Re: Financial reports for year ended 30 June 2004 - FR2004/309 Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (RAO Schedule)

Thank you for the financial reports of the Australian Federal Police Association Branch (AFPA) of the Police Federation of Australia for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 15 December 2004.

I draw your attention to the following comments concerning the above reports and the financial reporting obligations under the RAO Schedule. Please note that these matters are generally advised for assistance in the future preparation of financial reports. With the exception of the comments concerning the 'Operating Report', no further action is required in respect of the subject documents.

Your attention to the following matter is requested.

Operating report

The financial documents lodged did not contain an operating report. The Committee of Management must as soon as practicable after the end of each financial year cause an operating report to be prepared in relation to the financial year - refer s254 of the RAO Schedule. The operating report must contain the following:

(a) Review of principal activities:

The report must contain a review of the reporting unit's principal activities during the financial year, the results of those activities and any significant changes in the nature of those activities during the year.

(b) Significant changes in financial affairs:

The report must give details of any significant changes in the reporting unit's financial affairs during the year.

(c) Right of members to resign:

Subsection 254(2)(c) requires the operating report to "give details" of the right of members to resign from the reporting unit under s174 of the RAO Schedule. The requirement may be met by the inclusion of a statement that a member has the right to resign and a reference to the relevant rule which makes such provision. Alternatively, the complete text of the relevant resignation rule may be reproduced in the report. It would appear in this case that Federal subrules 11(b) to (g) and rule 62 of the Branch's rules is applicable.

(d) Trustees of superannuation entities:

The report must give details (including details of the position held) of any officer or member of the reporting unit who is:

- (i) a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme; or
- (ii) a director of a company that is a trustee of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme; and

where a criterion for the officer or member being the trustee or director is that the officer or member is an officer or member of a registered organisation.

(e) Number of members and number of employees:

Subsection 254(2)(f) of the RAO Schedule and regulation 159(a) and (b) of the RAO Regulations require the operating report to contain information pertaining to the number of persons that were members, and the number of persons who were employees, of the reporting unit at the end of the financial year.

(f) Membership of Committee of Management:

The operating report is required to contain the name of each person who has been a member of the committee of management of the reporting unit at any time during the reporting period, and the period for which he or she held such a position - refer regulation 159(c) of the RAO Regulations.

You are requested to arrange for the Branch National Executive to prepare an operating report addressing the required information for lodgement in the Industrial Registry as soon as possible. The branch is obliged to also provide a copy to its members. You can, however, undertake to do this after lodging a copy of the operating report in the Industrial Registry. I have attached for your information a mock Operating Report at Attachment A.

General advice in relation to the lodged financial report

The following comments are made to assist you when you next prepare financial reports and you do not need to take any further action in respect of the financial reports already lodged, other than the matter raised above.

Committee of Management Statement

It would appear that the document lodged under the title "Statement by Members of the Commitment" and signed by two members of the reporting unit has been prepared pursuant to the former requirements of the Act in relation to the lodgement of a committee of management certificate. Under paragraph 17 of the Industrial Registrar's reporting guidelines, the committee of management statement must include declarations as to whether in the opinion of the committee of management:

- (a) the financial statements and notes comply with the Australian Accounting Standards;
- *(b) the financial statements and notes comply with the reporting guidelines of the Industrial Registrar;*
- (c) the financial statements and notes give a true and fair view of the financial performance, financial position and cash flows of the reporting unit for the financial year to which they relate;
- (d) there are reasonable grounds to believe that the reporting unit will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable; and

- (e) during the financial year to which the GPFR relates and since the end of that year:
 - *(i) meetings of the committee of management were held in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and*
 - (ii) the financial affairs of the reporting unit have been managed in accordance with the rules of the organisation including the rules of a branch concerned; and
 - *(iii) the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept and maintained in accordance with the RAO Schedule and the RAO Regulations; and*
 - (iv) where the organisation consists of 2 or more reporting units, the financial records of the reporting unit have been kept, as far as practicable, in a consistent manner to each of the other reporting units of the organisation; and
 - (v) the information sought in any request of a member of the reporting unit or a Registrar duly made under section 272 of the RAO Schedule has been furnished to the member or Registrar; and
 - (vi) there has been compliance with any order for inspection of financial records made by the Commission under section 273 of the RAO Schedule.

