It is the case that our auditor, though diligent, is not located on Christmas Island. He visits three or four times a year. It is therefore not always possible to coordinate activities directed at reporting to the Registry on time. We will attempt to do better next year. I trust the documents and accompanying statements meet the requirements of the Act.

I advise that in accordance with the requirements of the Act and the RAO Schedule and RAO Regulations, the committee of management of the Union has resolved to supply members with copies of the financial accounts of the Union for the year ended 31 December 2003 and the year ended 31 December 2004.
