Re: Financial Reports for year ended 30 June 2004 - National Tertiary Education Industry Union - University of New England Branch - FR 2004/496

I acknowledge receipt of your correspondence dated 7 April 2005 enclosing an operating report of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union - University of New England Branch for the year ended 30 June 2004. The report was lodged in the Industrial Registry on 14 April 2005. Further, I note your earlier correspondence lodged in the Industrial Registry on 4 January 2005 and my letter to you of 3 February 2005.

The documents have now been filed.

Although the documents have been filed, I reiterate my earlier observation that the documents lodged were prepared in accordance with the reporting requirements under the provisions of Division 11 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. Future financial reports will not be filed unless there is *strict compliance* with each aspect of the relevant provisions of the Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) legislation. Again, I draw your attention to the Commission's website where you can access the relevant legislation and also, various facts sheets prepared by the Registry to aid reporting units prepare financial reports.

In relation to the abovementioned operating report I make the following comment:

#### **Operating Report**

(a) Subsection 254(2)(a) of Schedule 1B provides the report should contain "a review of the reporting unit's principal activities". I think this requirement demands more than a statement that the principal activity of the branch was "that of a registered trade union". In future I suggest, as a minimum, the Branch should state, in broad terms at least, how it represented the interests of the members of the Branch.

Finally, I draw your attention specifically to section 266 of Schedule 1B of the Act which provides that the 'full report' must be presented to a General Meeting of members unless the rules of the reporting unit "... provide for a specified percentage (not exceeding 5%) of members to be able to call a general meeting of the reporting unit for the purpose of considering the auditor's report, the general purpose financial report and the operating report ..." in which case it can be presented to a committee of management meeting. The rules of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union do not make such provision with respect to branches, therefore, unless that situation changes, future financial reports should be presented to a General Meeting of members.

I understand you received a letter reminding you to lodge the financial reports of the Branch for the year ended 30 June 2004 when you had already done so. This was clearly sent in error. I apologise for this oversight.

#### **Principal Activities**

The principal activity of the Branch during the year was that of a registered trade union. No significant change occurred in the nature of those activities during the year.

#### **Operating Result**

I have received the financial reports of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union - University of New England Branch for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 4 January 2005.

I advise the documents enclosed appear to have been prepared under the provisions of Division 11 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996. As you would be aware, the Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) legislation came into operation on 12 May 2003. The accounts for the period covered by the abovementioned documents should have been prepared in accordance with the relevant provisions of Schedule 1B of the Act (the RAO Schedule), the Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003 and the Reporting Guidelines issued by the Industrial Registrar. Each of these documents may be accessed on the Commission's website at <a href="https://www.airc.gov.au">www.airc.gov.au</a> You will also find various fact sheets on the new legislative requirements imposed on organisations, branches and reporting entities, including one on financial reporting <a href="http://www.airc.gov.au/fact\_sheets/factsheets.html">http://www.airc.gov.au/fact\_sheets/factsheets.html</a>. I recommend you acquaint yourself with the relevant legislation, and the other material, and then perhaps contact the organisation's National Office to discuss what is required of a reporting entity under the new legislative regime.

Alternatively, I have included for your assistance financial documents that I filed having determined that, by and large, they complied with the reporting entities' obligations. Given the relative newness of the current regime I am reluctant to nominate these accounts as model accounts but I do think they meet the key requirements.

I suggest we discuss further what it is necessary for the branch to do to enable the financial documents to be filed after you have had the opportunity to read the enclosed documents. I can understand the branch's reluctance to recommit to the entire process again. Without pre-empting the outcome of that discussion, it is my view that, as a minimum, the branch will have to prepare a operating report and circulate it to members, and then lodge it with the Registry.

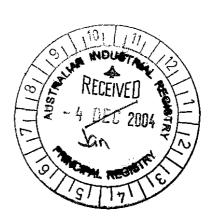
