Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of uncontested offices in matter E2019/112. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must, as soon as practicable after receiving the post-election report, publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission **within 35 days of any changes** to the holders of office in the organisation. **If there are no changes a notification is not required.** If the election has resulted in **any changes** to the holders of office, the Union of Christmas Island Workers must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
 - the name of the office vacated;
 - the date of the change of office holder; and
 - the name of the person vacating the office.
2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
 - the name of the office now held;
 - the date of the change of office holder;
 - the name of the person now holding the office;

- the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and
- the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

**PRESCRIBED INFORMATION PURSUANT TO s.189(1) OF THE FAIR WORK
(REGISTERED ORGANISATIONS) ACT 2009**

- 1 The names and numbers of the offices in respect to which an election is required are:

Committee Members (2)

- 2 The reasons for which the election is required are:

- (a) The biennial election conducted in 2018 resulted in two positions of Committee Member not being filled. The terms of office for those two positions were two years from the date of the attached Declaration of the Election by the Australian Electoral Commission dated 3 December 2018. The above offices will expire on 3 December 2020;

And

- (b) The registered rules of the organization, at Rule 17 – casual vacancies, require an election to be held in the case of a casual vacancy where the expired term of the office does not exceed one year of the term of the office.

- 3 The electorate for the election is:

The whole of the financial ordinary membership and financial unemployed membership of the Union.

- 4 The dates and times for the nominations to open and close are:

At a date to be set in accordance with sub-rule 16(i) and (j) following consultation between the Union and the Australian Electoral Commission's Returning Officer for the Union's election.

- 5 The voting system to be employed in the conduct of the election is:

A direct secret ballot voting system by **attendance ballot** in accordance with Rules of the Union of Christmas Island Workers at Rule 16A.

The organisation holds an exemption in accordance with the requirements of Section 144 (2) of the *Fair work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, which permits the holding of an attendance ballot. The exemption was reviewed in 2015, **R2015/87**, and concluded on 28 July 2015.

- 6 The date upon which the roll of voters for the election is to close shall be 7 days before the opening of nominations for the election.
