
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EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE'S CERTIFICATE

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2003

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

The National Electrical Contractors Association, Australian Capital Territory Chapter, is an association that is established and domiciled in Australia.

The registered office and principal place of business of the National Electrical Contractors Association, Australian Capital Territory Chapter, is located at:

Level 3, 100 Dorcas St South Melbourne VIC 3205

During the year, the principal activities of the National Electrical Contractors Association, Australian Capital Territory Chapter, were the provision of professional advice to electrical contractors.

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 274, which read as follows:

- (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time as is prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

3. STATEMENTS OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the financial report are:

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report which has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standard Board and the Workplace Relations Act 1996. The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical cost or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2003 (Cont'd)

3. STATEMENTS OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont'd)

b) Taxation

No provision for income tax is necessary as "Associations of Employers" are exempt from income tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c) Trade Receivables

Trade receivables are recognised and carried at original invoice amount less a provision for any uncollectable debts. An estimate for doubtful debts is made when collection of the full amount is no longer probable. Bad debts are written-off as incurred.

d) Trade and Other Payables

Liabilities for trade creditors and other payables are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services received, whether or not billed to the Association.

e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand and in banks and short-term deposits are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and in banks, and money market investments readily convertible to cash within 2 working days.

f) Revenue Recognition

Operating Revenue

Operating revenue comprises revenue earned from the provision of products or services to members. Operating revenue is recognised when the goods are provided or when the fee in respect of services provided is receivable.

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised as it accrues.

g) Comparatives

Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified to achieve consistency with current financial year amounts and other disclosures.
