Re: Lodgement of Financial Statements and Accounts – Musicians' Union of Australia, Broken Hill Branch – for year ending 30 June 2003 (FR2003/323)

I refer to the abovementioned financial statements and accounts which were lodged on 10 November 2004. The documents were not filed at that time, pending the provision of an Accounting Officer's Certificate as required under the former Regulation 109(1). This certificate, omitted from the documents originally lodged, was never received by the Registry and the file for that year remained open in the absence of any relevant advice from the Branch.

Following your letter received in July of this year, the Registry has had correspondence with Mr Terry Noone, the Federal Secretary, and he has advised the Registry that he was in the process of consulting with you and taking steps to resolve the administrative issues relating to outstanding returns.




I have received a letter to remind me of the financial reporting obligation of the above named Union. This union has not operated for at least the past 3 years having no members left to attend any meetings that we have called.

1A ACCOUNTING METHODS

In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for organisations, membership contributions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis. Otherwise the accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Accounting Standards jointly issued by the Australian Professional Accounting Bodies. In particular:

- (a) The accounts have not been adjusted to record either changes in the general purchasing power of the dollar or in the prices of the specific assets.
- (b) Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated on the straight line basis in order to write the assets off over their useful life.
- (c) The organisation does not employ any full time people. Therefore it has not been necessary to provide for any Long Service Leave or Sick Leave.
- (d) No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under section 23 (f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- 1B INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904, as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of section 158 ADA, which reads as follows:

(1) An organisation shall, on the application of a member of the organisation, or of the registrar, made as prescribed, make available to the member or to the registrar, as the case may be, in such manner and within such time as is prescribed, such information concerning the organisation, being information of a prescribed kind, as is requested in the application.

Penalty: \$1,000

- (2) The registrar shall not make an application under subsection
 - (1) except at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the registrar, when he receives information as a result of an application made at the request of such a member, shall furnish that information to that member.

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial years ended 30 June 2002 and 30 June 2003.

There is as yet no record of lodgement in the Industrial Registry of the auditor's report, accounts and statements for the year ended 30 June 2002. I would appreciate your written advice by 30 July 2003 as to when this information is expected to be lodged in the Industrial Registry, or your advice as to any problems which may be preventing the lodgement of the documents.

Now that the financial year 30 June 2003 has also ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

The legislative scheme set out in Part IX, Division 11 of the Act is directed at ensuring that a registered organisation or a branch of such an organisation discharges obligations of accountability to its members in relation to its financial affairs through proper and regular disclosure of financial information. The various steps of the financial reporting requirements must be carried out within the time-scales prescribed by the legislation so as to ensure the relevance of the financial information provided to the members.
