Officer and related party disclosure statement under 293J [ORP Statement] for 30 June 2018 [ORP2018/1405]

I acknowledge receipt by the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) on 25 July 2018 of your branch's ORP Statement which provides information required to be lodged under subsection 293J of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act).

Thank you for providing your ORP Statement.

The ORP Statement has been filed and no further action is required. ORP Statements are publicly available on the website through the <u>List of Registered Organisations</u>.

The ROC understands that not all organisations and branches have five paid officers, provide non-cash benefits or make related-party payments. Section 293J of the RO Act does not require an organisation or branch to explicitly state that certain items (e.g. non-cash benefits) were 'nil'. However it is the view of the ROC that such statements would provide greater clarity and transparency for members. Such statements reassure the ROC and the organisation's members that the organisation or branch has turned its attention to the question of officers' relevant remuneration, their non-cash benefits and payments to related parties.

Time frames

Section 293J requires that the ORP Statement is provided to members and a copy lodged with the ROC within 6 months of the end of the branch's financial year.

Material Personal Interests

ORP Statements do not include information about disclosures of material personal interests. Members of organisations can access these disclosures on request. Details of these disclosures must be provided within 28 days to any member who requests them in writing.
