I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports for the National Tertiary Education Industry Union, Griffith University Branch for the years ended 30 June 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008. The reports were lodged with the Registry on 26 June 2009.

Ordinarily we would advise you of deficiencies that you should take into account in preparation of future financial reports. However, as the 2005, 2006 and 2007 reports have already been completed and the relevant timelines incapable of being remedied it seems redundant to draw your attention to those matters.

Nonetheless I have noted below a number of matters I have identified which I would ask you to take specific account of (in addition to timelines in order to ensure full compliance) in the event in the future you are required to prepare full reports.

I make the following comments to assist you when you next prepare a financial report. You are not required to take any further action in respect of the report lodged.

Operating Report

Membership of Committee of Management

The operating report contained a list of office holders as at the end of the financial year. Please note the operating report is required to contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position - refer regulation 159(c) of the *Workplace Relations* (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003.

Presentation of the full report to a general meeting

Section 265(5)(a) of Schedule 1 requires that the general meeting of members is to be held within six months of the end of the financial year and that copies of the report are to be provided to members 21 days prior to that meeting. Future reports should be distributed as required by section 265(5)(a) of the Act.

THE NATIONAL TERTIARY EDUCATION UNION GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY BRANCH NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The general purpose financial report has been prepared in accordance with Australian Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and The Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

(a) Income Tax

The association is exempt from income tax under section 50 - 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the full net cost of each depreciable non-current asset over its expected useful life

(c) Cash

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by the union to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(e) Comparative Figures

Where necessary, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with the changes in presentation in the current year.

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

4. NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 272 OF THE WORKPLACE RELATIONS ACT 1996



Manner of Resignation – s254 (2)(c)

Members may resign from the organisation in accordance with Rule 11 (resignation from Membership, which reads as follows

- 11.1 A member may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the member's Division Secretary or Branch Secretary provided that:
 - (a) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Division Secretary he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the appropriate Branch Secretary;
 - (b) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Branch Secretary he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the relevant Division Secretary.
- 11.2 A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:
 - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) in any other case:
 - (i) at the end of two weeks, or if permitted by law three months after the notice is received by the Union; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- 11.3 Any dues payable but not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Umion in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Umion.
- 11.4 A notice delivered to a Division Secretary or Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- 11.5 A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule 1 of this rule.
- 11.6 A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this rule if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.
- 11.7 Cessation of payment of any dues, levies and other amounts by a member does not, of itself, terminate membership of the Union.

To the members of the National Tertiary Education Union Griffith University Branch

Scope

We have audited the financial accounts of the National Tertlary Education Union Griffith University Branch for the year ended 30 June 2005 as set out on pages 2 to 8. The Union's Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial accounts and the information they contain. We have conducted an independent audit of these financial accounts in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Union.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial accounts are free of material misstatement.
