Principal Activities

The principal activities of the Union during the financial year were the provision of industrial, professional and managerial services to the members consistent with the objects and rules of the Union and in particular, protecting and improving the interests of members.

Results of Principal Activities

The Union's principal activities resulted in a surplus for the financial year of \$1,342,138 (2004: \$1,366,573).

There were no significant changes in the nature of the Union's principal activities of the Union during the financial year.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31 December 2005

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The financial report covers Transport Workers' Union of Australia (QLD Branch) as an individual reporting unit under the Act. Transport Workers' Union of Australia (QLD Branch) is a union of Employees registered under the Workplace Relations Act 1996. The reporting unit is a branch of the Transport Workers Union of Australia.

Apart from Membership Revenue which is reported on a cash basis, the financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income tax

The entity is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

a) Property

Freehold land is measured at cost. Buildings are measured at cost less depreciation.

b) Plant and equipment

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

c) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to Transport Workers' Union of Australia (QLD Branch) commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Investments

Units in managed funds held as current assets are valued at those funds' market value at each balance date. The gains or losses, whether realised or unrealised, are included in profit from ordinary activities.

The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts.

Employee entitlements

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash out flows to be made for those entitlements.

Contributions are made by Transport Workers' Union of Australia (QLD Branch) to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Transport Workers' Union of Australia (QLD Branch) does not record, as an asset or a liability, the difference between the employer established defined benefit superannuation plan's accrued benefits and the net market value of the plans assets.

Transport Workers' Union of Australia (QLD Branch) operates an ownership-based remuneration scheme, details of which are provided in the Notes to Accounts. Profits or losses incurred by employees, being the difference between the market value and the par value of the shares acquired, are not recorded as remuneration paid to employees.

Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in all call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.

Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking in to account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

RE: Financial Return for year ending 31 December 2005(FR 2005/661)

I have received your letter dated 5 May 2006 accompanied by the financial return of the Queensland Branch of the TWU for the year ended 31 December 2005. The documents were lodged in the Registry on 8 May 2006.

Whilst the documents have been filed, there are a number of matters that require attention prior to the lodgement of your Branch's next financial return to ensure the filing of it is not delayed.

1. Secretary's Certificate.

- It fails to clarify whether the reports presented to "a meeting" on 23 February 2006 and to members in the Union's journal were full or concise reports. From observation the former comprised a full report and from the documentation attached it is clear that the latter was a concise report.
- By not using the term "full report" and instead listing "copies of the auditor's report, accounts and statements", it is not clear as to whether the Operating Report formed part of the documentation being confirmed as copies of those provided to members and presented to the Committee of Management meeting.
- As was pointed out in our letter to your Organisation of 2 June 2005, your certificate refers to sections 280(1) and 279(6) of the Act, which have been superseded by schedule 1 of the Act and now should read sections 268 and 266 respectively.
- Attached is a "Certificate of Secretary or other Authorised Officer" pro forma document which we suggest you use next year.

Section 272(5) Notification

The Act requires that this notification regarding the entitlement for both members of a reporting unit and a Registrar to be provided with information upon request be included in both a general purpose financial report prepared under section 253 and a concise report prepared under section 265. You have included it in the concise report but not in the full report. Whilst it is no doubt likely that it would come to the attention of members via the concise report, the Act stipulates that it must also form part of the general purpose financial report which in turn is the cornerstone of the full report. Please ensure that next year it is in both reports.

Profit and Loss Statement (Statement of Financial Performance)

Item 11(b) of the Industrial Registrar's Reporting Guidelines requires that where a branch of an organisation must pay a proportion of its membership levies as a financial contribution towards another reporting unit of the organisation, both the amount and the name(s) of the recipient reporting units must be disclosed in either the profit and loss statement or in the notes to the financial statements. You have disclosed the amount of "sustentation fees" paid but not to whom it was given. Again, whilst anyone reading the report is likely to

conclude that it would have been paid to your Federal Office, it is a mandatory obligation to provide this detail. Please provide the additional information as to whom the payment was made to next year.

Concise Report

(a) The Profit and Loss Statement, Balance Sheet and Statement of Cash Flows were provided in an abbreviated format in the concise report rather than being presented "as in the full report except for the omission of cross-references to notes" as is required by RAO Regulation 161(a). In regards to the Balance Sheet (Statement of Financial Position), it not only is slightly abbreviated but the format has also been altered.

It may be the case that some of the financial information provided could have formed part of the Notes To The Financial Statements thereby reducing the detail required to be duplicated in the concise report.

It is acknowledged that you certainly have complied with the spirit of the legislation in regards to the provision of a concise report, but nevertheless please ensure that if you again decide to issue a concise report next year, that the financial statements in the concise report mirror those in the full report "except for the omission of cross-references to notes".

- (b) <u>The Operating Report</u> was similarly abbreviated in the concise report. Section 265(3)(b) provides that a component of the concise report is "the operating report for the year". Please ensure that next year the full operating report is incorporated in the concise report.
- (c) <u>Discussion and Analysis</u> RAO Regulation 161(c) requires for the inclusion in the concise report of "discussion and analysis of the principal factors affecting the financial performance, financial position and financial and investing activities of the reporting unit to assist the understanding of members.." This information has not been provided in the concise report. Please ensure that it is provided next year.