In addition to these requirements, the committee of management's statement must be made by resolution passed by the committee, specifying the date of the resolution and signed by a designated officer (usually the Secretary or President).

I have attached for your information a mock Committee of Management certificate at Attachment B. Could you please ensure the above declarations are contained in the Committee of Management's Statement when next lodging the financial reports of the Branch.

Accounting officer's certificate

The report titled "Accounting Officer's Certificate" appears to replicate the accounting officer's certificate previously required under former provisions of the Act. Please note that there is no requirement under the RAO Schedule to lodge an accounting officer's certificate.

General Purpose Financial Report

I draw your attention to the Notes accompanying the Financial Statements, and in particular to item 24 titled 'Information to be provided to members or Registrar'. While the correct subsections have been referred to, the wording of this requirement has changed. Could you please update this aspect in the next financial report.

Loan, Grant or Donation

I note in the Profit and Loss Statement that the item "Donations" totals \$4,032. Section 237 of Schedule 1B requires that an organisation or branch shall, as soon as practicable after the end of the financial year, lodge with the Registrar a statement showing the relevant particulars in relation to each loan, grant or donation of an amount exceeding \$1,000 made by the organisation or branch during the financial year. If any single donation exceeds \$1,000 then the branch is required to lodge the relevant particulars set out in subsection 237(6) for each such donation. Obviously, no action is required if any single donation did not exceed \$1,000.

Presentation of Financial Reports to meetings

I note that the financial reports were presented to a meeting of the National Executive of the Branch on 11 August 2004. As you know section 266 of the RAO Schedule makes provision for the methods by which a reporting entity may satisfy its obligations to present the full report to its members. The purpose of the financial reporting provisions generally is to ensure disclosure to members and, to offer those members an opportunity to raise any matter that concerns them regarding material disclosed in that information. The vehicle for members to achieve this is either at a general meeting of members or at a meeting of the committee of management. The latter option is only available if the precondition in subsection 266(3), that is the 5% rule, is satisfied. The rules of the Branch do not make such provision. Unfortunately, rules such as subrules 89(a), 105(c) and 108(a) of the AFPA would not be sufficient for this purpose as they do not invoke the statutory scheme of s266.

In these circumstances, the alternatives require the presentation of the relevant documents to a general meeting of members of the Branch or at a series of meetings at different locations.

On occasions over the past 18 months in correspondence from the Industrial Registrar, organisations and branches of organisations have been advised of issues arising from the operation of the RAO Schedule that might need attending to. I highly recommend that the branch take immediate steps to alter its rules to incorporate the 5% rule referred to above, if it intends to present future financial reports to the Branch National Executive. In the interim the branch is required to make its best endeavours to fully meet its obligations as set out in the RAO Schedule with respect to its financial reporting obligations. Manner of Resignation

Members may resign from the Association in accordance with rule 11, which reads as follows: s254(2)(c)

"A member may resign their membership by notifying the Secretary in writing, addressed and delivered to

that officer.

A notice of resignation from membership takes effect

(a) Where the member ceases to be eligible to become a member of the organization:

- (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the organisation; or
- (ii) on the day specified in the notice, which is a day not earlier than the day when the member ceases to be eligible to become a member,

whichever is later, or

- (b) in any other case:
 - (i) at the end of two weeks, after the notice is received by the organisation; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

Any dues payable but not paid by a former member of the organisation, in relation to a period before the member's resignation from the organisation took effect, may be sued for and recovered in the name of the organisation, in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the organisation.

A notice delivered to the Secretary shall be taken to have been received by the organisation when it is delivered.

A notice of resignation that has been received by the organisation is not invalid because it was not addressed and delivered to the Secretary.

A resignation from membership is valid even if it is not effected in accordance with this Rule if the member is informed in writing by or on behalf of the organisation that the resignation has been accepted."

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1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report and it has been prepared in accordance with requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. The financial report is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets and they have been prepared on an accruals basis. Cost is based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. Unless otherwise stated the accounting policies have been consistently applied. The financial report is for the entity known as Australian Federal Police Association - National Council an Association incorporated under the Workplace Relations ACT 1996, as an individual entity. The incorporated Association was incorporated in ACT, Australia.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies used by Australian Federal Police Association - National Council in the preparation of the financial report.

