INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

I have audited the financial statements of the United Firefighters Union of Australia (Queensland Branch) in respect of the year ended 30 June 2000 and have received all information and explanation I required for the purposes of my audit.

The organisation's committee of management is responible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain, I have conducted an independent audit of these financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the organisation.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus View) and statutory requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the organisation's financial position and the results of its operations and cash flows.

The audit opinin expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

1 Statement of Accounting Policy

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared for use by directors and members of the company. The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity.

The statements are prepared on a cash basis from the records of the company. They are based on historical cost and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Information to be provided to members or Registrar

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, as amended, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsections 274 (1), (2) and (3), which read as follows:

- A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation;
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time, as is prescribed;
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

Financial documents for United Firefighters' Union of Australia - Queensland Branch for year ended 31 December 2000 (259V-QLD:FR2001/100)

Receipt is acknowledged of financial documents lodged under section 280(1) of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 ("the Act") for the United Firefighters' Union of Australia - Queensland Branch ("the Branch") for the year ended 30 June 2000. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 5 March 2001.

The documents have been filed.

The following matters are advised for your assistance in relation to the preparation of future financial reporting documents; no further action is requested in respect of the material filed:

Presentation of documents to meeting of State Executive

Subsection 279(6) of the Act requires the Branch to present the relevant documents to either a general meeting of its members or to a meeting of its Committee of Management. The Secretary's certificate which accompanies the filed documents states that the material was presented to a meeting of the Branch's State Executive.

Under Rule 54(7) of the registered rules of the Union ("the Rules"), the powers and duties associated with adopting or otherwise dealing, as required by the Act, with the annual report, accounts and balance sheet of the Branch and the Branch auditor's report are vested in the Branch and shall be exercised at Branch meetings.

It is noted that whereas between Branch meetings, the Branch Committee of Management may exercise specified powers and perform specified duties given to the Branch under Rule 54, no reference is made to the duties and powers conferred by Rule 54(7) (Rule 57(1) refers).

Thus, in order to comply with its duties under the Rules, the Branch may have no power to place the accounts, statements and report before any meeting other than a Branch meeting. However, the financial reporting requirements of the Act may nonetheless be met, in so far as are relevantly prescribed by subsection 279(6), by placing the material before a Branch Committee of Management meeting.

Pursuant to Rule 2 of Schedule 3 to the Rules, the Branch shall have a Branch Executive, which shall attend to the affairs of the Union between meetings of the Branch Committee of Management. The powers vested in the Branch Executive do not appear capable of widening the powers of the Branch Committee of Management

otherwise provided under Rules, nor do they appear to confer powers beyond, or additional to, those otherwise conferred on the Branch Committee of Management. Hence, it does not appear that Branch is able to discharge its obligations either under the Act or the Rules by placing the financial accounts, statements and report before a meeting of the Branch Executive.

Having regard to the above, please ensure that in future years that the financial reports, statements and accounts are presented to either a general meeting of the membership of the Branch, or to a meeting of the Committee of Management.

Timing of steps at variance with legislation

Financial documents should be prepared, audited, supplied to members, presented to a meeting and lodged with the Registrar within certain timescale requirements - these requirements are summarised for your assistance in the attachment.

From the information available, the timing of these various steps would seem to be at variance with the requirements of the legislation.

In particular, it is noted that while the accounts, statements and report were presented to the abovementioned meeting on 19 December 2000, they were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 5 March 2001.

Unless an extension is granted, financial documents should be lodged in the Industrial Registry within 14 days of the meeting at which they were presented - refer subsection 280(1) of the Act.
