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INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

Scope

We have audited the financial statements of the Australian Liquor, Hospitality & Miscellaneous Workers' Union, WA Branch, for the year ended 30 June 2001 as set out on pages 7 to 19. The Committee of Management and Accounting Officer are responsible for the financial statements. We have conducted an independent audit of those financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the Union.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting selected amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements, so as to present a view of the Australian Liquor, Hospitality & Miscellaneous Workers' Union, WA Branch, which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position and the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

As with similar organisations, due to the nature of certain income such as membership contributions, donations, subsides and similar, we are only able to audit that income when it is first recorded in the books and records of the Union.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the matter referred to in the preceding paragraph:

- (a) proper accounting records have been kept by the Union so far as appears from our examination of these books, including:
 - (i) records of the sources of the receipts of the Union, (including income from members); and
 - (ii) records of the nature and purposes of the payments of the Union;
- (b) the financial statements including the Committee of Management Certificate and Accounting Officers Certificate required to be prepared under Section 273 of the Workplace Relations Act 1996 have been properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of:
 - (i) the financial affairs of the Union as at 30 June 2001; and
 - (ii) the income and expenditure and any surplus or deficit of the Union for the year then ended.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 June 2001

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus View and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Workplace Relations Act, 1996. The accounts have been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Union in the preparation of the accounts.

a) Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated on the straight-line basis in order to write the assets off over their useful life. The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are:

Class of Asset	Depreciation Rate
Buildings	2%
Chattels, furniture, fittings and office equipment	15 to 20%
Motor Vehicles	22.5%

b) Provision for employee benefits in the form of Long Service Leave and Accrued Annual Leave has been made for the estimated accrued entitlements of all employees on the basis of their terms of employment.

In the case of Long Service Leave, the accrual has been measured by reference to periods of service and current salary rates as it is considered that this results in an amount not materially different to that achieved by discounting estimated future cash flows.

- c) Contribution revenue is brought to account when received.
- d) The rules of the Union provide that all property and assets are held in the name of the Union. This particularly applies to property acquired from Branch funds but which is registered in the name of the Union. Branch funds themselves form part of the property of the Union.

The Union policy is for assets and property acquired from Branch funds to be accounted for in the financial statements of the Branch from whose fund the assets were acquired.

Similarly, all income received by a Branch (whether in the form of entrance fees, contributions, fines, fees, levies, dues or penalties or by way of investments and the like) is accounted for in the financial statements of that Branch even though such income is the property of the Union.

e) No provision for Income Tax is necessary, as Industrial Trade Unions are exempt from Income Tax under Section 50 – 15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

- f) Costs relating to the modification of computer software for year 2001 compatibility are charged as expense as incurred.
- g) Costs incurred to update existing systems to deal with the GST are charged as expenses as incurred, except where they result in an enhancement of future economic benefits and are recognised as an asset.

2. INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED TO THE MEMBERS OR REGISTRAR

In accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Relations Act, 1996, the attention of members is drawn to the provisions of sections 274 (4) of the Act which requires the following sections to be set out in the Financial Accounts:

- (1) A member of an organisation, or a Registrar, may apply to the organisation for specified prescribed information in relation to the organisation.
- (2) An organisation shall, on application made under subsection (1) by a member of the organisation or a Registrar, make the specified information available to the member or Registrar in such manner, and within such time as is prescribed.
- (3) A Registrar may only make an application under subsection (1) at the request of a member of the organisation concerned, and the Registrar shall provide to a member information received because of an application made at the request of the member.

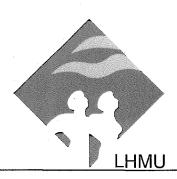
