The Independent Education Union of Australia – Queensland Branch Financial Report for the Year Ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2005 - FR2005/627 Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)

Thank you for the financial report of the Queensland Branch of The Independent Education Union of Australia for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2005. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 15<sup>th</sup> June 2006.

I make the following comments to assist you in preparing financial documents in the future. You do not need to take any further action in respect of the documents which have been lodged.

#### **Circulation of Financial Documents to Members**

Section 265(1)(a)(i) of the RAO Schedule requires the 'full report' which is circulated to members to include a copy of the Auditor's report. As a result, the Auditor's Report must be completed <u>prior to</u> circulation and must be included in the documents which are circulated to member. For your assistance, I enclose a *Timeline* that may be of assistance in the future in complying with the particular chronological order in which the financial documents must be prepared, provided to members and presented to a meeting.

Would you please ensure in future that the sequence of events as set out in the *Timeline* is met.

#### Secretary's Certificate

The covering letter which has been lodged is more than sufficient to meet the requirements of a Secretary's certificate as set out in section 268 of the RAO Schedule.

Section 268 requires the Secretary's Certificate (which can be in the form of a letter) to state that the documents lodged are copies of the documents provided to members and presented to a meeting in accordance with section 266. You are also requested to include in your certificate both the date upon which the documents were presented to a meeting and whether that meeting was a general meeting of Branch members or a meeting of the Branch's Committee of Management.

A sample Secretary's Certificate is enclosed for your information.

Since much of the information which you have provided in the Secretary's certificate is also provided in the Committee of Management Statement, you may wish in future to provide a less detailed Secretary's certificate along the lines of the enclosed sample.

#### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2005

#### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This General Purpose Financial Report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and The Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### (a) Income Tax

The association is exempt from income tax under section 50 –15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

#### (b) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the full net cost of each depreciable non-current asset over its expected useful life.

#### (c) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

#### (d) Goods and Services Tax

Business expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST except where the amount of GST accrued is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office.

# (e) Impact of Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards.

The Branch Executive is preparing and managing transition to Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRSs). The adoption of AIFRSs will be reflected in the Union's financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2006.

The Branch Executive is of the opinion that there are no material differences in the Union's accounting policies on conversion to AIFRSs.
