He correctly identifies an error in Schedule 2 to my letter of 9 August 2011, being the prescribed information filed in accordance with s189(1) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations)* Act. I confirm that, below the words "nominations close" it should read, "Ballot must open no later than 6 weeks after close of nominations [Federal Rule 17(r)]."
