Re: Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (the RAO Schedule) Financial Reports for year ended 30 June 2004 FR2004/481

I have received the financial documents for the Edith Cowan University Branch of the abovenamed organisation for the year ended 30 June 2004 lodged in the Melbourne Industrial Registry on 15 November 2004.

The documents have been filed.

The following matters are referred for your assistance when preparing financial returns:

No further action is required in respect of the subject documents. However, it would be appreciated if the same matter is not repeated for the next financial year.

#### 1. Auditor's Report

Subsection 257(5) of the RAO Schedule now sets out the matters upon which an auditor is required to make an opinion on whether the GPFR is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and other requirements of the RAO Schedule. The following wording would satisfy the requirements:

"In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996."

#### 2. Operating Report

#### (a) Right of members to resign:

Subsection 254(2)(c) requires the operating report to "give details" of the right of members to resign from the reporting unit under section 174 of the RAO Schedule. The requirement may be met by the inclusion of a statement that a member has the right to resign and a reference to the relevant rule, which makes such provision. Alternatively, the complete text of the relevant resignation rule may be reproduced in the report. It would appear in this case that rule 11 of the organisation's Rules is applicable.

#### (b) Trustees of superannuation entities:

The report must give details (including details of the position held) of any <u>officer</u> or member of the reporting unit who is:

- (i) a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme; or
- (ii) a director of a company that is a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme; and

where a criterion for the officer or member being the trustee or director is that the officer or member is an officer or member of a registered organisation

The name and contact details of a superannuation fund is not sufficient for the purposes of subsection 254(2)(d) of Schedule 1B.

#### (c) Membership of Committee of Management:

The operating report is required to contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position (regulation 159(c) of the RAO Regulations).

The operating report lodged provided details of the membership of the committee of management for the period 1 October 2002 - 30 September 2004. I note that Note 11 of the notes to the financial documents provides further details in relation to the membership of the committee of management during the financial year. In order to fully comply with the abovementioned regulation, details of membership of the committee at the beginning of the financial year and any changes made to the composition of the committee during the financial year should be set out in the operating report itself.

#### 3. Committee of Management's Statement

...........

Paragraph 17 of the Industrial Registrar's Reporting guidelines, as made under section 255 of the RAO Schedule states:

"The committee of management statement must include declarations by the committee of management as to whether in the opinion of the committee of management:

(e)(iv) where the organisation consists of 2 or more reporting units, the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept, as far as practicable, in a consistent manner to each of the other reporting units of the organisation;

(vi) there has been compliance with any order for inspection of financial records made by the Commission under section 273 of the RAO Schedule."

The Committee of Management's Statement has repeated the wording as provided in paragraphs 17(e)(iv) and (vi). Such statement should indicate whether or not the financial records have been kept in a consistent manner to each of the other reporting units of the organisation and whether any order for inspection of financial records made by the Commission under s273 of the RAO Schedule has been complied with.

In relation to paragraph 17(e)(iv) I suggest, if the records have been kept in a consistent manner to each of the organisation's reporting units, that the words "where the organisation consists of 2 or more reporting units" be deleted.

In relation to paragraph 17(e)(vi) I suggest, if the reporting unit has complied with any order as specified in that paragraph, that the paragraph be worded as follows:

"there has been compliance with an order made by the Commission under section 273 of the RAO Schedule."

Further, if there has been no such order, a statement similar to the following should be made:

"no orders have been made by the Commission under section 273 of the RAO Schedule during the period."

Future Committee of Management's statements should include all required information.

#### 4. General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR)

#### **Notes to Accounts**

I note that the notes to the accounts provide the provisions of section 274 of the Industrial Relations Act 1988. The accounts should set out the provisions of subsections 272(1), (2) and (3) of the RAO Schedule. Would you please ensure those subsections are copied into the GPFR in the next financial report of the Branch.



#### **OPERATING REPORT YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004**

#### 2003/2004 Highlights

For the whole of the twelve months, the Edith Cowan Branch on behalf of its members was engaged in enterprise bargaining with Management.

As a result, provisional Agreements\* were reached which will result in a number of significant benefits in the conditions of service of all academic and general staff at Edith Cowan University, including a 15% salary increase over the three year period commencing on 1 July 2003.

\* These Agreements have yet to be voted on by staff as required by the Workplace Relations Act.

#### **Number of Members**

Eighty Two General Staff (82)

#### **Number of Employees**

One (1) – 30 hours per week

#### Significant Changes

- 1. Employment of one (1) staff member from 5 January 2004 to manage the administration of the Branch office. This staff member had previously been employed by the Academic Staff Association of Edith Cowan University (Inc.). All leave entitlements were transferred and honoured by the NTEU (ECU Branch).
- 2. At the Annual General Meeting of the Academic Staff Association of Edith Cowan University (Inc.) held on 12 November 2003, it was agreed to increase the annual membership fee from 0.85% to 0.95% of members gross salary.

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values. The preparation of the financial report on an accruals basis is a change in accounting policy from prior years.

