Re: United Firefighters' Union of Australia-New South Wales Branch - Financial Reporting Obligations under *Workplace Relations Act 1996*

This is a courtesy letter to remind you of the financial reporting obligations of the abovenamed body under the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* ('the Act') for the financial year ended 30 June 2003.

While the accounting, auditing and reporting obligations have changed with the introduction of the *Registration and Accountability of Organisations* Schedule (the RAO Schedule) which generally came into operation on 12 May 2003, Part IX, Division 11 of the Act continues to apply in relation to a financial year of an organisation that ends on 30 June 2003. The corresponding obligations set out in the RAO Schedule apply to each financial year of an organisation that starts on or after 1 July 2003.

Now that the financial year for 30 June 2003 has ended, it is timely that you put in train the various steps of the financial reporting requirements. To assist you with this process I have enclosed for your information a notice summarising these requirements including the time-scales prescribed by the legislation.

Please note that a branch of an organisation may be exempted from the obligations arising under Part IX, Division 11 in respect of a financial year by satisfying a Registrar that the branch did not have any financial affairs during the financial year. An application under subsection 271A(1) of the Act must be made within 90 days (unless extended by a Registrar) after the end of the financial year.

I note that to this date the financial documents for the years ended 30 June 2001 and 30 June 2002 have not been lodged in the Registry. Accordingly, you are requested to give immediate attention to the lodgement of the outstanding documents.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2003

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) and the Workplace Relations Act, 1996. The financial report has also been prepared on the basis of historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

No provision for Income Tax is necessary as the income of the Union is exempt from Income Tax under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of Sub-Sections [1], [2] and [3] of Section 274 which read as follows:-

- [1] A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- [2] An organisation shall, on application made under Sub-Section [1] by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed.
- [3] A Registrar may only make an application under Sub-Section [1] at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received of an application made at the request of the member.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the United Firefighters Union of Australia, New South Wales Branch.

SCOPE

We have audited the financial report of the United Firefighters Union of Australia, New South Wales Branch for the year ended 30 June 2003 as set out on pages 1 to 5. The Union's Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information it contains. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Union.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with Australian accounting standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia and statutory requirements so as to present a view of the Union which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

AUDIT OPINION

We have received all the information and explanations required for the purposes of our audit.

In our opinion:

- [i] There were kept by the Union in respect of the year under review, satisfactory records detailing the sources and nature of income of the Union [including income from members] and the nature and purposes of expenditure, and
- [ii] The attached financial report including the Certificates of the Committee of Management and the Accounting Officer is prepared in accordance with Section 273 of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996. The financial report has been prepared from the accounting records of the Union and is properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of:
 - [a] the financial position of the Union as at 30 June 2003; and
 - [b] the financial performance of the Union for the year ended on that date;

and is in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

Re: United Firefighters' Union of Australia - New South Wales Branch Financial documents for years ended 30 June 2001, 30 June 2002 & 30 June 2003 FR2004/206, FR2004/207 & FR2003/574

Receipt is acknowledged of the financial documents of the New South Wales Branch of the United Firefighters' Union of Australia for the years ended 30 June 2001, 30 June 2002 and 30 June 2003. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 13 January 2004.

On 2 March 2004 the Branch lodged a secretary's certificate in accordance with the requirements of paragraph 280(1)(b) of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*. The certificate relates to each of the abovementioned financial years.

The documents have been filed.

I direct your attention to the following matters concerning the financial reporting requirements of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* applicable to these documents. Please note that the reporting obligations for the year ended 30 June 2004 will be governed by the new RAO Schedule.

Balance Sheet

The financial documents for the year ended 30 June 2001 did not include a balance sheet as required under subsection 273(1) of the Act and subregulation 107(b) of the *Workplace Relations Regulations*. Such balance sheet is required to provide an account of the assets and <u>liabilities</u> of the Branch as at the end of the financial year. (emphasis added)

Timeline Provisions

It would appear that the financial documents, in respect of each financial year, were supplied to the members of the Branch <u>after</u> the Committee of Management meeting at which they were presented contrary to the timeline requirements of subsections 279(1) and (3) of the Act.

Late Lodgement

As advised in correspondence from the Registry dated 5 February 2002, unless an extension of time has been granted, financial documents are required to be lodged within 14 days of the meeting at which such documents are presented. [refer sections 279 and 280(1)]

New Legislation

The Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) legislation (the RAO legislation) generally came into operation on 12 May 2003.

Schedule 1B of the RAO legislation establishes a Registration and Accountability of Organisations Schedule (the RAO Schedule) within the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* (the WR Act). Many of the provisions relating to registered organisations currently in the WR Act are replicated in the new RAO Schedule, with some amendments. Other matters are substantially changed by the RAO Schedule, particularly the financial reporting requirements.

The abovenamed Branch has correctly completed and lodged its financial documents for the financial year ended 30 June 2003 under the WR Act. However, in relation to the financial year ending 30 June 2004, the requirements of the new RAO Schedule will apply.

You may wish to consider bringing the requirements of the new legislation to the attention of the Branch's auditor.
