Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of contested offices for Northern Territory Branch [E2017/6]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the Police Federation of Australia-Northern Territory Police Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;

- the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and
- the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

DECISION

Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 s.189—Arrangement for conduct of an election

Police Federation of Australia (E2017/6)

MR ENRIGHT

MELBOURNE, 21 FEBRUARY 2017

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 27 January 2017 the Northern Territory Police Branch (the Branch) of the Police Federation of Australia lodged with the Fair Work Commission the prescribed information in relation to an election for the following offices:

Vice President Branch Executive Members (5)

- [2] The Branch did not lodge the prescribed information before the prescribed day as required by regulation 138(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009* (the Regulations). The prescribed information should have been lodged by 1 January 2017.
- [3] In its previous election (E2016/54), the Branch lodged the relevant prescribed information outside the time prescribed by regulation 138(3) of the Regulations although, having considered the reasons for late lodgement on that occasion, I allowed a later day for lodgement. Taking into account the circumstances of this matter, the Branch has for each of its two most recent requests for the conduct of an election failed to lodge the prescribed information in a timely way. The failure by the Branch in E2016/54 potentially exposed it to a civil penalty provision and the failure on this occasion has converted that potential into a reality. In other words, the Branch has contravened its statutory obligations and is now liable for a civil penalty provision pursuant to section 189(2) of the Act.
- [4] In correspondence dated 16 February 2017, Mr Rob Perry, the Industrial and Legal Officer of the Branch, stated that the delay was due to a misconception as to the relevant legislative requirements. I note that Mr Perry has undertaken to review the Branch's governance processes with respect to its statutory obligations to ensure that such delays are not repeated.
- [5] I am not satisfied that the above reason is a sufficient ground to justify the failure to comply with a statutory obligation. Having regard to the normal and reasonable expectation that registered organisations take steps to ensure they comply with the time-frame requirements set out not only in the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the Act) but also in instruments or references pertaining to their own governance formulated by the organisations themselves, I decline on this occasion to allow, under section 189(2) of the Act,

a later day for lodgement. As I have indicated above, the failure to lodge prescribed information before the prescribed day therefore renders the organisation liable for a civil penalty provision pursuant to section 189(2) of the Act.

- [6] The refusal of an extension of time under section 189(2) of the Act does not, however, affect a determination of an election notification matter for the purposes of section 189(3) of the Act.
- [7] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.