(a) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes the following, net of bank overdrafts, all cash on hand, at call deposits with banks or financial institutions and investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months.

(b) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability due to employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees but unpaid as at balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year and benefits arising from wages & salaries, sick leave and annual leave which will be paid after one year have been measured at the amount expected to be paid when the liability falls due, plus any associated on-costs. Other benefits payable later than one year are measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows for those benefits. Long service leave is provided for after five years of service.

(c) Plant & Equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at fair value less any accumulated depreciation, where applicable or at cost.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at either cost or at independent or directors' valuation, less any accumulated depreciation or amortisation applicable. The director's review annually the carrying amount of property, plant and equipment to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and eventual disposal. In determining the recoverable amount, the expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values.

These financial statements have been subject to audit and should be read in conjunction with the attached Audit Report.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including capitalised leased assets are depreciated on a diminishing value basis over the useful lives to the Association commencing from the time the asset is ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Costs are allocated on a first-in first-out (FIFO) basis and also include direct labour, direct materials and an appropriate amount of fixed and variable overhead expenses.

(e) Leases

Where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of a leased fixed asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the Association, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised as an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value is brought to account. Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the Association will obtain ownership of the asset, or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the lease interest expense for the period and the reduction of the lease liability.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(f) Revenue

Income from the sale of goods is recognised when the goods are delivered to customers. Interest income is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates relevant to the financial assets. Income from providing a service is recognised when the customer receives the service.

(g) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax, except :

i) Where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office, it is then recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expenses.

ii) Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included.

1. Previous Minutes- Resolved to accept the previous National Executive meeting minutes as correct

2. Approval of new AFPA APS Zones-

Moved: Bill Conroy Seconded: Jim Torr Carried: Unanimously

"That the AFPA National Executive approves the creation of three new AFPA Functional Zones. The creation of theses new Zones is required because of the integration and incorporation of the Australian Protective Service organization into the Australian Federal Police on 1 July 2004. The three new AFPA Branch Zones are to be called:

Aviation Protection Zone; Aviation Security Zone; and Protective Security Zone.

Further, that AFP employees attached to the following work areas will be assigned to the three new Zones:

AFP employees who currently hold Air Security Officer competencies and are assigned to operational duties under the Air security Officers program will be assigned to the AFPA Branch Aviation Protection Zone.

AFP employees who currently hold sworn Protective Service competencies and are assigned to operational duties at Airports will be assigned to the AFPA Branch Aviation Security Zone.

AFP employees, who currently hold sworn Protective Service competencies and are assigned to operational duties at Protective Service sites other than Airports and duties performed by Air Security Officers, will be assigned to the AFPA Branch Protective Security Zone."

3. Temporary Filling of AFP APS Zones with Appointed Delegates

Moved: Richardson Seconded: Conroy Carried: Unanimously

"That the following AFPA members be appointed National Council Delegates and hold the positions of Zone Coordinator or Zone workplace Delegate until elections are conducted in accordance with the rules of the Police Federation of Australia:

- Mr. Clayton Baldwin is appointed Zone Coordinator, Aviation Protection Zone;
- Mr. Peter Engeler is appointed Zone Coordinator, Aviation Security Zone;
- Mr. Jason Sargeant is appointed Workplace Delegate, Aviation Security Zone;
- Mr. Glen Aylot is appointed Zone Coordinator Protective Security Zone."

4. Temporary Filling of AFPA Vice President Positions

Moved: Conroy Seconded: Richardson Carried: Unanimously

"That the AFPA National Executive ratifies the appointment of Spiro Kalliris as the Branch Vice President Protective Service Operations, consistent with the resolution of the Special National Council of May 2004, until elections are conducted in accordance with the PFA Rules;

That the AFPA National Executive appoints Chris Collingwood as the Branch Vice President Specialist Operations until elections are conducted in accordance with the PFA Rules; and

That the AFPA National Executive appoints Peter Brown as the Branch Vice President International Operations until elections are conducted in accordance with the PFA Rules".

