Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009 - (RO Act) Financial report for year ended 30 June 2010 - FR2010/2601

I acknowledge receipt of the financial report for the Queensland Branch of the United Firefighters' Union of Australia for the year ended 30 June 2010. The document was lodged with Fair Work Australia (FWA) on 4 November 2010. In addition to the full report, there was a concise report lodged with FWA. However, from my telephone conversation with you earlier today you confirmed that, as stated in the designated officer's certificate, the members were provided a copy of the full report (not a concise report) and the full report was presented to the s266 meeting of the committee of management.

Based on the lodged documents and the above confirmation provided by you, the financial report has been filed.

Although the report has been filed, there are a few matters to note when preparing financial reports in the future.

1. Committee of Management Statement

Item 26 of the Reporting Guidelines of the General Manager requires the committee of management statement to specify the date of passage of the resolutions. This is a separate requirement to the statement being signed and dated as at the date the designated officer signs the statement.

2. Operating Report – review of reporting unit's principal activities and significant changes in the reporting unit's financial affairs

Section 254(2)(a) of the RO Act requires the operating report to provide a <u>review of the principal activities</u> during the financial year, this requires a brief paragraph on the results of those activities and any significant changes in the nature of those activities. However, s254(2)(b) requires the operating report to provide details of any <u>significant changes in the financial affairs</u> during the year.

I note the lodged operating report contained the sub-heading "Significant Changes" however, it is not clear whether the information under this sub-heading is addressing the significant changes to the principal activities (s254(2)(a)) or significant changes in the financial affairs (s254(2)(b)). Please ensure both requirements are clearly provided for in future operating reports.

3. Profit & Loss Statement and Balance Sheet - Employees

The operating report disclosed that there were 4 full time and 3 part time employees for the year ended 30 June 2010. However, the statement of income and expenditure did not correspondingly disclose any wages/salaries of these employees nor did the balance sheet disclose any liabilities in the form of "employee benefits" to provide for the employee's long service leave, etc. I also note that the statement of cash flows provided an aggregate figure of \$61,825 as payments to suppliers and employees.

The Reporting Guidelines of the General Manager requires information regarding employee benefits to office holders and employee benefits to employees be provided as separate figures in the profit and loss statement <u>and</u> as a liability in the balance sheet. Please ensure that employee salaries, office holder's salaries (if any), employee benefits in terms of long service leave, etc. are all provided in future financial reports.

4. Concise Report

In future, if the reporting unit wants to provide a copy of the concise report to the members this can only be done if the committee of management passes a resolution that a concise report is to be provided. This is a requirement under s265(2) of the RO Act. The committee of management statement or the concise report must provide details of this resolution.

Additionally, if in the future a concise report is provided to members, regulation 161(1)(c) of the Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Regulations 2009 requires the concise report to include a "discussion and analysis of the principal factors affecting the financial performance, financial position and financial and investing activities of the reporting unit to assist the understanding of members".

However, if the reporting unit has no intention of providing a copy of the concise report to its members, it is not necessary to lodge the concise report with FWA.

5. Residential Address of Committee Members

Once the financial report has been filed the document is uploaded to the Fair Work Australia Registered Organisations website. This is accessible at http://www.e-airc.gov.au/259v/ It is advisable that residential addresses should not be provided and that the reporting unit's office address be substituted.

1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This general purpose financial report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations and The Fair Work (Registered Organisations) Act 2009.

The accounts are prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. Accounting policies have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

The association is exempt from income tax under section 50 - 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. The ongoing applicability of this ruling is at the discretion of the Australian Taxation Office.

(b) Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes deposits at call which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are used in the cash management function on a day to day basis, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(c) Goods and Services Tax

Business expenses and assets are recognized net of the amount of GST except where the amount of GST accrued is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office.
