#### Offices/Positions

### Reasons for election:

Election for offices and positions marked A is required as the terms of office are due to expire in the normal course of events under the rules of the organisation.

#### Elected by:

The electorate for the direct voting system is the whole of the Branch membership.

### Nominations open:

 For offices to be elected by direct voting system – to be determined by the Returning Officer of the Australian Electoral Commission.

### Nominations close:

For offices to be elected by direct voting system - 12 noon, Friday 17 June 2011.

### Cut off date for roll:

In all cases - 7 days prior to the opening date for nominations - rule 22(g).

### Notes:

The above sample Notice and Statement would satisfy each of the particulars required under s189(1) and the relevant regulations.

The Notice and Statement are required to be lodged at least 2 months before the first day of nominations as set out in the rules of the organisation – the General Manager of FWA may allow for a later day - see subsection 189(2) and regulations.

The requirement to lodge election information under s189(2) is a civil penalty provision – see s305.
