Division Federal Council Delegates – One (1)

I would advise that the IEUA-QNT membership at 31 December 2016 was 17,798 and that, in accordance with Rule 8(c) of the Federal Rules of the IEUA, the IEUA-QNT Branch is therefore entitled to ten (10) delegates to Federal Council.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(b)(i)

This election is made necessary in that the current term of office of the incumbents expires on 1 December 2020.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(d)

That in accordance with Rule 13.1 of the IEUA-QNT Branch Rules, members of the Northern Territory Division shall elect one (1) delegate to Federal Council.

That in accordance with Rule 13.2 of the IEUA-QNT Branch Rules, members of the Queensland Division shall elect the balance of the delegates (nine (9)) to Federal Council.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 subsection 138(1)(e)

Rule 17 of the Federal Rules of the IEUA is relevant and Rules 17(e), (h), (p) and (r) determine timeframes.

In setting dates for the election process I would advise that the Union journal goes to print on 4 September 2017; however we can communicate directly with all members and do not rely only on printed publications.

Re: Request for Conduct of Elections - Independent Education Union of Australia - Queensland and Northern Territory (IEUA-QNT) Branch

In accordance with Chapter 7 Part 2 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, I provide the following prescribed information in accordance with the requirements of subsection 189(1).

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 - subsection 138(1)(a) and (c)

That in accordance with Rule 7.3(a) of the IEUA-QNT Branch Rules an election is required for:

Branch Executive two (2) members from the Northern Territory Division Branch Executive two (2) members from the Queensland Division

Rule 7.3(b) of the Rules of the IEUA-QNT Branch provides that members of the Northern Territory Division elect five (5) persons to the Branch Executive.

Rule 7.3(c) of the Rules of the IEUA-QNT Branch provides that members of the Queensland Division elect twenty-nine (29) persons to the Branch Executive.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(b)(i)

These elections are made necessary in that at the 2016 Quadrennial election (Ballot declared 23 August 2016 (Attached)) insufficient nominations were received to fill the following positions; Branch Executive two (2) members from the Queensland Division and Branch Executive two (2) members from the Northern Territory Division. The current term of office would expire as follows:

Branch Executive Members Noon 31 October 2020

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 - subsection 138(1)(d)

The electorate comprises the financial members of the IEUA-QNT Branch as determined by Federal Rule 17(q). IEUA-QNT Branch Rule 7.3(b) is also relevant regarding the Divisional electorates for the Queensland Division and the Northern Territory Division.

Northern Territory Division Advisory Committee

An election is also required for certain positions on the Northern Territory Division Advisory Committee. Rule 14.3 of the Rules of the IEUA-QNT Branch provides that the Division Advisory Committee shall be comprised of the five (5) Northern Territory Division persons elected to the Branch Executive and a further four (4) Northern Territory Division persons who shall be elected at the same time in a separate ballot conducted consistent with the provisions of Rule 10 of the Rules of the IEUA-QNT Branch.

These elections are made necessary in that at the 2016 Quadrennial election insufficient nominations were received to fill the following positions;

Darwin Urban two (2) persons to the Division Advisory Committee, Top End Rural one (1) person to the Division Advisory Committee, and Southern Region – Alice Springs one (1) person to the Division Advisory Committee.

Rule 14.3 of the Rules of the IEUA-Q**N**T Branch provides that for the purposes of conducting an election for the additional four (4) persons the Northern Territory Division shall be divided into three sub-divisions as follows:

- (i) Darwin Urban which shall elect two (2) persons to the Division Advisory Committee;
- (ii) Top End Rural which shall elect one (1) person to the Division Advisory Committee; and
- (iii) Southern Region Alice Springs which shall elect one (1) person to the Division Advisory Committee.

Each member employed in a school (or domiciled, if not employed) in the designated area shall be allocated to the respective sub-division.

The current term of office for the Northern Territory Division Advisory Committee positions expires on (Noon) 31 October 2020 (IEUA-QNT Branch Rules 10.28 and 14.3).

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(e)

Rule 10.8 of the Rules of the IEUA-QNT Branch requires that the date for the completion of the Branch Executive election shall be not later than 17 October 2016.

The Quadrennial election for the period 2016 – 2020 is incomplete while these positions remain unfilled.

In setting dates for the election process I would advise that the Union's journal will next be published on 4 September 2017.

I would propose the following dates:

Nominations Open	Monday, 2 October 2017 (9:00 am)
Nominations Close	Friday, 3 November 2017 (4:00 pm)
Ballot Opens	Monday, 20 November 2017 (9:00 am)
Ballot Closes	Tuesday, 5 December 2017 (noon)
School vacation Periods:	15 September – 3 October 2017 (Queensland); and 29 September – 9 October 2017 (Northern Territory).

In accordance with Federal Rule 17(q) for the purpose of this election the books of the Branch shall be deemed to have closed as at seven (7) clear days before the opening date of nominations.