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The ability for the union to continue as a going concern is dependent on receiving membership dues.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Edith Cowan University Branch (NTEU-ECU) in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation

#### **Plant and Equipment**

Plant and equipment are measured on a cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the entity to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

#### Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

- (c) Revenue

  Membership income and interest income is brought to account when received.
- (d) <u>Cash</u> For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.
- (e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)
  Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.
- (f) <u>Comparatives</u>
  Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified to achieve consistency in disclosure with current financial year information and other disclosures.
- (g) Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards
  Australia is currently preparing for the introduction of International Financial Reporting Standards
  (IFRS) effective for financial years commencing 1 January 2005. This requires the production of accounting data for future comparative purposes at the end of the current financial year.

The committee are assessing the significance of these changes and preparing for their implementation. The committee is of the opinion there are no key differences in the entity's accounting policies from the adoption of IFRS.

#### Other Related Party Transactions

(a) NTEU-WA State Division and NTEU National Office

The NTEU-ECU branch has transactions with both the NTEU-WA State Division (WA Division) and NTEU National Office, all of these transactions are on normal commercial terms and conditions.

From 1 July to 30 November 2003, the entire amount of general staff fees collected by NTEU-ECU was paid to the WA Division. These fees totalled \$10,404 (2003 \$15,229). From 1 December 2003 to 30 June 2004, the WA Division portion of the general staff capitation fees was paid to the WA Division. The WA Division portion of academic staff capitation fees was also paid to the WA Division for the full year. The total capitation paid to the WA Division for both academic staff and general staff is \$57,996 (2003 \$38,943). The proportions payable are determined by the WA Division. One off payments of \$24,086 (2003 nil) were paid to the WA Division to assist in paying a payroll tax liability and staff leave liability were also made during the financial year

Capitation fees and defence fund levy paid to the NTEU National Office totalled \$89,064 (2003 \$76,785). These amounts are determined by the NTEU National Office.

From the 5 January 2004 the NTEU-ECU employed the Branch Executive Officer and subsequently also employed a casual employee. All costs incurred in employing NTEU-ECU staff including wages and salaries, superannuation and payroll tax are paid by the NTEU National Office and are reimbursed by the NTEU-ECU Branch. These costs totalled \$27,172 during the financial year (2003 nil). The estimated annual leave liability for the Executive Officer as at 30 June 2004 is \$1,869; this amount is not provided for in the financial statements. The estimated present value of the long service leave liability is \$1,841; this amount is also not provided for in the financial statements.

At balance date no amount is payable or receivable from either the WA Division or the NTEU National Office.

(b) Academic Staff Association of Edith Cowan University (ASA-ECU)

Transactions with ASA-ECU are on normal commercial terms and conditions.

Prior to 3 January 2004 the Executive Officer was employed by ASA-ECU. The actual costs incurred in employing the executive officer for this period were reimbursed by NTEU-ECU. These costs totalled \$21,077 during the financial year (2003 \$19,397).

NTEU-ECU also received \$30,000 (2003 \$15,000) from ASA-ECU to assist in the payment of the one off WA Division payments per Note 3(b) and above.

In 2003 the NTEU-ECU paid dues of \$20,250 to ASA-ECU, in 2004 no amount was paid.

The committee of NTEU-ECU has also resolved to reimburse and indemnify to the extent necessary ASA-ECU against all reasonable future costs associated with servicing the members of the ASA-ECU.

At balance date no amount is payable or receivable from ASA-ECU.

# NOTICE TO MEMBERS OF THE NTEU (ECU BRANCH)

## FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR YEAR ENDING 30 JUNE 2004

#### SECTION 274: INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

#### 274(1) Application For Information

A member of an organization, or a Registrar, may apply to the organization for specified prescribed information in relation to the organization.

#### 274(2) Provision of Information

An organization shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organization or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.

#### 274(3) Function of Registrar

A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organization concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

#### 274(4) Notice in Accounts

Accounts prepared under section 273 shall include a notice drawing attention to subsections (1), (2) and (3) and setting out those subsections.

#### SECTION 273: ORGANISATION TO PREPARE ACCOUNTS ETC.

#### 273(1) Prescription

As soon as practicable after the end of each financial year, an organization:

- (a) shall cause to be prepared from the accounting records kept by the organization under subsection 272(1) in relation to the financial year, such accounts and other statements, in relation to the financial year, as are prescribed; and
- (b) shall include in the accounts (other than accounts prepared in relation to the first financial year of the organization to which this Division applies) the relevant figures from the accounts prepared by the organization, under this subsection, in relation to the preceding financial year.

#### 273(2) Certificates

The regulations may provide for the giving of certificates in, or in relation to, accounts or other statements prepared under subsection (1).

#### SECTION 272: ORGANISATION TO KEEP PROPER ACCOUNTING RECORDS

#### 272(1) Prescription An organization shall:

- (a) keep such accounting records as correctly record and explain the transactions and financial position of the organization, including such records as are prescribed;
- (b) keep its accounting records in such a manner as will enable accounts and statements to be prepared from them under section 273; and
- (c) keep its accounting records in such a manner as will enable the accounts of the organization to be conveniently and properly audited under this Division.

#### 272(2) Cash or accrual basis

Accounting records of an organization may, so far as they relate to the income and expenditure of the organization, be kept on a cash basis or accrual basis, at the option of the organization.
