Re: Financial Report for year ended 30 June 2004 - National Tertiary Education Industry Union - Monash University Branch - FR 2004/493

I refer to my letter of 2 February 2005 in which I informed you that I had filed the above financial report. I am writing to inform you I did so in the mistaken belief that the organisation's rules made provision for the full report to be presented to a committee of management meeting.

Subsection 266 (1) of the RAO Schedule provides that the full financial report should be presented to "a general meeting of the members ....". Subsection (3) of that section allows reporting units to present the report to a committee of management meeting if "the rules of the reporting unit provide for a specified percentage (not exceeding 5%) of members to be able to call a general meeting of the reporting unit for the purpose of considering the auditor's report, the general purpose financial report and the operating report ....".

Rule 53A (1) and (2) of the organisation's rules makes such provision with respect to the organisation and Divisions of the organisation respectively. However, the rule does <u>not</u> extend to branches of the organisation. I have discussed this oversight with Ms Sam Maynard from the National Office. I understand from that conversation the organisation will seek to make the necessary amendment to its rules in the future, certainly before branches are required to present their financial reports for the financial year ended 30 June 2005 to a meeting.

Whilst I am not asking you to do anything in relation to the financial report for the year ended 30 June 2004, which have already been filed as I indicated previously, however, I note that unless the rules of the organisation are altered in a manner consistent with subsection 266(3) then, the branch would have to present its financial report for the financial year ended 30 June 2005 to a general meeting, not a branch committee of management meeting.

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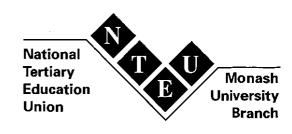

I have received the financial reports of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union - Monash University Branch for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 22 December 2004.

The documents have been filed.

Although the documents have been filed, I would like to comment on some issues arising out of the reports. I make these comments to assist you when you next prepare financial reports and you do not need to take any further action in respect of the financial reports already lodged.

- 1. General Purpose Financial Report
- (a) Profit and Loss Statement Loan, Grant, Donation exceeding \$1000

I note in the 'Detailed Statement of Income and Expenditure' that the item "Donations" totals \$3107. Section 237 of Schedule 1B requires that an organisation or branch shall, as soon as practicable after the end of the financial year, lodge with the Registrar a statement showing the relevant particulars in relation to each loan, grant or donation of an amount exceeding \$1,000 made by the organisation or branch during the financial year. If any single loan, grant or donation exceeds \$1,000 then the branch is required to lodge the relevant particulars set out in subsection 237(6). Obviously, no action is required if the issue is not relevant.

- 2. <u>Committee of Management's Statement</u>
- (a) Date of Resolution

# Minutes of NTEU BRANCH COMMITTEE Meeting No. 11/04, Thursday 18 NOVEMBER 2004 in Clayton VideoConference Centre (with links to Peninsula and Gippsland)

#### 1. ATTENDANCE / APOLOGIES

#### 2. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the meeting of 21 October 2004were adopted without amendment.

### 5. CAMPAIGN AND ORGANISING COMMITTEE

# **Enterprise Bargaining Mark4**

Sandra Cockfield reported that the recent financial briefing by Monash management had been unconvincing and noted that a detailed report for members was being prepared arguing that Monash could indeed afford a higher pay offer. DVC Lindsay had remarked that any higher pay offer must be focused on the period after 2006 but that, in any event, the university would not negotiate while the results ban was in operation. There appears to be attempts to set up some sort of informal meeting (notwithstanding the results ban).

Following the recent Federal Election, NTEU National Office is promulgating a revised Enterprise Bargaining strategy based on expiry dates of late 2007/ early 2008. All NTEU Branches participated in a recent teleconference and some Branches indicated a willingness to re-open signed Agreements to achieve these extended expiry dates. Monash management is already exploring the possibility of later expiry dates. Sandra distributed a confidential paper outlining possible salary offer scenarios through to early 2008. Member meetings have been scheduled for the following week to present options to members.

#### Ban on the Release of Semester 2 Results

Briefly, around 150-200 Applications for Exemption had been received so far and probably over two thirds of these had been approved.

Sandra Cockfield.

Branch Committee formally expressed its appreciation to Susan Feteris for her efforts as Chair of the Exemptions Committee.

Carla Lipsig-Mumme commented that, while there was a lot of irritation among academic staff about the results ban, university management seemed to be more concerned about it than they have publicly acknowledged.

# Monash International Enterprise Agreement

A Staff Reference Group has been formed to consult staff before compiling a Log of Claims (to serve on MI management) and all MI general staff have been emailed seeking input for Staff Reference Group discussions.

NTEU membership among MI general staff is still small but is steadily increasing. A major thrust of these MI Enterprise Bargaining negotiations is to achieve an Enterprise Agreement more closely aligned to the University Enterprise Agreement (especially in relation to equality of classifications).

#### 9. OTHER BUSINESS

#### **APHEDA**

Thomas Michel addressed the meeting on the role of APHEDA (Union Aid Abroad). In many countries, large numbers live in poverty. Access to employment – and especially to safe employment – is critical for these marginalised workers. APHEDA helps with self-empowerment programs and is also involved with HIV/AIDS projects.

Federal government funding for APHEDA continues to decline. While they obtain some funding from the ACTU, a key focus is signing up individual union members for regular monthly donations. APHEDA is a very cost-effective aid agency (only 3% of funds are spent on administration costs) and trained 29,000 overseas workers in 2003.

Resolved that NTEU Monash University Branch will sponsor a nominated APHEDA project with assistance from our members.

