Rules difficult to apply/interpret:

- Rule 76(b) prohibits candidates from holding multiple offices in Stage 2 Office Bearers election but no further information is provided to resolve situation where candidates may be elected to multiple offices. It is strongly recommended that the Guild consider a Hierarchy of Office rule to clarify that candidates who are elected to higher offices are automatically withdrawn from lower offices. The AEC's Model Rules Guide have a number of options the Guild can consider to resolve the issue.

AEC Branch Returning Officers applied a 14 day cut off as defined in Stage 1 (Rule 74(g)(i)) for this election. #### Response to Post-election Report (E2017/19)

I refer to the Post Election Report issued by the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) dated 27 October 2017 regarding elections for The Pharmacy Guild of Australia (E2017/19). In this report reference has been made to a number of rules that are considered difficult to apply and/or interpret. Responses are set out below.

1. Rule 76(b) prohibits candidates from holding multiple offices in Stage 2 Office Bearers election but no further information is provided to resolve situation where candidates may be elected to multiple offices. It is strongly recommended that the Guild consider a Hierarchy of Office rule to clarify that candidates who are elected to higher offices are automatically withdrawn from lower offices. The AEC's Model Rules Guide have a number of options the Guild can consider to resolve the issue.

The Guild agrees that its registered rules should include a Hierarchy of Office rule so that candidates who are elected to higher offices are automatically withdrawn from lower offices. The Guild therefore proposes to amend its registered rules to incorporate such a process.

2. PGA's rules are silent on the cut-off date for the close of rolls for Stage 2 of the election. AEC Branch Returning Officers applied a 14 day cut off as defined in Stage 1 (Rule 74(g)(i)) for this election. It is strongly recommended that the Guild add a close of rolls date for Stage 2 election which is a direct election.

The Guild notes that Rule 26(ii) of its registered rules indicates that the rolls for eligible voters for Guild elections shall close 14 days prior to the day on which nominations for elections open. The Guild is therefore of the opinion that this general rule applies to Stage 2 elections and as such, no action is required.

# Organisation must respond to the post-election report of the Australian Electoral Commission: E2017/19

On 27/10/2017 the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) received a post election report from the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) for election E2017/19 dated 27/10/2017. The AEC will have also provided the report to the organisation under section 197 of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act).

The report identifies rules that were difficult to interpret or apply, in particular rules 76 (b) and 74 (g)(i). This letter serves as a reminder of the obligations imposed on the organisation or branch as a consequence of the AEC's report. If a response has already been sent to the AEC and made available to all members please disregard this letter.

#### A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regs 141(4) and (5)).

#### A written response must be provided to the AEC

A written response must be provided to the AEC within 30 days of receipt of the report. The organisation's response must include whether the organisation or branch intends to take action and if so what action the organisation or branch intends to take (s198(2)).

#### Extract of report must be made available to members

The organisation or branch must make the section of the report relating to the difficult rules available to its members (s198(3)). This extract from the report must be made available to the members before or at the same time as the organisation's response is made available to members.

#### Written response must be made available to members

A copy of the organisation's response to the AEC must be made available to members either:

- within 30 days after the response is given to the AEC, or
- published in the next edition of the organisation or branch journal (s198(5))

Subsection 198(6) and regulation 142 prescribe ways in which the relevant extract and the copy of the response can be made available to members. These do not limit the ways in which they can be made available to members. The organisation will comply if it does all of the following:-

- publish the report extract and the copy of the response in the next edition of the organisation or branch's journal; and
- •
- within 30 days of giving the response to the AEC:
  - lodges with the ROC a copy of the relevant extract and response, together with a declaration that a copy will be provided to any member who so requests; and
  - give notice in the next edition of the organisation or branch's journal, or an appropriate newspaper, that a copy of the relevant extract and response are available on request to each member free of charge; and
- publish the relevant extract on the website within 14 days after receiving the report, and publish the response on the website within 14 days of giving the response to the AEC (reg 142(2)).

