I have received the financial reports for the New South Wales Chapter of The National Electrical Contractors Association for the year ended 30 June 2005. The documents were lodged in the Registry on 24 October 2005 under s268 of Schedule 1B (RAO Schedule) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

This is the second lodgment by the branch of its audited financial reports under the Registration and Accountability of Organisations (RAO) Schedule which commenced on 12 May 2003. Employee benefits to holders of office

Note 14(a) to the Accounts states:

No member of the Executive Committee received any remuneration during the year for performing their duties as a member of the Executive Committee

However, I note that the Statement of Financial Performance discloses the following:

Employee benefits to holders of office \$ 194,410

The above two statements appear to be inconsistent. Would you be able to provide further information regarding this apparent inconsistency by Friday 9 December 2005.

In addition, a comparison of the figures for the 30 June 2004 financial year as presented in the financial report for that year and the comparative figures for the same period as presented in the financial report for 30 June 2005 indicate that an amount of \$87,047 has been transferred from *Employee benefits to holders of office* to *Employee benefits Expenses* – see Attachment A. Would you also be able to clarify this apparent inconsistency by Friday 9 December 2005.

The following comments may assist you when you next prepare financial reports. No further action is required regarding these issues with respect to the lodged documents.

Committee of Management Statement

It is only necessary for the Committee to provide one such statement which is to be drawn up in accordance with the requirements of Items 24 to 26 of the Reporting Guidelines issued under s253 of the RAO Schedule.

For your assistance I have enclosed a sample Committee of Management Statement as lodged by the National Office of the organisation — see Attachment B.

Operating Report

In future financial years the Operating Report must also include:

- the number of members of the branch as at the end of the financial year, and
- the number of employees of the branch as at the end of the financial year

For further information see Regulation 159 of the RAO Regulations and s254(2)(f) of the RAO Schedule.

Accounts need to include Notice which sets out sections 272(1), (2) & (3)

In future financial years the accounts must include a notice drawing attention to the fact that prescribed information is available to members on request. This requirement is set out in subsection 272(5) of the RAO Schedule, and it specifically requires the accounts to include a copy of subsections 272(1), (2) & (3) as follows:

- (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

This information is normally set out in the Notes to the Accounts.

Accounting Officer's Certificate

The Accounting Officer's Certificate was a document required under the former financial reporting requirements of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*. This certificate is not required under the RAO Schedule as it has, in effect, been replaced by the Operating Report.

Financial reports for the financial year ending 30 June 2006 should be lodged in the Registry by 15 January 2007 - see the *Timeline* and sections 265(5) and 266 of the RAO Schedule.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 June 2005

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Registration and Accountability of Organisations Legislation (RAO) Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

Freehold Land & Building

Freehold land and buildings are carried at cost or at independent or committee of managements' valuation.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the association to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset was held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates and useful lives used for each class of depreciable assets are:

(c) Investments

Non-current investments are measured on the cost basis. The carrying amount of investments is reviewed annually by directors' to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of these investments. The recoverable amount is assessed from the quoted market value for shares in listed companies or the underlying net assets for other non-listed corporations. The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on-costs. Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(e) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

(f) Revenue

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Other revenue is recognised when the right to receive the revenue has been established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Project Funds - Provision for Industry Education and Training

Funds received from the Mechanical and Electrical Redundancy Trust (MERT) are initially placed into a Project Bank account and a liability is raised for provision of industry education and training. The Association uses these funds to subsidise training courses and to finance inustry education and training related projects. Separate subsidiary records are maintained for the project account. Refer Note 15.

(h) Controlled Entities

Separate financial statements are prepared for any controlled entity. The New South Wales Chapter's financial statements and those of its controlled entities are consolidated in the financial statements of the economic entity "National Electrical Contractors Association". Therefore, no consolidated financial statements are prepared at the New South Wales Chapter level.

A fixed fee of \$50,000 based on a commercial estimate of time and cost involved in providing these services is charged on a quarterly basis.

The Association also provides part funding to the company from its Project Fund (Note 1(j)) for training of apprentices. The amount paid / payable during the year was \$60,000 (2004:\$60,000).

The Association also has an investment in Westpac Financial Services on behalf of the company. At balance date, the total investment was \$1,525,991 (2004:\$1,441,656). The investment is not included in these accounts.

(c) Net Fair Values

The net fair values of are determined by discounting the cash flows, at the market interest rates of similar securities, to their present value. For unlisted investments where there is no organised financial market the net fair value has been based on a reasonable estimation of the underlying net assets or discounted cash flows of the investment.

The net fair value of listed investments have been valued at the quoted market bid price at balance date adjusted for transaction costs expected to be incurred. For other assets and other liabilities the net fair value approximates their carrying value. No financial assets and financial liabilities are readily traded on organised markets in standardised form other than listed investments, forward exchange contracts and interest rate swaps. Financial assets where the carrying amount exceeds net fair values have not been written down as the association intends to hold these assets to maturity.

The aggregate net fair values and carrying amount of financial assets and financial liabilities are disclosed in the statement of financial position and in the notes to the financial statements.

NOTE 18: PROJECT FUND

Prior to 2002, the Association received funding for industry education and training projects arising from submissions to the Mechanical and Electrical Redundancy Trust (MERT). There has been no funding from MERT since the period ended 30 June 2002 and no further funding is expected. During the year the Association incurred \$249,421 (2004:\$358,031) on these training projects in related costs.

The Association received reimbursement of \$194,338 (2004:\$153,592) from the Project Fund for direct expenses incurred with industry initiatives associated with training, occupational health & safety and the like. Interest received during the year of \$110,333 (2004:\$116,705) has been credited to the project fund.

Separate subsidiary records and bank accounts are maintained for the receipts from MERT. The Association uses these funds to subsidise training courses and to finance industry education and training related projects.

At 30 June 2005, \$1,868,373 remained in the project account. The assets and liabilities of the Trust are disclosed in the financial statements as follows:
