#### Reminder of actions required when persons elected to office

The Australian Electoral Commission has provided the Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) a declaration of results for the election of uncontested offices for NSW Branch [E2018/9]. This letter is a reminder of certain obligations imposed on organisations and on persons elected to office.

#### A notice must be published on the organisation's website

The organisation or branch must publish on its website a notice that a copy of the report is available from the organisation, branch or the AEC on request. The notice must be kept on the website for a period of at least 3 months (see regulation 141 of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009).

#### Holders of office required to undertake approved training

Section 293K of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the RO Act) requires each officer with financial management duties to undertake approved training that covers those duties within 6 months after the person begins to hold office. Please ensure that relevant officers undertake approved training within the required timeframe. Please also ensure that all new holders of office are advised of their obligations to make disclosures regarding remuneration, non-cash benefits and material personal interests, the details of which are provided for in the RO Act.

#### Organisation must notify the Commission of changes

Also, section 233(2) of the RO Act requires that an organisation must notify the Commission within 35 days of any changes to the holders of office in the organisation. If there are no changes a notification is not required. If the election has resulted in any changes to the holders of office, the United Firefighters' Union of Australia-New South Wales Branch must notify the Commission of these changes. In particular, please advise:

- 1. Person(s) who have ceased to hold office:
  - the name of the office vacated;
  - the date of the change of office holder; and
  - the name of the person vacating the office.
- 2. Person(s) who have commenced to hold office:
  - the name of the office now held:
  - the date of the change of office holder;
  - the name of the person now holding the office;
  - the postal address of the person (generally the postal address of the organisation); and

• the occupation of the person now holding the office.

The notification must include a declaration by the Secretary (or other prescribed officer) that the information is a correct statement of the changes made. A template notification of changes, which may assist you, is attached. If any change does not apply until a date in the future, you do not need to notify until then (e.g. AGM, 1 January, 2nd Monday in March). If you have already lodged this information, please disregard this reminder.

## **United Firefighters' Union of Australia** (E2018/9)

Arrangement for conduct of election.

[1] On 23 January 2018 the New South Wales Branch (**the Branch**) of the United Firefighters' Union of Australia lodged with the Registered Organisations Commission prescribed information for an election to fill the following offices:

Branch President (1)
Branch Vice President (1)
Branch Secretary (1)

- [2] The prescribed information should have been lodged by 13 January 2018 although the Branch did not lodge the prescribed information before the prescribed day as required by regulation 138(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009*. In the prescribed information dated 23 January 2018, the Branch Secretary, Mr Chris Read, indicated that the Branch had been unaware until the morning of 23 January 2018 that the National Secretary had not filed the relevant prescribed information on behalf of the Branch in circumstances in which it had been the practice of the National Secretary to do so in elections dating back to 1997.
- [3] Mr Read further advised that he had no reason to expect that the National Secretary would not be filing the relevant prescribed information in accordance with the regular historical practice although when he did become aware, he moved immediately to do so himself, acknowledged that the prescribed information should have been lodged at least nine days earlier and requested a later day for lodgement.
- [4] I have carefully considered the normal and reasonable expectation that registered organisations take steps to ensure they comply with the time-frame requirements set out not only in the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009* (the Act) but also in instruments or references pertaining to their own governance formulated by the organisations themselves.
- [5] In accordance with section 189(2) of the Act, I allow on this occasion a later day for lodgement.

[6] I am satisfied that an election for the abovenamed offices is required to be held under the rules of the organisation and, under subsection 189(3) of the *Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009*, I am making arrangements for the conduct of the election by the Australian Electoral Commission.

# PRESCRIBED INFORMATION FOR ELECTIONS in accordance with Section 189 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 and Regulation 138 Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009

I, Chris Read, being the Branch Secretary of the United Firefighters' Union of Australia, New South Wales Branch, make the following statement:

- 1. I am authorised to sign this statement containing prescribed information for the United Firefighters' Union of Australia, New South Wales Branch.
- 2. The following information is lodged under subsection 189(1) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 (the RO Act).
- 3. The elections that are required are set out in the table in Annexure A.
- 4. This statement **IS NOT** lodged at least 2 months before nominations open for the election below. The reason it is lodged after the prescribed time is:
  - a. The NSW Branch had no reason to expect that the National Secretary would not be filing the prescribed information on behalf of the NSW Branch this year.

I was the NSW Branch Secretary in the 1997, 2000, 2003, 2012 and 2015 tri-ennial election years and the National Secretary filed the prescribed information for all of the Union's Branches for each those elections with the exception of 2012, when late amendments to the NSW Branch rules required the Branch to do so. I was not the NSW Branch Secretary in 2006 or 2009, but understand that the National Secretary filed the prescribed information for all of the Union's Branches for both of those years also, albeit late on both occasions.

Having been unaware until this morning that the National Secretary had not filed this year's prescribed information on behalf of the NSW Branch, I have moved immediately to do so myself and therefore request that the Commissioner permit the prescribed information to be lodged today, nine days later than the prescribed day, under subsection 189(2) of the RO Act. I also undertake, should it remain my responsibility to do so in future election years, to file the prescribed information myself on behalf of the NSW Branch by or before the prescribed day.

b. Despite the delay in submitting the prescribed information, the NSW Branch does not seek an extension of time to the election timetable provided for within the Union's Rules. In 2012 the prescribed information was not submitted (through no fault of the NSW Branch) until late February and those elections were still conducted by the AEC in accordance with the timetable set out within the Rules.
