Re: Financial documents for year ended 30 June 2003 FR 2003/455

Reference is made to the financial documents of the Southern Cross University Branch of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union for the year ended 30 June 2003 which were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 26 February 2004.

The financial documents have been filed.

The following matter is referred for assistance when preparing future financial documents; no further action is requested in respect of this:

I note that the Statement by Members of the Committee and the Auditor's Report appear to have been prepared to comply with the requirements of the *Registration and Accountability of Organisations Schedule* (the RAO Schedule).

It should be noted that while the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations have changed with the introduction of the RAO Schedule which generally came into operation on 12 May 2003, Part IX, Division 11 of the Act continues to apply in relation to a financial year of an organisation that commenced before 30 June 2003. The corresponding obligations set out in the RAO Schedule apply to each financial year of an organisation that <u>starts</u> on or after 1 July 2003.

Accordingly, financial documents for financial years commencing prior to 1 July 2003 should be prepared in accordance with Part IX, Division 11 of the Act and not the RAO Schedule.

Would you please bring this matter to your auditor's attention.

Documents on website

The Registry has created an electronic file for each registered organisation and branch which is accessible through the AIRC web site. The documents lodged have been placed on the AIRC Website at www.e-airc.gov.au/283vscu. In light of the readier access which this will give to these documents, elected office bearers may wish to consider providing their work postal address (rather than their residential address) in the list of office bearers which is required to be lodged each year under RAO sections 233(1)(b) and (2).

Electronic lodgment

I encourage you to take advantage of the electronic lodgment service provided by the Registry for future lodgments. You may register as a user and then lodge your documents via the <u>Electronic Lodgment</u> page of the AIRC website at <u>www.airc.gov.au</u>. Alternatively, you may send an email with the documents attached to: <u>RIATeam3@air.gov.au</u>. Please note that the Rules of the Commission allow for electronic signatures to be used, other than for statutory declarations (see subrule 74A(1)). Where documents are lodged electronically, there will be no need to forward hard copies of the documents.



Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 June, 2003

Note 1: Statement of Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers National Tertiary Education Industry Union Southern Cross University Branch as an individual entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

a) Plant and equipment

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

b) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to National Tertiary Education Industry Union Southern Cross University Branch commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Class of Asset	Depreciation Rate %
Plant and equipment	25 %

Employee entitlements

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements have been measured at their nominal amount.

Contributions are made by National Tertiary Education Industry Union Southern Cross University Branch to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Other Disclosures

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sussection (1), (2) and (3) of section 274 which reads as follows:

- 1. a member of the organisation, or a registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation;
- 2. an organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a registrar, make the specified information available to the member or the registrar in such manner and within such time, as is prescribed;
- 3. a registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the registrar shall provide to the member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 30 June, 2003.

While the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations have changed with the introduction of the *Registration and Accountability of Organisations* Schedule (the RAO Schedule) which generally came into operation on 12 May 2003, Part IX, Division 11 of the Act continues to apply in relation to a financial year of an organisation that ends on 30 June, 2003. The corresponding obligations set out in the RAO Schedule apply to each financial year of an organisation that starts on or after 1 July 2003.

Now that the financial year for 30 June, 2003 has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.
