The Registered Organisations Commission (the ROC) seeks to foster a culture of voluntary compliance in registered organisations. Part of how we aim to achieve this is by providing accurate, relevant and easily accessible education services and tools for organisations and their members.

What you need to know

As part of our commitment to assisting registered organisations, the ROC has set out in this document its 2018/2019 Education Strategy. This is a planning tool.

The ROC has consulted with organisations and peak bodies about the education services they seek from us. In response we have developed the Strategy which is comprised of a series of scheduled campaigns, information sessions, newsletters, guidance notes, fact sheets and other educational materials and resources.

How to use this document

The ROC Education Strategy is designed to enable you, or your organisation, to plan and schedule for the education services you need or would like to utilise. It sets out the ROC's planned education projects for July 2018 to June 2019. It includes a timeline for new and updated education materials, face-to-face information sessions, quarterly newsletters, new webinars, education refresher campaigns and other educational materials and resources.
