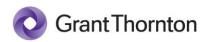
#### **Auditor's Responsibility**

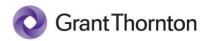

Also include a statement to provide the date the committee of management passed a resolution that a concise report can be provided to members as required by s.265(2) RO Act.
- Lodge with Fair Work Australia the two new auditor's report and the new designated officer's certificate.

### Financial report for year ended 31 December 2011 - FR2011/2870 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 - (RO Act)

I acknowledge receipt of the full report and concise report for year ended 31 December 2011 for the National Office of the Transport Workers' Union of Australia. The documents were lodged with Fair Work Australia (FWA) on 28 May 2012.

I acknowledge that the matters which were identified as non-compliant issues in the previous year's financial report were rectified in this year's financial report. Thank you.

However, there were several different issues identified in the full and concise reports for the year ended 31 December 2011. In order to file the full and concise reports I will require further information to be lodged with FWA.

### 1) Resolution by committee of management permitting a concise report to be provided to members

Subsection 265(2) RO Act provides that a concise report *may only* be provided if a resolution to provide a concise report to members is passed by the committee of management. I am unable to find such a statement in the documents lodged.

If such a statement exists in the lodged documents please advise me where the statement regarding the resolution is contained. If no such statement is in the documents and a resolution was passed please provide the relevant information that identifies the relevant body (such as National Committee of Management or the National Council) that passed the resolution and the date the resolution was passed. This statement should be signed by an officer.

Generally, this resolution may be provided on the front page of the concise report, in the designated officer's certificate or in the committee of management statement.

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#### 2) Auditor's report pre-dates the committee of management statement

The auditor is required to provide an auditor's opinion on the general purpose financial report (s.257(5) RO Act). The general purpose financial report is defined to include, amongst other documents, the committee of management statement (s.253(2)(c) RO Act).

In the present circumstances the auditor's report sets out the scope of the audit to include the committee of management statement. However, the auditor's report was signed on 10 April 2012 and the committee of management statement and the resolutions contained therein were not passed until 17 May 2012. Therefore, it is doubtful the committee of management statement was properly audited.

To rectify these circumstances, the auditor is required to audit the committee of management statement. This could be evidenced by providing another/amended auditor's report where the auditor's report is signed off on a date subsequent to the committee of management statement. This newly dated auditor's report must then be provided to members and lodged with Fair Work Australia. The details of when the newly dated auditor's report is provided to members should be provided to FWA in an amended designated officer's certificate signed by an officer.

I also noted that the lodged designated officer's certificate was signed and lodged with FWA on 28 May 2012 but the certificate stated that the concise report was provided to members on 29 May, a day after the certificate was certified and lodged. Please ensure a designated officer's certificate only certifies events that have already occurred.

Accordingly, I require the following documents be lodged with FWA by 25 July 2012:

- Statement regarding resolution by committee of management to provide concise report to members (this can be added to the designated officer's certificate);
- Newly dated auditor's report; and
- Amended designated officer's certificate providing information currently in the certificate dated 28 May and the date the newly dated auditor's report was provided to members.

#### DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Information on the Transport Workers' Union of Australia National Council Concise Financial Report:

The financial statements and disclosures in the concise financial report have been derived from the 2011 financial report of the Transport Workers' Union of Australia National Council.

The concise report cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the entity as the full financial report.

A copy of the full financial report and auditors report can be sent to any member, free of charge, upon request.

This discussion and analysis is provided to assist members in understanding the concise report. The discussion and analysis is based on Transport Workers' Union of Australia National Council 2011 financial report.

#### Statement of Comprehensive Income and Statement of Financial Position:

The Deficit for the year 2011 year was \$1,123,619. The decrease is explained by the National Council's decision to intensify its 'Safe Rates' campaign ahead of the introduction of major National Legislation. Its national bargaining at major transport operations and also meeting the challenges of the Qantas dispute

Total Income increased by \$831,383 from \$3,245,128 (2010) to \$4,076,511 (2011). In this regard, sustentation fees increased by \$81,266, reimbursement of the Legal fees increased by \$486,807 (2010: Nil) and the National Organising Fund increased by \$312,513 (2010: Nil). No other significant changes occurred in income. Expenditure increased by \$1,436,119 from \$3,764,011 (2010) to \$5,200,130 (2011). In this regard, Rent increased by \$131,547, Legal & Professional fee increased by \$630,694 and Employee Benefits expenses increased by \$691,502, while Reimbursement to Branches decreased by \$213,484. The increase can be explained by employees and associated costs created by the employment of new and additional staff to work on the Union's 'Safe Rates' campaign, National bargaining and Qantas dispute. An additional 10,977 hours worked or 35% increase, falling just below the budgeted amount. It also includes additional space and general needs associated with their employment

The net assets of the National Council have decreased by \$1,298,223 due to the deficit for the year of \$1,123,619 and a decrease in the value of available-for-sale financial assets of \$174,604 for the year that has been debited to the available-for-sale investment Reserve.

