5. Federal Trustees (3)



- Declaration of Ballot Monday, 24th September, 2000

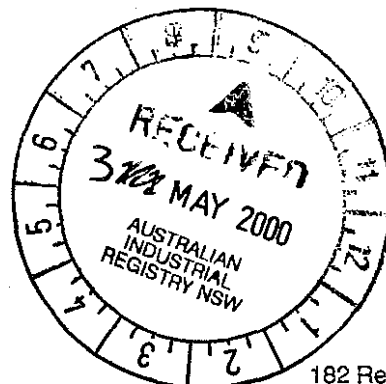
The Australian Electoral Office will need to take into account the expiry of the current terms of Federal Officer and Trustees when setting the actual timetable.