# **Employee Assistance Program (Counselling)**

Dale Halstead reported that there had been no consultation with Community Services before introducing this EAP initiative which involves an external contract of \$120,000 PA. These funds could have been used to employ more university counsellors in Community Services.

**ACTION POINT:** To write to the university noting the lack of consultation and requesting more detailed information about EAP including the rationale for outsourcing, the full costs involved, the claimed benefits (over in-house counselling)

# 5. CAMPAIGN AND ORGANISING COMMITTEE

Enterprise Bargaining Mark4 Strike – 16 September 2004

Carol Williams reported that the strike had been largely successful with many staff staying away from work. Since the strike, she had sent a letter to the Vice-Chancellor but so far had received no formal response — however, the Dean of Arts (apparently on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor) had met informally with her. Matthew McGowan reported on a similar informal discussion with consultant Neil Pope where Neil attempted to explore options for settlement.

A discussion ensued around the settlement point for our salary claim. It was suggested that we need to begin using the term "catch up" rather than "salary rises" to emphasise how Monash staff are lagging behind staff at other universities. Carol noted that meetings of members to consider the implementation of a range of work bans would occur within two weeks.

# Monash Postgraduate Association Enterprise Agreement

Garry Ryan reported on a proposed Enterprise Agreement for Monash Postgraduate Association. It has been based on the Enterprise Agreement for Monash Students Association but is a "greenfields agreement" (under section 170 LL of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*) due to MPA staff not yet being employed by MPA but rather seconded from MSA. There was an early attempt by the DVC (Resources) to strip funding from MPA but funding is now guaranteed for MPA. The proposed Enterprise Agreement has now been endorsed by Victorian Division Executive and has been checked by National Office – accordingly, the proposed Agreement is now virtually finalised.

A discussion ensued around the desirability of seeking the approval of Branch Committee for such Enterprise Agreements in future.

# Monash International Enterprise Agreement

Josh Beggs reported that Monash International general staff had a non-union Enterprise Agreement (under section 170 LK of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*) and this is now expiring. Management is currently seeking nominations for a staff bargaining committee which would enable them to conclude another non-union Enterprise Agreement. Accordingly, he would like NTEU to write to Monash International management indicating our readiness to negotiate (a union Enterprise Agreement) – if this does not produce a result, we need to consider what advice we provide to our Monash International members.

**ACTION POINT:** To write to Vice-President International (Tony Pollock) an open letter (with copies to all Monash International general staff) seeking to open negotiations

# Adoption of 2003/04 Financial Statements

Rodger Smith introduced the 2003/2004 Branch Accounts prepared by our auditors and spoke briefly about our operating surplus and our ongoing solvency. He indicated some changes from prior years (including the introduction of a *Statement of Cash Flows*) and some changes in the certificates required by Australian Industrial Registry. It was then resolved that:

"The Committee of Management declares that in relation to the General Purpose Financial Report (GFPR) that, in its opinion:

- (a) the financial statements and notes comply with the Australian Accounting Standards;
- (b) the financial statements and notes comply with the reporting guidelines of the Industrial Registrar;

- (c) the financial statements and notes give a true and fair view of the financial performance, financial position and cash flows of this reporting unit for the financial year to which they relate;
- (d) there are reasonable grounds to believe that the reporting unit will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable;
- (e) during the financial year to which the GFPR relates and since the end of that year:
  - (i) meetings of the Committee of Management were held in accordance with the rules of *National Tertiary Education Industry Union*, including the rules concerning Branches of that union;
  - (ii) the financial affairs of the reporting unit have been managed in accordance with the rules of *National Tertiary Education Industry Union*, including the rules concerning Branches of that union;
  - (iii) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept and maintained in accordance with the RAO Schedule and the RAO Regulations;
  - (iv) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept, as far as practicable, in a consistent manner to each of the other reporting units of *National Tertiary Education Industry Union*;
  - (v) the information sought in any request of a member of the reporting unit or a Registrar duly made under section 272 of the *RAO Schedule* has been furnished to the member or Registrar;
  - (vi) No orders for the inspection of financial records have been made by the Commission under section 273 of the *RAO Schedule*."

- To promote industrial peace through conciliation and arbitration.

# Manner of Resignation – s254(2)(c)

Members may resign from the Branch in accordance with Rule 11 (Resignation from Membership) which reads as follows:

- 11.1 A member may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the member's Division Secretary or Branch Secretary provided that:
  - (a) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Division Secretary, he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the appropriate Branch Secretary;
  - (b) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Branch Secretary, he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the relevant Division Secretary.
- 11.2 A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

- (b) in any other case:
  - (i) at the end of two weeks, or if permitted by law three months after the notice is received by the Union; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

11.3 Any dues payable but not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.

- 11.4 A notice delivered to the Division Secretary or Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- 11.5 A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule 1 of this rule.
- 11.6 A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this rule if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.
- 11.7 Cessation of payment of any dues, levies and other amounts by a member does not, of itself, terminate membership of the Union.

### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the Trustees' accountability requirements under the Unions' Rules and the requirements under the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers the National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Monash University Branch as an individual entity. The National Tertiary Education Industry Union – Monash University Branch is a trade union, recognised by the Australian Industrial Registry and domiciled in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

# (a) Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided on all fixed assets so as to write off the assets progressively over their estimated economic lives to the Branch. The prime cost method of depreciation is used.

# (d) Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

### (e) Income Tax

No income tax has been provided, as the Branch is exempt from income tax pursuant to section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended.

# (f) Information to be provided to members or registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sub-section (1) (2) and (3) of section 272, which reads as follows:

- (1) A member of an organisation or Registrar may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by members of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time as prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under sub-section (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the members.
