#### Note 1 - Accounting Policies

In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for such organisations, membership contributions are accounted for on a cash receipts basis. Unless otherwise stated, the accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and do not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounts have been drawn up in accordance with the Accounting Standards jointly issued by the Australian Accounting Bodies and as required by law.

#### (a) Depreciation

Fixed assets are depreciated over the period of their expected effective lives.

#### (b) Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the Umon's liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount.

Contributions are made by the Union to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

#### (c) Comparatives

The comparative figures in the accounts are for the twelve months ended 30 June 2003.

#### (d) Income Tax

No provision for income tax is necessary as Trade Unions are exempt bodies under Section 50-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (e) Stock on Hand

Stock on hand is measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

The Financial Statements of the United Firefighters' Union of Australia – Victorian Branch have been audited in accordance with the provisions of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (the Act) and the attached concise report is provided for members in accordance with Section 265 (1) of Schedule 1B of the Act.

The issue of the concise financial report is in accordance with a resolution of the Committee of Management.

The Accounting Officer and Committee of Management have signed the certificates required under the Workplace Relations Act 1996.

The Financial Statements prepared in accordance with Section 253 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996, will be presented at the next Branch Meeting of Members.

A copy of the full report and auditor's report are available free of charge to any member who so requests. The concise financial report has been derived from the full report and cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financial and investing activities of the Union as the full report.

In accordance with the requirement of the Act, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of subsection (1), (2) and (3) of Section 272 which read as follows:

- 1. A member of the Union, or a Registrar, may apply to the Union for specified prescribed information in relation to the Union to be made available to the person making the application
- 2. The application must be in writing and must specify the period within which, and the manner in which, the information is to be made available. The period must not be less than 14 days after the application is given to the Union.
- 3. The Union must comply with an application made under subsection (1).

Finally, we draw your attention to the Financial Statement, in particular, the surplus. Essentially, the operating surplus for the year reflects the impact of higher membership fees and lower dispute costs incurred during the year. The operating surplus was largely absorbed to reduce the outstanding creditors at 30 June 2004, which primarily relate to legal expenses and campaign costs.

We also bring to your attention the requirement to undertake a revaluation of the building as stipulated by the Act and changes to the new reporting requirements. For the year ended 30 June 2004 annual accounts were prepared as General Purpose Financial Reports which required additional disclosure, hence, a requirement to revalue land & buildings at market value.

- (ii) a record has been kept of all moneys paid by or collected from members of the organisation and all moneys so paid or collected have been credited to the bank account to which those moneys are to be credited, in accordance with the rules of the organisation;
- (iii) before any expenditure was incurred, approval of the incurring of the expenditure was obtained in accordance with the rules of the organisation;
- (iv) with regard to funds of the organisation raised by compulsory levies or voluntary contributions from members, or funds other than the General Fund operated in accordance with the rules of the organisation, no payments were made out of any such fund for purposes other than those for which the fund was operated;
- (v) no loans or other financial benefits, other than remuneration in respect of their full-time employment with the organisation, were made to persons holding office in the organisation;
- (vi) the register of members of the organisation was maintained in accordance with the Workplace Relations Act 1996;

Receipt is acknowledged of the full financial report and the concise financial report of the Victorian Branch of the United Firefighters' Union of Australia for the year ended 30 June 2004. The documents were lodged in the Industrial Registry on 28 February 2005.

The documents have been filed.

I direct your attention to the following comments concerning the reports and the financial reporting obligations under the RAO Schedule. Please note that these matters are advised for assistance in the future preparation of financial reports; no further action is required in respect of the subject documents.

#### **Full Report**

#### Auditor's report

The opinion of the auditor made under the auditor's report is expressed in terms previously required under subsection 276(4) of the *Workplace Relations Act 1996*. The RAO Schedule, under subsection 257(5), now sets out the matters upon which an auditor is required to make an opinion. The following wording would satisfy the requirements of the Schedule:

"In our opinion the general purpose financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the requirements imposed by Part 3 of Chapter 8 of Schedule 1B of the Workplace Relations Act 1996."

You may wish to forward a copy of this letter to the reporting unit's auditor.

#### **Operating report**

The following defects or deficiencies are contained in this report:

#### Significant changes in financial affairs

The operating report must give details of any significant changes in the reporting unit's financial affairs during the financial year to which it relates in accordance with the requirement of paragraph 254(2)(b) of the RAO Schedule.

#### Trustees of superannuation entities

Under subsection 254(2)(d) of the Schedule the report must give details (including details of the position held) in relation to any officer or member of the reporting unit who is a trustee, or a director of a company that is a trustee, of a superannuation entity or an exempt public sector superannuation scheme.

Could you please ensure, on future occasions, that these required details are included in the operating report.

#### Accounting officer's certificate

The second page of the operating report contains the information previously required, under subsection 273(2) of the Act, to be included in the accounting officer's certificate. Please note that there is no requirement under the RAO Schedule to lodge such a certificate. Furthermore, the information provided is not required for inclusion in the operating report.

#### Committee of management statement

The committee of management statement is required to specify the date of passage of its resolution in relation to the matters requiring declaration in the statement. I refer you to item 18(b) of the Industrial Registrar's reporting guidelines.

#### Notes to the financial statements

#### Information to be provided to members or Registrar

Note 5 of the notes to the financial reports correctly draws the attention of members of the reporting unit to subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 of the RAO Schedule. However, the notice incorrectly cites the provisions previously contained under section 274 of the Act.

#### Reporting timelines

#### Full report to be presented to meetings

According to the information contained in the secretary's certificate the full report of the reporting unit was presented to a general meeting of members held on 24 February 2005. Under subsection 266(3), however, that report should have been presented within the period of 6 months starting at the end of the financial year; i.e. the last day for conducting such a meeting was 31 December 2004.

In future, unless an extension of time has been granted under subsection 265(5), compliance with this timeline requirement should be observed.

#### **Concise Report**

#### **Operating report**

My comments concerning the operating report lodged under the full financial report are applicable to the operating report lodged under the concise report.

#### Auditor's report

In order to fully comply with the requirements of subsection 265(3)(c) of the RAO Schedule, the words "have been prepared in accordance with" appearing in the auditor's statement should be replaced with the words "comply with".

#### Section 272 notice

I note that the wording of this notice correctly cites the provisions of subsections (1), (2) and (3) of section 272 of the RAO Schedule.