5. Approval of PFA Rule change re PFA Eligibility Rule-

Moved: Richardson Seconded: Torr Carried: Unanimously

"The Federation shall consist of an unlimited number of persons who are:-

- employees, appointees or secondees engaged by the Australian Federal Police including all persons designated Commercial; Community Operations; Federal Operations; Operational Support; and persons declared, engaged or appointed as Members, Special Members, or Officers (including, but not limited to, Police Officers; Commissioned Officers; Non Commissioned Officers; Air Security Officers; Protective Service Officers; Special Protective Service Officers; Protection Officers; and Commonwealth Law Enforcement Officers).
 - a. For the purpose of this rule the "Australian Federal Police" means the Australian Federal Police constituted under the Australian Federal Police Act 1979 and any subsequent Act that amends, repeals or otherwise replaces the Australian Federal Police Act 1979;
 - b. For the purpose of this rule "Commercial; Community Operations; Federal Operations; Operational Support" means all Australian Federal Police work structures, functional areas and roles and any subsequent work structures, functional areas and roles as amended or included from time to time.

Further, that this proposed rule change be provided to the CEO of the Police Federation of Australia for presentation at the next PFA National Executive meeting with a view to the proposed rule change being put to an immediate vote of the PFA National Council, in accordance with any requirements of the Industrial Registrar.

6. Approval of the proposed AFP and CPSU Agreement re the AFP workplace coverage:

The National President advised the National Executive that the AFPA and the PFA lodged objections to the CPSU rule change which extended CPSU coverage into the AFP. He advised that the AFP failed to lodge an objection. The National President advised that our legal advice was that if the AFP did object, that the AFPA would have a high chance of success in relation to its objection, however if the AFP failed to lodge an objection, the AIRC case would be expensive to fund and with a 50/50 chance of success.

Moved: Torr Seconded: Conroy Carried: Unanimously

"That in light of the failure of the AFP to object to the CPSU rule change, the high financial cost of objecting to the rule change, and the 50/50 chance of success; the National Executive endorse the following:

- That the proposed rule change to the PFA eligibility Rule in relation to the AFPA Branch be actioned as in the previous motion;
- That the AFPA enter into an agreement with the CPSU with a view to both organizations having joint coverage of the AFP employees performing the function of Protective Service Officers (excluding Air Security Officers and administrative staff that support Protective Service Officers who will be solely covered by the AFPA)
- That the AFPA/PFA ensure that the PFA Rule change and the agreed CPSU rule change be implemented simultaneously to avoid any objections by either party at a later date."

7. AFPA/CPSU Joint Bargaining Unit-

Moved: Torr Seconded: Conroy Carried: Unanimously

"That the National executive agree to a joint bargaining unit between the CPSU and the AFPA in relation to the Protective Service Officer roles within the AFP and authorizes the AFPA National President to finalize any such agreement and sign off on it on behalf of the AFPA".

8. International Deployment Group (IDG) Update-

The National President advised that he had raised concerns in relation to the IDG with Commissioner Keelty's Office by e-mail last week as the Commissioner was overseas.

The National President advised that he raised his concerns about the AFP's failure to consult and negotiate with the AFPA in "good faith"; the failure of the AFP to provide the Daley Report on the IDG; the failure of AFP management to respond to various letters from the AFPA; and the failure of the AFP to form the AFP Review Panel in relation to the IDG.

The National President advised that, not withstanding the above, the PFA CEO and the he had a successful meeting recently with the AFP HR and WR areas where some concerns were alleviated, with other matters still remaining outstanding. He advised that negotiations have come to a halt after the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia logged a claim in the AIRC in relation to the IDG and made public comment about the IDG.

The National President advised that the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia was not authorized by the PFA National Executive, and was in fact notified by the PFA National Executive, not to log the AFP Commissioner, Vicpol Chief Commissioner and Vicpol Police Minister in relation to the IDG. Further, that the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia was not authorized and was in fact notified by the PFA CEO, not to make adverse comment about the AFP Commissioner Mick Keelty or the Prime Minister John Howard in relation to the IDG.

The National President advised that he was raising these very serious issues with the Police Federation of Australia National Executive this date with a view to having the log withdrawn by the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia. He advised that he believed that the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia had breached the PFA Autonomy Rule and that it also did not have the legal power to lodge a dispute on behalf of the PFA. The National President advised that the chances of a successful outcome being reached for AFPA members had now been jeopardized by the actions of the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia and that it was now unlikely that the AFP Commissioner or Federal Government would entertain any further negotiations with the PFA and unfortunately the AFPA.