#### Statement of Cash Flows:

The cash flow of National Council has been managed to ensure liabilities are met when they fall due. The decrease of \$1,526,917 in net cash held reflects the excess of cash payments over cash receipts for the year. Cash at the end of year amounted to \$6,333,\$\text{\$1}\$.

- 1. The principal activity of National Council during the financial year was that of governing body of the Transport Workers' Union of Australia. No significant changes in the nature of that activity occurred during the year.
- 2. There were no significant changes to National Council's financial affairs during the year.
- 3. National Council's principal activity resulted in a deficit for the year of \$1,123,619.
- 4. In accordance with Section 174(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 a member of an organisation may resign from membership by written notice addressed and delivered to a person designated for the purpose in the rules of the organisation or a branch of the organisation.
- 5. The following officers of the Transport Workers Union of Australia, National Council are trustees of the TWU Superannuation fund: Mr Anthony Sheldon and Mr Michael Kaine.
- 6. The number of members of the Transport Workers Union of Australia at 31 December 2011 was 87,019.
- 7. The number of persons who were employees of National Council on 31 December 2011 was 20, where the number of employees includes both full-time employees and part-time employees measured on a full-time equivalent basis.

### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

#### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, and the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The financial statements were authorised for issue in accordance with a resolution of the committee of management on the 10 April 2012

The committee of management have determined that Transport Workers' Union of Australia National Council is permitted to apply the Tier 2 reporting requirements (Australian Accounting Standards- Reduced Disclosure Requirements) as set out in AASB 1053 Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards because it is a not-for-profit sector entity that does not have public accountability. As such, the committee of management have early adopted AASB 2010 – 2 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards arising from Reduced Disclosure Requirements from 1 January 2011. These Accounting Standards are not required to be applied until annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 July 2013. The early adoption of AASB 2010-2 has resulted in significantly reduced disclosures in respect of related parties and financial instruments. There was no other impact on the current or prior year financial statements.

#### BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial report is for the National Council of the Transport Workers' Union of Australia and in accordance with the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 the National Council is a reporting unit. The Transport Workers' Union of Australia is an organisation registered under the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009. The National Council is a reporting unit of the registered organisation. In accordance with the Act the Union is a body corporate and has perpetual succession. By virtue of this method of incorporation, the Union and the National Council are not subject to the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical costs, except for available-for-sale financial assets that have been measured at fair value. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the National Council in the preparation of the financial report.

#### (a) Revenue

Income and Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis

#### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

#### (b) Income Tax

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the Union is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50 - 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any impairment in value.

#### Depreciation

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives to the Union commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Depreciation Rate

Office Furniture and Equipment

5.00 - 20.00%

Motor Vehicles

15%

The assets residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance date.

The gain or loss on disposal of all fixed assets is determined as the difference between the carrying amount of the asset at the time of disposal and the proceeds of disposal, and is included in the statement of comprehensive income in the year of disposal.

#### (d) Impairment

The carrying amounts of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised in the income statement for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of the asset's fair value less cost to sell and value in use. For the purpose of assessing value in use, this represents depreciated current replacement cost, as the Union is a not-for-profit organisation.

#### (e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Union's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs.

### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

#### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

#### (e) Employee Benefits (cont'd)

Other employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. In the case of Long Service Leave this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting future cash flows.

Contributions are made by the Union to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### (f) Investments

All investments and other financial assets are initially stated at cost, being the fair value of consideration given plus acquisition costs. Purchases and sales of investments are recognised on trade date, which is the date on which the entity commits to purchase, or sell the asset. Accounting policies for each category of investments and other financial assets subsequent to initial recognition are set out below.

#### Available-for-sale financial assets

Investments which are classified as available for sale are measured at fair value. Unrealised gains or losses on these investments are recognised directly to equity in the Available-for-Sale Investments Reserve until the investment is sold or until the investment is determined to be impaired, at which time the cumulative gain or loss previously reported for that asset is included in the statement of comprehensive income.

#### (g) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables on the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

#### (h) Accounting Standards Issued But Not Yet Effective

There have been no accounting standards issued which will impact the financial report in future periods and which are not yet effective.

#### 2. ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

#### (a) Critical accounting estimates and assumptions

The Union makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates by definition seldom equal the related actual results. There are no estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

#### (b) Critical judgments in applying the Union's accounting principles

There are no critical judgements that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities.

#### 21. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

A claim for damages and penalties has been brought against the union by Qantas. The order of damages and related interest in accordance with the Federal Court order is \$839,090. Instructions have been given to the solicitor to lodge an appeal in the High Court by the National Council. The amount of \$839,090 has been deposited to a joint trust account held by the solicitor of both parties pending the outcome of the appeal which is likely to be determined in late 2012. Regardless of the result, the National Council will recognise the loss of interest resulting from the bridging payment of the damages claim. The principal is to be proportioned amongst the branches. An amount of \$21,958 has been provided for as the interest burden at 31 December 2011.
