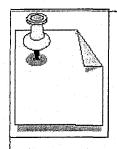

was not ideal for finding tenants or selling the building as the Global Financial Crisis had just occurred and the property market became cautious. With this in mind it was decided that the Union would allow a period of at least a year to try to find suitable tenants for the Hutt St. property before an auction of the building would be considered.

Unfortunately, no serious offers of tenancy were tendered during this period and the decided committee that the time was right for an auction of the premises to be held in May of this year. The best offer for purchase received by the committee in 2009 was \$950,000 and property agents expected that similar price would be offered at auction. However, on the day delighted we were bidding that the settled at \$1,125,000.

Members who have studied the audit reports provided by

the Union each December will be aware that the Adelaide Branch has been operating losses for all but a couple of the last 20 years. The two years (2001 and 2002) which in surpluses were achieved were directly the result of reducing Secretary's working hours to 10 hours per week. However, it became apparent that 10 hours per week was not sufficient to branch the run and the effectively hours were subsequently increased to 25.

The capitalization of the Union building should allow Adelaide Branch to operating return to modest surpluses (\$10-15K) for the immediate future provided that no significant increases in expenses occur. As result the Secretary's hours are not expected to be increased in the near future. I ask and thank members for their understanding that, with limited

# Notes to the Accounts For the year ended 30 June 2010

### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### a) Basis of Preparation of Financial Reports

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisation) Act 2009.

#### b) Income Tax

The Union is exempt from income tax pursuant to the Income Tax Assessment Act. Accordingly, Australian Accounting Standard AASB 112 has not been applied and no provision for income tax has been included in the Accounts.

#### c) Goods and Services Tax

The Union is not registered for Goods and Services Tax.

#### 2. Notice required under Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009

In accordance with the requirements of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, the attention of members is drawn to the provision of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 272 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009, which reads as follows:-
