Other Matters

1. Rule 52CF.1 states that the election will be advertised by a Notice published in the Police Association Journal and in a daily newspaper circulating throughout Victoria.

The Association may consider removing the requirement to advertise in a daily newspaper and allow for the Notice to be circulated to members via cost effective electronic means (eg. e-mail, PFA website)

2. Rule 52CF.2A states that Candidates for election to the Branch Executive are entitled to lodge with their nominations a statement in support of their election not exceeding 250 words together with a photograph not exceeding 6 cm x 4 cm in size.

There were numerous candidate queries during the nomination process regarding the inclusion of HTV information (diagrams/preference instructions) with candidate statements. Recommend that the PFA clarify this issue so it is clear to candidates what is permitted or excluded under the Rules and it is also clear whether any HTV information is counted as part of the word limit or not.

Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of contested offices for Victoria Police Branch [E2017/20]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Police Federation of Australia-Victoria Police Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;
 - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and

the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.