RESOLVED: To support the actions of the AFPA National President in taking this matter to the PFA with a view to having the log of claims lodged by the Victoria Branch of the Police Federation of Australia withdrawn as a matter of urgency. Further, that the National President be authorized to attempt to rectify the situation and attempt to reactivate genuine negotiations between the AFP and the AFPA in relation to the IDG.

The National President left the Chair and was replaced hy the CEO.

9. DNA Testing of Police Employees

Moved: Richardson Seconded: Conroy Carried: Unanimously

"That the AFPA National Executive endorses the current PFA policy in relation to DNA Testing."

10. AFP Projects in relation to Professional Standards or conditions

Moved: Conroy Seconded: Richardson Carried: Unanimously

"That the CEO Jim Torr, be the AFPA representative on the following joint working groups: - the Fisher review; DNA Testing; Fitness standards; and any other relevant reviews relating to professional standards or professional equipment standards. Further, that he continues to assist the review of individual professional standard matters on behalf of the AFPA and the individual members concerned".

11. AFP Time Recording System

Bill Conroy advised that he had been participating as the AFPA representative on the review of the AFP Time Recording System and raised concerns that it was not possible to make the appropriate changes without knowing the results of the AIRC Board of Reference in relation to the Commercial Composite Hours Dispute and the Federal Operations Composite Hours Dispute. He advised that not withstanding that fact, the AFP was "full steam ahead" in relation to making the changes to the system. He advised that the CEO should take over as the AFPA representative on the project due to his (Bill Conroy) upcoming retirement from the AFP.

12. Finances

The AFPA National President tabled the audited financial report of 2003/4. The National President briefed the National Executive on the audited report of 2003/4 and the surplus achieved once again by this National Executive and the National Office Management Team. The National President briefed the National Executive on the proposed Budget to be presented at National Council meeting commencing on 31 August 2004.

Moved: Richardson Seconded: Conroy Carried: Unanimously

"That the AFPA financial report of 2003/4 be accepted as a true and accurate reflection of the finances of the AFPA Branch of the Police Federation of Australia as at 30 June 2004 and that the report be tabled at the AFPA National Council for its consideration."

13. National Police Memorial

Moved: Richardson Seconded: Conroy Carried: Unanimously

"That the AFPA strongly opposes the recommendation "that the PFA endorses the key component of the Commemorative Intent of the Memorial to be to focus on police officers who have been killed/died on duty" as it discriminates against other police employees who may be killed or die on duty as a direct or indirect result of an operational activity or as a direct or indirect result of a criminal act."

14. Other Business- AFPA Office Holders

Moved: Hunt-Sharman Seconded: Richardson Carried: Unanimously

"That the AFPA National Executive notes and welcomes the return of the Vice President Community Operations, Mr. Dave Boston to his appointed position. The National Executive wishes to thank the Acting Vice President Mr. Dennis Gellatly, for the significant contribution that he has made during the period of Mr. Boston's absence."

The National President then noted that this National Executive meeting was the last meeting prior to the National Council 2004 and reiterated the intended retirement of the Commercial Vice President Bill Conroy. He also advised that at the completion of the term of office for the Federal Vice President Stephen Richardson and Community Operations Vice President David Boston that both gentlemen intended not to renominate for another term of office due to changes in personal circumstances.

The National President requested that it be recorded in the minutes that he believed that this outgoing National Executive team had, through its integrity, diligence and genuine commitment to the AFPA membership, ensured a strong future for the AFPA.

This National President advised that the National Executive team over the last couple of terms has provided the legacy of a record membership base; a record equity ratio; and record member services such as the \$100,000 Life Assurance coverage. He advised that the National Executive through excellent financial management has been able to financially afford the doubling of national office staff numbers with the employment of three Industrial Officers, one Legal Officer, a Marketing Manager, Office Manager and three administrative support staff now available to assist AFPA members. This was an excellent achievement considering the poor financial state of the AFPA in 1996.

This amazing result could not have been achieved without the professional AFPA officials who have volunteered their service to the AFPA membership over these last two terms of office.

The National President advised that he would be nominating for a further full term and that the CEO was also nominating for a full term at the upcoming election on 31 August 2004.
