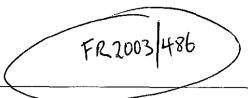

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2003

#### 1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers the Shop, Distributive and Allied Employees' Association New South Wales Branch as an individual entity. The Shop, Distributive and Allied Employees' Association New South Wales Branch is a trade union registered pursuant to the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations or non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as Trade Unions are exempt from income tax under the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936, as amended.

#### (b) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

#### (c) Revenue

Members' contributions are accounted for on the accruals basis to the extent that contributions received or receivable subsequent to 30 June 2003 but which relate to the period then ended, have been brought to account as income, where as members' contributions received prior to 30 June 2003 but which relate to the period subsequent to that date, have been carried forward.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

#### Scope

We have audited the financial statements of Shop, Distributive and Allied Employees' Association New South Wales Branch for the financial year ended 30 June 2003 as set out on pages 2 to 11. The Committee of Management are responsible for the financial report.
