Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of uncontested offices in matter E2019/110. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must, as soon as practicable after receiving the post-election report, publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within **35 days of any changes** to the holders of office in the organisation. **If there are no changes a notification is not required.** If the election has resulted in **any changes** to the holders of office, the Independent Education Union of Australia-Queensland and Northern Territory Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and
 - the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

Request for Conduct of Election

Branch Delegates to Independent Education Union of Australia

(IEUA) Federal Council

In accordance with Chapter 7 Part 2 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, I provide the following prescribed information in accordance with the requirements of subsection 189(1).

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(a) and (c)

That in accordance with Rule 8 of the Federal Rules of the IEUA and Rule 13 of the Rules of the Independent Education Union of Australia Queensland and Northern Territory Branch (IEUA-QNT) an election is required for:

Queensland Division Federal Council Delegates – Nine (9) Northern Territory Division Federal Council Delegate – One (1)

I would advise that the IEUA-QNT membership at 31 December 2018 was 17,832 and that, in accordance with Rule 8(c) of the Federal Rules of the IEUA, the IEUA-QNT Branch is therefore entitled to nine (9) delegates to Federal Council.

Rule 13 of the Rules of the IEUA-QNT Branch provides that members of the Northern Territory Division elect one (1) delegate to Federal Council and that the balance of delegates be elected by members of the Queensland Division.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(b)(i)

This election is made necessary in that the current term of office of the incumbents expires on 1 December 2019.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(d)

That in accordance with Rule 13.1 of the IEUA-QNT Branch Rules, members of the Northern Territory Division shall elect one (1) delegate to Federal Council.

That in accordance with Rule 13.2 of the IEUA-QNT Branch Rules, members of the Queensland Division shall elect the balance of the delegates (nine (9)) to Federal Council.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 subsection 138(1)(e)

Rule 17 of the Federal Rules of the IEUA is relevant and Rules 17(e), (h), (p) and (r) determine timeframes.

It is a requirement under Federal Rule 17(h) that the election shall conclude no later than 31 October 2019.

In setting dates for the election process I would advise that the Union journal goes to print on 7 August 2019; however we can communicate directly with all members and do not rely only on printed publications.

I would propose the following dates:

Nominations Open Monday, 1 July 2019 (9:00 am)
Nominations Close Tuesday, 30 July 2019 (4:00 pm)
Ballot Opens Monday, 19 August 2019 (9:00 am)

Ballot Closes Tuesday, 10 September 2019 (noon)

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(f)

That in accordance with Rule 17(q) of the Federal Rules of the IEUA, the books of the Branch shall be deemed to have closed as at seven (7) clear days before the opening date of the nominations.

Re Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 – subsection 138(1)(g)

The voting system to be used is a direct voting system.

Federal Rule 17(v) provides for a preferential voting system.

An application for amendment of the IEUA-QNT Branch Rules has been lodged within the Fair Work Commission. These rule amendments being sought for approval do not have any effect upon this election process as these concern elections to the Branch Executive at the election scheduled for 2020.