#### Penalties may apply

If the organisation or branch does not:

- respond to the AEC within 30 days,
- make the extract of the report relating to the rules available to members no later than the organisation's response is made available to members, or
- make the organisation's response available to members within 30 days or in the next edition of the journal,

the organisation may face penalties under the RO Act. Each requirement listed above is a civil penalty provision that may result in fines for the organisation

#### If the organisation or branch decides to alter its rules in response to the AEC's report

If the organisation or branch decides to alter its rules in response to the AEC's report, the ROC is NOT able to provide advice and assistance regarding draft alterations or the processes required to make the alterations. Rule alterations remain a function of the Fair Work Commission.

# Irregularities

Details of written allegations of irregularities, and Rule 6 A – entitlement of Honorary Life Members (HLMs) to vote in ballots was action taken by AEC: contended by the AEC and PGA. The AEC's investigated a potential irregularity in the conduct of the election for Stage 1 -Branch Committee Members due to a certain class of HLMs being wrongfully excluded from the list. Only in NSW were the number of HLMS more than the margin of votes which could have potentially affected the result (which was already declared). The Guild submitted to the AEC the decision in Carter re: Federated Clerks Union of Australia, Victoria Branch (No2) (1989) 32 IR 30 for consideration. The AEC accepted that the decision in the above matter raised sufficient doubt and as presently information the Electoral Commissioner has no obligation to apply under subsection 2002 (2) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisation) Act 2009 for an inquiry into the Stage 1 election. The AEC extended the deadline for the return of ballots and to issue ballot papers to the overlooked HLMs in Stage 2 of the elections (which was underway at the time). Other irregularities identified, and action taken: Nil

# Other Matters

- 1. The Guild required candidates to agree and sign to a Code of Conduct, which is outside the rules of the Guild. The rules should contain any requirements to determine eligibility and validity of nomination, without relying on 'outside' instructions.
- 2. The Guild should not offer fax stream services at cost to candidates in future elections. This service has the potential to create an irregularity in the election, particularly if Branches receive more requests than expected and are unable to cope.
- 3. Rule 76(j) requires that votes cast by members not financial on day of the count to be set aside. For Stage 2 ballot this rule was applied. The Guild supplied a list of members who had become unfinancial. This is impractical as the counting of votes cannot begin till the list is received.

#### Australian Electoral Commission

- 4. Rule 74 (h) (ii) allows the RO to recall nominations for unfilled positions in stage one on the branch committee if insufficient nominations are received. The Guild must consider this when submitted the Prescribed Information to the Registered Organisation Commission (ROC) and when scheduling their state and national conferences. The ACT and TAS Branches were not able to recall nominations as the National Council was not in a position to delay subsequent election stages and conferences.
- 3. Delete from Rule 74 (g) (ii) "Such notice shall include a statement that a nomination paper will be sent upon request ... Nomination papers shall be in accordance with Form 6." These 2 sentences are impractical and do not allow modern forms of communication. Further, Form 6 is inflexible and does not all the Returning Officer to draft a nomination form that can be easily understood by members or include further information required as part of the nomination process.
- 4. Delete from Rule 74 (g) (ii) the paragraph beginning and ending with "The Returning Officer may accept a facsimile of a nomination form … Nomination papers completed as required shall be posted or sent by facsimile to be received by the Returning Officer within the time specified." This paragraph does not allow modern methods of communication especially if the nomination period is short. It is sufficient to just state that the Returning Officer may only receive nomination forms which has been lodged in the prescribed manner before the time and date fixed by the Returning Officer, which shall not be less than 21 days prior to the date of the proposed elections.
- 5. It is recommended the PGA delete from Rule 74 (g) (iii) the following: "Such notice may be by post or facsimile" as this does not allow for modern methods of communication.

#### Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of stage 2 uncontested and contested offices for Victoria Branch [E2017/19]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

#### A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

#### Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

#### Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Pharmacy Guild of Australia, The must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
