Financial report for year ended 31 December 2010 - FR2010/2866 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 - (RO Act)

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report for year ended 31 December 2010 for the South Australia/Northern Territory Branch of the Transport Workers' Union of Australia. The document was lodged with Fair Work Australia on 18 April 2011.

The financial report has been filed.

Thank you for implementing the changes requested in our letter to Mr Gallacher dated 19 July 2010 to this year's financial report. There are some other minor matters which I ask you to note when you prepare the future financial reports for your reporting unit.

1. Designated officer's certificate certifying to future events

The certificate signed on 4 April 2011 certified that the full report was to be provided to members on 29 April 2011.

Please ensure the designated officer's certificate only certifies events that have already occurred. I understand that the committee of management meeting was held on 23 March 2011 and the certificate was executed on 4 April 2011 to facilitate the lodgement of the full report to FWA within 14 days of the committee of management meeting. However, please in future try to co-ordinate the events so that the certificate is certifying events that have occurred.

2. General Purpose Financial Report (GPFR) - Statement of changes in equity

The lodged GPFR did not contain a Statement of Changes in Equity. The requirement to include a Statement of Changes in Equity in the GPFR is found in subsection 253(2)(a)(iv) of the RO Act. This subsection states that the financial statements of the GPFR consists of, inter alia, "any other statements required by the Australian Accounting Standards" and AASB101(10) requires the Statement of Changes in Equity to form part of the complete set of financial statements.

3. Operating Report - Significant changes in financial affairs

Subsection 254(2)(b) of the RO Act requires the reporting unit to give details of any *significant* changes in their financial affairs during the year, this is a separate requirement to s.254(2)(a) which requires the reporting unit to review their principle activities by giving details of any significant changes to the nature of those activities.

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The lodged operating report provided information under s254(2)(a) but not s254(2)(b), please ensure the operating report in future address whether there are any significant changes in the financial affairs, and if so, provide the necessary details.

4. Related party disclosures - Separate disclosure of employee benefits to office holders and employee benefits to employees other than office holders

If the office holders of the reporting unit are not paid any employee benefits, it is advisable that the notes to the financial statements provide some notation under the sub-heading of 'related party disclosure' that key management compensation is not paid to any office holders. It would then be apparent that the 'employee expenses net of reimbursements', 'provision for long service leave' and 'provision for annual leave' all relate to employees who are non-office holders.

However, if the office holders are paid employee benefits, a separation of employee benefits to office holders and employee benefits to employees other than office holders must appear in the statement of financial performance, the statement of financial position for the provision for long service leave and annual leave. Additionally, a related party disclosure must appear in the notes to the financial statements.

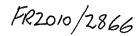

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2010

NOTE 1: ACCOUNTING METHODS

In accordance with generally accepted accounting principals for organisations, membership contributions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis. Otherwise, the accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Accounting Standards jointly issued by the Australian Professional Accounting Bodies. In particular -

- (a) The accounts have not been adjusted to record either changes in the general purchasing power of the dollar or in the prices of specific assets.
- (b) Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated on the reducing balance basis in order to write the assets off over their useful lives. Additions are depreciated from the date of purchase at the rates applicable to the asset.
- (c) Provisions for employee benefits in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave have been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.
- (d) No provision for income tax is necessary as "Trade Unions" are exempt from income tax under Section 23(f) of the Income Tax Assessment Act. Fringe Benefits Tax has been paid by the Union in accordance with the provisions of the Fringe Benefits Tax Assessment Act.

NOTE 2a: INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS

In accordance with Section 272 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisation) Act 2009 the attention of members is required to be drawn to subsections 272(1), (2) and (3) which read as follows

- (1) A member of a reporting unit, or a Registrar, may apply to the reporting unit for specified prescribed information in relation to the reporting unit to be made available to the person making the application.
- (2) The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the reporting unit.
- (3) A reporting unit must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

NOTE 2b:

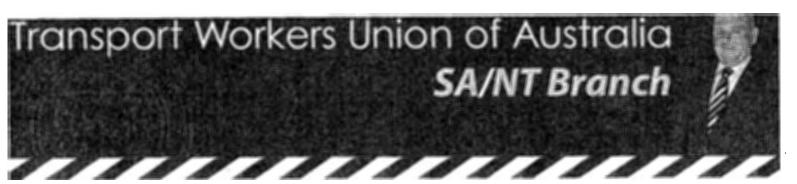

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE TRANSPORT WORKERS' UNION OF AUSTRALIA SOUTH AUSTRALIAN/NORTHERN TERRITORY BRANCH

SCOPE

We have audited the Accounts being the Committee of Management Statement of Financial Position for the Year Ended 31st December 2010 and the Statement of Financial Performance as at 31st December 2010 and notes to and forming part of the Accounts of The Transport Workers Union of Australia, South Australian/Northern Territory Branch, for the year ended 31st December 2010.

The Committee of Management are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the accounts and the information they contain.

We have conducted an independent audit of these accounts in order to express an opinion on them to the Members of the Branch.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the accounts are free from material misstatements. Our procedures included examination on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the Accounts, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects the accounts are presented fairly in accordance with Australian Accounting Concepts and Standards and statutory requirements so as to present a view of the Branch which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

In common with organisations of this type, it is not practical to establish adequate records or controls over cash receipts prior to their receipt and entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit of cash receipts was limited to the amount recorded in the accounting records of the Union.

In our opinion, as far as it appears from our testing and examination, monies recorded as receipts have been properly brought to account by the Union.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

- 1) There were kept by the Branch in respect of the year, satisfactory accounting records detailing the sources and nature of the income of the Branch (including Income from Members) and the nature and purposes of Expenditure.
- 2) The attached General Purpose Financial Report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of the Fair Work (registered Organisation) Act 2009.

Operating Report for the year 2010 ended 31 December 2010

Principle Activities

The principal activities of the Association during the reporting period were to provide industrial and organising services to the members consistent with the objects of the Association and particularly the object of protecting and improving the interest of the members.

The Associations' principal activities resulted in maintaining and improving the wages and conditions of employment of the membership, particularly for those members in collective enterprise agreements negotiated by the Association.

Manner of resignation

Members may resign from the Association in accordance with rule 11, which reads as follows;

- (2) A notice of resignation from Membership takes effect;
 - (a) if the Member has ceased to be Eligible:
 - (i) on the day on which the notice is received by the Union;
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;
 - (b) in any other case:
 - (i) at the end of 2 weeks after the notice is received by the Branch Secretary; or
 - (ii) on the day specified in the notice;

whichever is later.

- (3) Any Duties payable but not paid by a former Member, in relation to a period before the Member's resignation from the Union took effect, may be sued for and recovered in accordance with rule 81 as a debt due to the Union.
- (4) A notice delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1) is deemed to have been received by the Union when it was delivered.

- (5) A notice of resignation that has been received by the Union is not invalid only because it was not addressed and delivered in accordance with sub-rule (1).
- (6) A resignation from Membership is valid, even if it is not effected in accordance with this rule, if the Member is informed in writing by the Union that the resignation has been accepted.

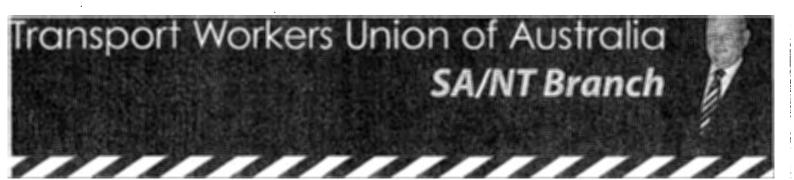
