



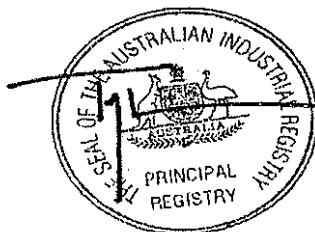

Re: Election Arrangements (E2002/185)

I refer to your letter dated 30 September 2002 containing prescribed information under section 214 of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act'), lodged in the Registry on 2 October 2002, and to your subsequent letter dated 9 October 2002 in reply to Mr Kellett's letter of 8 October 2002.

I acknowledge your advice amending the number of women delegates to Federal Council from the Equity section, and your advice in relation to Delegate requirements for the Tasmanian, Professional Sports, ACT and Northern NSW Branches.

As far as your advice regarding the total number of sectional Delegates to Federal Council is concerned, there appears to be an inherent conflict between the explicit references to twenty-five Delegates in sub-rules 40(b)(ix) and 80(a)(iv) on the one hand and the tendency of the application of sub-rule 80(a)(v) to result in a number greater than twenty-five on the other.

I note that in previous correspondence to the Registry you alluded to this conflict submitting that it was your view that sub-rule 80(a)(v) should prevail. You also referred to a similar conflict with sub-rule 20(b).

In view of my previous Decisions in matters E3019 of 1997 and E3015 of 1999, making arrangements for the election of twenty-eight and twenty-seven Delegates to Federal Council respectively, I have decided on this occasion to make arrangements for an election of the twenty-six Delegates requested. However, action in the form of appropriate rule alterations must be taken to resolve this conflict, which arguably offends section 196(c) of the Act, as a matter of importance, before the next election based on these particular rules.

On 11 October 2002 arrangements were made under section 214(2) of the Act for the conduct of elections for various offices in the abovenamed organisation.

The Amending Decision was issued to avoid any confusion that might arise in the conduct of the above election from the differences in the way the four offices concerned are described in the rules of the organisation.

Sub-Rule 79(c)(1) refers to each of the four offices as "Federal President"; sub-Rules 5(i), 40(b), 49, 49(a), and 54(a) refer to the offices as "Federal Deputy President" and sub-Rules 40(b)(ii), 43(a), 47(a), 49(a), 49(b), 49(c), 52(c)(ii), 52(f) and 63(3)(i) refer to the offices as "Deputy Federal President".

It is arguable whether the terms "Federal Deputy President" and "Deputy Federal President" are equivalent. The effect of rule 5(i) may therefore fall short of eliminating all uncertainty. As a general principle, the rules of an organisation should avoid vagueness and uncertainty (cf. *Maxwell and Anor. v Boilermakers Society of Australia FCA* [1964] 7 FLR at 158). The organisation may consider it appropriate therefore to make an amendment to its rules to further clarify this.
