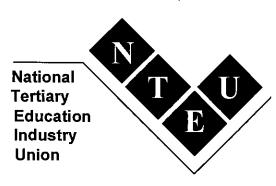

# NOTICE TO MEMBERS OF THE NTEU (ECU BRANCH)

## FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR YEAR ENDING 30 JUNE 2005

#### SECTION 274: INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

#### 274(1) Application For Information

A member of an organization, or a Registrar, may apply to the organization for specified prescribed information in relation to the organization.

#### 274(2) Provision of Information

An organization shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organization or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.

#### 274(3) Function of Registrar

A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organization concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

#### 274(4) Notice in Accounts

Accounts prepared under section 273 shall include a notice drawing attention to subsections (1), (2) and (3) and setting out those subsections.

#### SECTION 273: ORGANISATION TO PREPARE ACCOUNTS ETC.

#### 273(1) Prescription

As soon as practicable after the end of each financial year, an organization:

- (a) shall cause to be prepared from the accounting records kept by the organization under subsection 272(1) in relation to the financial year, such accounts and other statements, in relation to the financial year, as are prescribed; and
- (b) shall include in the accounts (other than accounts prepared in relation to the first financial year of the organization to which this Division applies) the relevant figures from the accounts prepared by the organization, under this subsection, in relation to the preceding financial year.

#### 273(2) Certificates

The regulations may provide for the giving of certificates in, or in relation to, accounts or other statements prepared under subsection (1).

#### SECTION 272: ORGANISATION TO KEEP PROPER ACCOUNTING RECORDS

#### 272(1) Prescription An organization shall:

- (a) keep such accounting records as correctly record and explain the transactions and financial position of the organization, including such records as are prescribed;
- (b) keep its accounting records in such a manner as will enable accounts and statements to be prepared from them under section 273; and
- (c) keep its accounting records in such a manner as will enable the accounts of the organization to be conveniently and properly audited under this Division.

#### 272(2) Cash or accrual basis

Accounting records of an organization may, so far as they relate to the income and expenditure of the organization, be kept on a cash basis or accrual basis, at the option of the organization.

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#### **OPERATING REPORT YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005**

#### 2004/2005 Highlights

Enterprise Bargaining between the NTEU (ECU Branch) and Edith Cowan University (ECU) Management occurred throughout the period July 2004 to April 2005. The ECU Academic Staff Certified Agreement 2003 was certified on 29 April 2005 and the ECU General Staff Certified Agreement 2003 was certified on 5 May 2005. These Agreements provided a number of significant benefits in the conditions of service of all academic and general staff at ECU, including a 15% salary increase over the three year period commencing on 1 July 2003. Both Agreements expire on 30 June 2006.

#### Number of Members as at 30 June 2005

Four Hundred and Thirty Nine (439).

Three Hundred and Fifty One (351) Academic Staff Eighty Eight General Staff (88)

#### **Number of Employees**

One (1) Branch Executive Officer – 30 hours per week.

#### Significant Changes

The NTEU National Council endorsed the implementation of a common minimum membership fee of 1.0% to take effect from the first pay period after 1 March 2005. The ECU Branch fee was 0.95% prior to 1 March 2005. The reasons for endorsing the common minimum fee were:

- (a) The fee varied from Branch to Branch throughout Australia even though all members received the same service and benefits. Fees at some Branches were slightly higher than 1.0% and substantially lower at other Branches.
- (b) There was a need to employ additional staff to service members and, therefore, additional income was needed.

ECU Members were advised of this decision to increase membership dues to 1.0% at the Annual General Meeting held on 3 November 2004.

No officer or member of the NTEU (ECU Branch) is a director of a company that is a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme.

#### Principal Activities of the Branch

- 1. Industrial advice to members by Industrial Officer employed by the NTEU WA Division.
- 2. Consultation with members regarding Enterprise Bargaining (Round 4).
- 3. Consultation with Academic Staff Joint Consultative Committee on Enterprise Bargaining (Round 4) and academic matters in general.
- 4. Consultation with General Staff Joint Consultative Committee on Enterprise Bargaining (Round 4) and general staff matters in general.
- 5. Negotiation with university management on Enterprise Bargaming (Round 4).
- 6. Consultation with members and university management regarding university policies and procedures.

- 7. Union representation on university working parties.
- 8. Provision of services to members (e.g. legal service).
- 9. Supervision of branch administration, finance and industrial officer activities.
- 10. Branch Committee meetings held approximately every six weeks.
- 11. NTEU national participation in conferences, national strike action, national meetings.
- 12. Recruitment of new members.
- 13. Liaison with School Delegates.

#### Right of Members to Resign

Pursuant to Rule 11 of the NTEU Rules as certified by the Deputy Industrial Registrar on 5 May 2005, members have the right to resign by written notice to the Branch Secretary, and payment of dues by direct debit or credit card is cancelled thereby. Authorising the cancellation of payment of dues by payroll deduction is separate to resignation from the union and is the responsibility of the member. Resignation procedure is advised on the NTEU website <a href="www.nteu.org.au">www.nteu.org.au</a> and on membership application material.

