# **Re: Financial Report for the Financial Year Ended 30 June 2007 - FR2007/324** Schedule 1 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)

I acknowledge receipt of the amended Auditor's Opinion of the Deakin University Branch of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union for the year ended 30 June 2007. The document was lodged in the Industrial Registry on 12 June 2008.

The financial report has now been filed.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged.

# **Timescale Requirements**

As you are aware, an organisation is required under the RAO Schedule to undertake certain steps in accordance with specified timelines. Information about these timeline requirements can be found on the Australian Industrial Relations Commission <u>website</u>. In particular, I draw your attention to <u>fact sheet 08</u> which explains the timeline requirements, and <u>fact sheet 09</u> which sets out the timeline requirements in diagrammatical form.

Provide reports to members before committee of management meeting

The full report is to be presented to a General Meeting to be held within 6 months after the end of the financial year – see section 265(5)(a) of the RAO Schedule.

It is noted that this did not occur within the timeframe. In future financial years, please ensure that the General Meeting is to be held within 6 months after the end of the financial year.

Documents not lodged in Registry within 14 days of meeting

The documents were presented to a General Meeting on 11 February 2008 but were not lodged in the Registry until 4 March 2008.

In future financial years the documents should be lodged in the Industrial Registry within 14 days of the meeting at which they were presented - see section 268 of the RAO Schedule.

# **Operating Report**

# Membership of committee of management

Regulation 159(c) of the *Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003* (RAO Regulations) provides that the Operating Report should contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position. I note the Operating Report does not list the periods for members of the committee of management holding the positions for less than the full financial year. #### **Auditor's Report**

#### Auditor's Qualifications

In future financial years, the Auditor's Report should be amended so that it provides details of the Auditor's qualifications to confirm he or she is an 'approved auditor' under s256 of the RAO Schedule and Regulation 4 of the RAO Regulations.

Regulation 4 defines an approved auditor as a person who is a member of CPA Australia, The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia or the National Institute of Accountants *and* holds a current Public Practice Certificate. It is our preference that these qualifications are noted on the Auditor's Report.

#### Auditor's Opinion

I note that the amended Audit Opinion does contain the correct words 'presents fairly' but also contains the words 'true and fair view' as was used in the superseded legislation. It is suggested that the Auditor refrain from using the words 'true and fair view' in his Audit Opinion. The following wording in the auditor's opinion would satisfy the requirements:

"In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the RAO Schedule of the Workplace Relations Act 1996".

I note that the Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2006 used substantially similar wording to the wording suggested above. I attach a copy of the Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2006 for your information.

Scope

#### The financial report and trustees' responsibility

The general purpose financial report comprises the income statement, balance sheet, detailed income statement, cash flow statement and accompanying notes to the financial statements and the committee of management statement for the National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Deakin University Branch for the year ended  $30^{\text{th}}$  June 2006.

The trustees of the branch are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the general purpose financial report in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996. - examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report, and
- assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the committee of management.

#### <u>Manner of Resignation</u> – s254(2)(c)

Members may resign from the organisation in accordance with Rule 11 (Resignation from Membership) which reads as follows:

- 11.1 A member may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the member's Division Secretary or Branch Secretary provided that:
  - (a) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Division Secretary, he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the appropriate Branch Secretary;
  - (b) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Branch Secretary, he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the relevant Division Secretary.
- 11.2 A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

(b) in any other case:

- (i) at the end of two weeks, or if permitted by law three months after the notice is received by the Union; or
- (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- 11.3 Any dues payable but not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- 11.4 A notice delivered to the Division Secretary or Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.

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#### **OPERATING REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE 2007 (Continued)**

- 11.5 A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule 1 of this rule.
- 11.6 A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this rule if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.
- 11.7 Cessation of payment of any dues, levies and other amounts by a member does not, of itself, terminate membership of the Union.

# 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

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This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the Trustees' accountability requirements under the Union's Rules and the requirements under the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers the National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Deakin University Branch as an individual entity. The National Tertiary Education Industry Union is a registered organisation registered under the Workplace Relations Act 1996 and domiciled in Australia. The National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Deakin University Branch is a branch of that organisation.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided on all fixed assets so as to write off the assets progressively over their estimated economic lives to the Branch. The prime cost method of depreciation is used.

Depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

(b) Revenue

Member subscription revenue is recognised when the respective fees have been deducted from the members' wages and salaries.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE 2007

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

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#### (c) Provision for Employee Entitlements

The provision relates to annual leave and long service leave and has been calculated on the basis of actual entitlements under appropriate awards, based on current wage rates.

#### (d) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(e) Income Tax

No income tax has been provided, as the Branch is exempt from income tax pursuant to section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended.

(f) Information to be provided to members or registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-section (1) (2) and (3) of section 272, which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under sub-section (1).

Note: This sub-section is a civil penalty provision

(g) Economic Dependency

The Branch is not economically dependent on any other reporting units of the organisation.

(h) Segment Reporting

The reporting entity operates in one business and geographical segment being the provision of trade union services to its members in Victoria.
