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NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2001

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1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards including the disclosure requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the accounts which, unless otherwise stated, have been consistently applied:-

(a) Basis of Accounting

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where otherwise stated, current valuations of fixed assets.

With the exception of membership contributions, all income and expenditure of the Union has been brought to account on an accruals basis of accounting so as to match income for the period with the expenditure incurred in earning that income.

Membership subscriptions are brought to account on the cash basis of accounting as and when received as permitted by Section 272 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

(b) Provisions for Accrued Annual Leave and Long Service Leave

Provision has been made in the accounts for the Union's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual and long service leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at their expected present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

(c) Income Tax

No provision has been made in the accounts for income tax on the basis that the Union is exempt under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (formerly Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936).

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2001 (CONT'D)

(d) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated in the accounts at historical cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Fixed assets, other than Freehold Land, are depreciated on a diminishing value basis over the period of their estimated effective lives.

(e) Goods & Services Tax

Goods and Services Tax ("GST") collected by the Branch is brought to account as a liability with refundable input credits in respect of GST paid reducing that liability. Accordingly, all items of income and expenditure brought to account in the financial statements is after the deduction of any applicable GST.

(f) Comparatives

Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified to achieve consistency in disclosure with changes in presentation in the current year.

2. WORKPLACE RELATIONS ACT 1996

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274, which read as follows -

(ii) The aggregate amount of remuneration paid to elected persons during the financial year is disclosed in the Statement of Income and Expenditure under Salaries & Allowances - Officials ie. \$49,369, and also Computer Expenses ie. \$725.

The aggregate amount paid during the financial year to a superannuation plan in connection with the retirement of elected persons was \$3,901.

(iii) There were no other transactions between the officers of the Union other than those relating to their membership of the Union and the reimbursement by the Union in respect of expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties. Such transactions have been on conditions no more favourable than those which it is reasonable to expect would have been adopted by parties at arm's length.



I am writing to inform you of the state of outstanding audits for the Musicians' Union of Australia.

The 2001 and 2002 audits for the Melbourne Branch have been completed and are now in the process of approval by Committee of Management, mailout to members and final approval by General Meeting or Meeting of Committee of Management. As you are aware, this process has certain minimum time constraints. As soon as this process has been completed the audits will be forwarded to the Registry.

The auditors for the Federal Office of the Musicians' Union of Australia are the same as those for the Melbourne Branch and now that the outstanding Branch audits have been addressed the auditors have commenced dealing with the Federal Office audits.