#### Membership of the Committee of Management

There are a total of fifteen (15) elected positions on the Committee of Management comprising the President, Vice-President (Academic Staff), Vice-President (General Staff), Ordinary Committee Member (Academic Staff), Ordinary Committee Member (General Staff), Ordinary Committee Member (Indigenous) and nine (9) Ordinary Committee Members. Elections are held every two years and the term of office runs from 1 October to 30 September. Various changes occur during the term of office as members leave ECU. When a member leaves, their position becomes vacant and can be filled by co-option. Members interested in being co-opted are nominated and the nominations are presented at a Committee of Management Meeting. The co-option of new members onto the Committee of Management has to be endorsed by a majority vote.

The Treasurer is not an elected position but is appointed by the Committee of Management. John May was the appointed Treasurer for the reporting period.

### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values. The preparation of the financial report on an accruals basis is a change in accounting policy from prior years.

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The ability for the union to continue as a going concern is dependent on receiving membership dues.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Edith Cowan University Branch (NTEU-ECU) in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation

#### Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on a cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the entity to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

#### Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

(b) <u>Income Tax</u>

The union is exempt from income tax.

(c) Revenue

Membership income and interest income is brought to account when received.

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies (cont'd)

- (d) Cash
  - For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.
- (e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

- (f) Comparatives
  - Where necessary, comparative information has been reclassified to achieve consistency in disclosure with current financial year information and other disclosures.
- Impact of Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards
  The Union is preparing and managing the transition to Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) effective for the financial years commencing 1 January 2005. The adoption of AIFRS will be reflected in the Union's financial statements for the year ending 30 June 2006. On the first time adoption of AIFRS, comparatives for the financial year ended 30 June 2005 are required to be restated. The majority of the AIFRS transitional adjustments will be made retrospectively against retained earnings at 1 July 2004.

The Committee of Management, along with its auditors, have assessed the significance of the expected changes and are preparing for their implementation. The impact of the alternative treatments and elections under AASB1: First Time Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards has been considered where applicable.

The committee members are of the opinion that the key material differences in the Union's accounting policies on conversion to AIFRS and the financial effect of these differences where known are as follows. Users of the financial statements should note, however, that the amounts disclosed could change if there are any amendments by standard-setters to the current AIFRS, or interpretation of the AIFRS requirements changes.

- Impairment of Assets
  - Under AASB 136: Impairment of Assets, the recoverable amount of an asset is determined as the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In determining value in use, projected future cash flows are discounted using a risk adjusted pre-tax discount rate and impairment is assessed for the individual asset or at the 'cash generating unit' level. A 'cash generating unit' is determined as the smallest group of assets or groups of assets. The current policy is to determine the recoverable amount of an asset on the basis of undiscounted net cash flows that will be received from the asset's use and subsequent disposal. It is likely that this change in accounting policy will lead to impairments being recognized more often.

The Union has reassessed its impairment testing policy and tested all assets for impairment at 1 July 2005. The Union is of the opinion that the change will not be material.

Other Related Party Transactions

(a) NTEU-WA State Division and NTEU National Office

The NTEU-ECU branch has transactions with both the NTEU-WA State Division (WA Division) and NTEU National Office, all of these transactions are on normal commercial terms and conditions.

Capitation fees are paid to the WA Division; the amounts payable are determined by the NTEU National Office. In 2005 these totalled \$66,970 (2004 \$68,400). A one-off payment to the WA Division as a contribution towards a staff redundancy package was also made during the financial year of \$3,000 (2004 \$24,086).

Capitation fees and defence fund levy paid to the NTEU National Office totalled \$107,388 (2004 \$89,064). Again these amounts are determined by the NTEU National Office.

The NTEU National Office employs the NTEU-ECU Branch Executive Officer. All costs incurred in employing staff on behalf of NTEU-ECU including wages and salaries, superannuation and payroll tax are reimbursed by the NTEU-ECU branch. These costs totalled \$43,288 during the financial year (2004 \$27,172). The estimated employee entitlement for the Executive Officer as at 30 June 2005 is \$6,242 (2004 \$3,710) this amount is provided for in the financial statements (Note 6).

At balance date no amount is payable or receivable from either the WA Division or the NTEU National Office.

(b) Academic Staff Association of Edith Cowan University (ASA-ECU)

Transactions with ASA-ECU are on normal commercial terms and conditions.

Prior to 5 January 2004 the Executive Officer was employed by ASA-ECU. The actual costs incurred in employing the executive officer for this period were reimbursed by NTEU-ECU. These costs totalled \$21,077 in the 2004 year (2005 nil).

NTEU-ECU also received \$6,000 (2004 \$3,000) from ASA-ECU \$1,000 for the provision of secretarial support and \$5,000 for leave entitlements accrued whilst the Executive Officer was employed by ASA-ECU.

The committee of NTEU-ECU has also resolved to reimburse and indemnify to the extent necessary ASA-ECU against all reasonable future costs associated with servicing the members of the ASA-ECU.

At balance date no amount is payable or receivable from ASA-ECU.

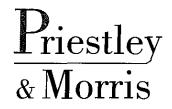
