Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of uncontested offices for Federal Branch [E2017/135]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Police Federation of Australia must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and

the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.



PRESCRIBED INFORMATION IN RESPECT OF ELECTION - S.189 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009

I am an officer of the Police Federation of Australia and am authorised to sign this statement, which is lodged in accordance with s.189 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

1. The office in respect of which the elections are required are:

The election of Federal Office holders -

- a) The election of eight (8) Federal Executive Members as per Rule 20 (a)
 (i) by and from members of the Federal Council as outlined in Rule 14;
- b) The election of Federal President, two (2) Federal Vice Presidents and Federal Treasurer as per Rule 20 (a) (ii).
- The reason for which the elections are required is that the Federal Council
 will meet in Canberra on 7th and 8th September 2017 as per resolution of
 the 2016 Council Meeting and the terms of office will expire at that
 meeting.
- 3. The electorate for the elections are:
 - a) For the Federal Executive the electorate is the Federal Council as per Rule 20 (a) (i);
 - For the Federal President, Federal Vice Presidents and Federal Treasurer the electorate is the Federal Executive as per Rule 20 (a) (ii).
- The date and time that nominations open and close are at the commencement of the afternoon session on the second day of the Council meeting as per Rule 21 (c) (i) (ie. 8th September).
- The voting system to be used in the conduct of the elections is the collegiate voting system.
