

My name is Michael James Dean. I am the President (and also Chief Executive Officer) of the Police Federation of Australia – Western Australia Police Branch and am authorised under the Rules to act on behalf of the Branch.

In consideration of Section 271 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, I apply for a Certificate to exempt the Branch from the requirements of the Act relating to financial matters occurring in the year ended June 30 2004. (please see Branch Rules, Part CA of the Police Federation of Australia Rules).

In support of this application I say:

- 1. The Branch does not trade or carry out financial transactions of any kind.
- 2. The Branch does not have an account with a bank or any other financial institution, nor does it have custody of any real property or moneys.
- 3. The Branch has no reason to keep accounting records
- 4. The reason the Branch does not trade or carry out financial transactions of any kind is because of the relationship between the Branch and the Western Australian Police Union of Workers (WAPU).
- 5. The Western Australian Police Union of Workers was registered in the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission (the then Court of Arbitration of Western Australia) in 1926.
- 6. The Police Federation of Australia and its Branches were formed on December 31, 1997.

- 7. On November 25, 2003, the Police Federation of Australia lodged in the Industrial Registry particulars of alterations to rule 14.- Federal Council and Rule 34.- Branches, and the insertion of Part CA being a new set of rules of the Western Australia Police Branch. The alterations and insertion was certified under subsection 159(1) of Schedule B of the Act by the Deputy Industrial under date 3 February 2004.
- 8. Pursuant to subsection 189 (1) of Schedule B of the Act, arrangements for the conduct of elections for offices of the Western Australia Police Branch were implemented. Nominations for Part 1 of the elections were accepted and at the close of nominations on Friday April 2, 2004 as the nominations accepted did not exceed the number of offices to be filled, the candidates were declared elected by the Returning Officer of the Australian Electoral Commission. The part 2 election meeting for election of Branch Executive positions was held on April 7, 2004 and as the nominations accepted did not exceed the number of offices to be filled, the candidates were declared elected by the Returning Officer.
- 9. Since inception of the Branch, the WAPU has undertaken to carry out financial transactions including the collection of membership fees, the payment of accounts for expenses incurred in carrying out regular business, operated a bank account, owned and/or leased property and office equipment, employed and paid salaries of employees to permit the business of the Branch to be conducted.
- 10. The WAPU has complied with the legislative requirements of the Industrial Relations Act 1979.
- 11. Eligibility for membership of the Branch and the WAPU is identical and indistinguishable and no member of the Branch is ineligible to be a member of the WAPU. No prospective member has applied to be a member of the Branch and not also a member of the WAPU.
- 12. The only financial concern of the Branch relates to the payment of affiliation fees to the Federal Fund (Rule 7. Subscriptions). This is paid by the WAPU.
- 13. The WAPU has begun the process of becoming a State Branch of the PFA in accordance with section 71 of the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* and amending the Rules of the WAPU to reflect this arrangement. This is in accordance with the directions given by the WAPU's Annual Conference, being the supreme authority, held June 27 29, 2004.
- 14. This does not infer the Branch does not function in a manner assumed by the Rules of the Police Federation of Australia. The Branch is fully operative in carrying out the objects of the Federation as prescribed in Rule 4.
