I acknowledge receipt of the financial reports of the United Firefighters Union of Australia for the year ended 30 June 2007 and the signed Certificate of Secretary subsequently forwarded to our office. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 13 December 2007 and 25 June 2008 respectively.

Although the documents have been filed, I like to make some comments to assist you when your organisation prepares future financial reports. You *do not* need to take any further action in respect of the financial reports already lodged.

1. Operating Report

As a requirement of regulation 159(b) of the *Workplace Relations (Registration and Accountability of Organisations) Regulations 2003*, the operating report must specify the number of employees who, at the end of the financial year, were employees of the reporting unit including both full-time and part-time employees measured on a full-time equivalent basis.

The operating report lodged did not address this requirement. Please ensure the number of employees employed at the end of the financial year by your organisation is specified in future operating reports.

Similar to the certificate of secretary lodged on 13 December 2007, the operating report was also unsigned but dated. As a matter of course all documents should be signed *and* dated with the date of execution.

2. Committee of Management Statement

Item 26(b) of the *Reporting Guidelines* requires the committee of management statement to specify the date of passage of the resolution. A gap had been left in the precursory paragraph to the statement but had been left blank. Please ensure the resolution date is provided in future committee of management statements.

3. Certificate of Secretary

The reference to Schedule 1B of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996* appearing in the secretary's certificate should properly be referred to as Schedule 1 or the RAO Schedule of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS
