The documents have been filed. However I take this opportunity to draw your attention to the following so that it might be corrected for future returns:

- Paragraph (4) of the Committee of Management Certificate contained an incorrect reference, namely in stating that the Union had complied with the Act in relation to the financial accounts in respect of the year *just ended* "30 June 2001" instead of the *preceding* year (30 June 2000). #### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Statements of Accounting Concepts, applicable Accounting Standards and the applicable disclosure requirements of the Industrial Relations Act.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### (b) Accounting Periods

The financial statements have been prepared for the period between 1 July 2000 and 30 June 2001.

#### (c) Accrual Accounting

With the exception of membership contributions the accounts are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

#### (d) Depreciation

Fixed assets are depreciated on a straight line basis so as to write off their cost over the period of their expected useful lives.

#### (e) Membership Contributions

Membership contributions are recognised in the year they are received.

#### (f) Employee Benefits

Liability for long service leave is provided for after one year of service in accordance with Federal Council policy. Accrued annual leave has been provided for the estimated entitlement of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

#### (g) Income tax

No liability exists for income tax.

Notes to and forming part of the accounts for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2001

#### (h) Property and Assets

The rules of the Union provide that all property and assets are held in the name of the Union. This particularly applies to property acquired from Branch funds but which is registered in the name of the Union. Branch funds themselves form part of the property of the Union and all liabilities ultimately are the responsibility of the Union.

#### (i) Sustentation Fee

In the current financial year we have included the Sustentation Fees owing for the past three years:

1999	\$46,072.04
2000	\$85,172.05
2001	\$78,714.41

The 2000 Sustentation Fee was not included in the 2000 audit report. The Sustentation Fees represent amounts owing by the Darwin branch to the National Office. If the Darwin branch has insufficient funds to pay the fee then the amounts are carried forward. National Office is aware of this practise.
