I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports of the University of Sunshine Coast Branch of the National Tertiary Education Industry Union for the years ended 30 June 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008. The documents were lodged in this office on 10 July 2009

The financial reports have been filed.

### You are not required to take any further action in respect of the reports lodged.

Examination of the financial reports has shown that matters requiring advice have either been corrected or repeated in relation to the Branch's financial report for year ended 30 June 2008. Accordingly, in relation to those matters, except for the following comment in relation to the financial report for the year ended 30 June 2005, I have limited my comments to the report for the year ended 30 June 2008.

I appreciate for the financial year ended 30 June 2009 it is anticipated that, in accordance with the scheme of the organisation's rules, all financial affairs will be administered by the organisation (through its national office) and accounted for accordingly. None the less I draw your attention to the following comments which, in the event the Branch was required to again prepare a financial report, it should take into account to achieve full compliance.

### Financial Report - y/e 30 June 2005

As you know the financial reports should be prepared, audited, supplied to members, presented to a meeting and lodged in this office within certain timescale requirements

I note your advice that the financial report was provided to members and presented to a general meeting of members of the Branch. I also note that the Auditor's Report, Operating Report and Committee of Management Statement are dated after the financial report was supplied to members.

### Financial Report – y/e 30 June 2008

### 1. <u>Timescale Requirements</u>

As you are aware, reporting units are required to undertake their financial reporting obligations in accordance with specified timelines. As the financial\_reports have been completed, the relevant timelines are incapable of being remedied. However it should be noted that the timelines have not changed under the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (RO Act) and the preparation and lodgment of future financial reports must occur within these timelines.

In particular, sections 253 and 254 of the RO Act require that a General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR) and an Operating Report be prepared as soon as practicable after the end of the financial year. Further, section 266 requires that the financial report be presented to a general meeting of members or a committee of management meeting within six months after the end of the financial year. In the absence of an extension of time for holding a general meeting [see section 265(5)] the latest possible date of lodgment with Fair Work Australia is six months and 14 days after the end of the financial year. I have attached a document which sets out the timelines in diagrammatical form.

In future years the financial reports need to be prepared in sufficient time to enable presentation to a meeting within six months after the end of the financial year and lodged with Fair Work Australia no later than 14 days after that meeting.

### 2. Operating Report

### (a) <u>Membership of Committee of Management</u>

The operating report contained a list of office holders as at the end of the financial year. Please note the operating report is required to contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position – refer to regulation 159(c) *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009.* 

### (b) Dating of Report

I note the operating report is dated 2 June 03. I assume the date should have read 2 June 2009. I have taken the date to read 2 June 2009.

### 3. References to Schedule 1B and RAO Schedule

The Designated Officer's Certificate and note 5 in the GPFR contain references to either Schedule 1B of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996 or the RAO Schedule*. Designated Officer's Certificates prepared after 1 July 2009 should to refer to the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*.

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### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2005

### NOTE 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers the National Tertiary Education Union Sunshine Coast University Branch as an individual entity. The National Tertiary Education Union Sunshine Coast University Branch is a union operating in Queensland under the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting polices adopted by the company in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

### (a) Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

### (b) Revenue

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon delivery of the service to the members. Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial asset.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of Goods and Services Tax (GST).

### (c) Income Tax

Income of unions is exempt from income tax due to the provisions of Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (as amended).

### (d) Comparative Figures

Where necessary, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with the changes in the presentation in the current year.

### (e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

#### Manner of Resignation - s254 (2)(c)

Members may resign from the organisation in accordance with Rule 11 (resignation from Membership, which reads as follows

- 11.1 A member may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to the member's Division Secretary or Branch Secretary provided that:
  - (a) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Division Secretary he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the appropriate Branch Secretary;
  - (b) Where a written notice of resignation is received by a Branch Secretary he or she shall as soon as practicable forward a copy of the notice of resignation to the relevant Division Secretary.
- 11.2 A notice of resignation from membership takes effect:
  - (a) where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the Union
    - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union; or
    - (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member;

whichever is later; or

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- (b) in any other case:
  - (i) at the end of two weeks, or if permitted by law three months after the notice is received by the Union; or
  - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- 11.3 Any dues payable but not paid by a former member in relation to a period before the member's resignation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Union in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the Union.
- 11.4 A notice delivered to a Division Secretary or Branch Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.
- 11.5 A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule 1 of this rule.
- 11.6 A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this rule if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the Union that the resignation has been accepted.
- 11.7.1 Cessation of payment of any dues, levies and other amounts by a member does not, of itself, terminate membership of the Union.

### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the National Tertiary Education Union Sunshine Coast University Branch

### Scope

The Financial Report and the Responsibility of Committee of Management and Division Secretary.

The financial report comprises the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance, statement of cash flows, accompanying notes to the financial statements and the Certificate of Committee of Management for the National Tertiary Education Union Sunshine Coast University Branch, for the year ended 30 June 2005.

The committee of management and branch secretary are responsible for the preparation and true and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

### Audit Approach

We have conducted an independent audit in order to express an opinion to the members of the Branch. Our Audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards in order to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. The nature of an audit is influenced by factors such as the use of professional judgement, selective testing, the inherent limitations of internal control, and the availability of persuasive rather than conclusive evidence. Therefore, an audit cannot guarantee that all material misstatements have been detected.

We performed procedures to assess whether in all material respects the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996, including compliance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Branch's financial position and its performance as represented by the results of its operations and cash flows.

We formed our audit opinion on the basis of these procedures, which included:

- (a) examining, on a test basis, information to provide evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial report; and
- (b) assessing the appropriateness of the accounting policies and disclosures used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the Branch and its secretary.

### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT (Continued)

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our audit was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.

### Independence

In conducting our audit, we followed applicable independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements and the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

In our opinion the financial report of the National Tertiary Education Union Sunshine University Branch is in accordance with:

  - (iii) complying with any other requirements imposed by the Reporting Guidelines or Part 3 of Chapter 8 of Schedule 1B of the Act; and
